#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Piermont, in the County of Grafton, in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Piermont on Tuesday, the 12th day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To raise and appropriate money to maintain Highways and Bridges.
- 4. To raise and appropriate money to maintain street lights.
- 5. To raise and appropriate money for snow removal.
  - 6. To raise and appropriate money for poor relief.
- 7. To raise and appropriate money for support of Library.
- 8. To raise and appropriate money for Memorial Day.
- 9. To raise and appropriate money for new library or take any action.
- 10. To raise and appropriate money for town maintenance of highways with State Aid or State Aid new construction on Lake Tarleton road.
- 11. To raise and appropriate money to print a historical book.

- 12. To raise and appropriate money for a garage for fire truck.
- 13. To raise and appropriate money to retire note for fire truck.
- 14. To raise and approprite money for Pine Blister Rust Control with State Aid.
- 15. To see whether beer or other lawful alcoholic beverages shall be manufactured or sold locally as permitted under Local Option Act.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks at the time they examine the taxable property.
- 17. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds.
- 18. To see of the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of the Municipal Budget Act.
- 19. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 20. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

#### ANNUAL PIERMONT PUBLIC LIBRARY REPORT

If it had not been for our disastrous fire of September 6th, 1934, which completely destroyed our library building and contents, we would feel that our year had been very successful.

The number of patrons, both adults and children, had increased and we had added many new books to our collection. No definite numbers can be given, as those records were burned.

Since the fire we have had given us approximately fifteen hundred volumes. These have come from individual friends, school children, and public libraries in various places. Special mention should be made of Mrs Dana Richardson of Hanover, who collected about five hundred books and magazines and brought them to us.

Our library was closed the Saturday following the fire, but has been opened regularly since that time. Our records show that 1320 books have been in circulation since the fire; 1046 of these were adult and 274 junior books, and the number of magazines charged is 228.

The library trustees have recently purchased two large book cases and a magazine rack, which are a great help in our small temporary quarters.

# REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Piermont:

I herewith present my fourth annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

For the year 1933-1934 the total enrollment was 77; the percent of attendance, 92.60; cases of tardiness, 46; pupils whose tuition was paid by the district elsewhere in elementary schools, 2; in high schools, 33; school visits made by Board members, 12; by the Superintendent, 88; by citizens, 187.

In June nine pupils were promoted from the eighth grade to the high school: Ralph Drewe, Helen Gould, Richard Hackett, Mildred Hill, Keith Robie, Alfred Stevens, Eugene Burt, Ileene Kibler, Winifred Knapp.

This present year, 1934-1935, the enrollment so far has been 83. The teachers and number of pupils registered are as follows: Vera Bradbury, Grammar, 22; Hazel A. Sanborn, Primary, 29; Ruth Johnson, Brook Rd., 25; Martha E. True, Rodimon, 8.

Thirteen pupils are enrolled in Haverhill Academy, 5 in Orford High School, and 21 in Bradford Academy, making a total of 39. There are also two tuition pupils attending the elementary school at Atwell Hill.

The work in the schools is being capably handled by well trained teachers, the transportation is satisfactory, and the buildings for the most part are in comfortable shape. The screens in the village school are a great improvement. In the Brook Road school the floor needs leveling, and the walls and ceiling painting. These and other minor repairs can be taken care of under the regular appropriation and State Aid funds.

It is a pleasure to call attention to the extra health work made possible by a federal agent. I refer to the dental and tonsil clinics. Twenty-seven cases were treated at the former, and five at the latter. There were also two children fitted to glasses.

The small number of pupils at the Rodimon school raises the question of the desirability of opening it another year. As long as the State furnishes aid, it is doubtful whether the closing of this building would causes any appreciable effect in the local school tax. The convenience and best interests of the children should, as before, be the guides in considering this matter.
