REPORT OF THE SCHOOL BOARD

The schools of your town have been maintained at the high standard established during the past few years.

A survey of the different schools throughout town will, we believe, convince you that our pupils are instructed by competent teachers, and exceedingly well housed in buildings which comply with the State law.

A change in the teaching force has been made in three schools, i.e., the Fisk, Old Institution, and Hannaford. Your board has continued the policy of securing Normal School graduates for teachers. This of necessity has called for a slight increase in teachers' salaries at these schools.

Because of the change in the State law relative to the payment by towns of high school tuition, the cost to our town for the tuition of our high school students will show about 30% increase.

We wish to call your attention to the high standard of attendance of our pupils, as is shown by the statistical report of our Superintendent.

As instructed by the last school meeting we have sold the schoolhouse in the Dalton District at public auction for \$284.00.

The repairs during the past year have included the remodelling of the schoolhouse in the Winona District, shingling the Fisk, and painting the schoolhouses in Plaisted and Hannaford Districts. We also paid one half the cost of repairs in the Union District.

We recommend new seats at the Old Institution, painting at Winona, minor repairs to toilets at Fisk,

shingling at least another schoolhouse, also the installation of another jacketed stove.

As required by law we make the following estimate of the amounts necessary for the support of schools for the year beginning July 1, 1926:

The percentage for the whole state is 94 and four of the schools are well above that and only one below. The Village school has a remarkably fine record, 98.3.

The tardiness column shows even more clearly the generally improved attitude toward regular school attendance. The Village school had but 33 cases of tardiness in 1924-'25 while the year before there were almost 100 more. The Plaisted School made the astonishing drop from 146 cases to 24. This shows what good teachers with the co-operation of parents and pupils can accomplish.

During 1923-24 only three schools, Fiske, Village and Hannaford, had any perfect attendance. Last year all were represented.
