Carroll SS.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Sandwich, in said County and State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town, on Tuesday, the ninth day of March, next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following articles:

- 1. To see if the Town will determine by vote the salary to be paid any of its officers and agents.
- 2. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to act as its agents in all matters relating to town property for the purpose of granting easements, making sale and conveyance of any property or properties which may be acquired by the Town by tax deed.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen, in their discretion, to purchase for the Town such land or lands as they shall deem necessary or useful for town and public purposes.
- 5. To raise and appropriate \$133.92 to pay the interest on the School Fund Note.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate money for the support of the Library in addition to the amount required by law. The sum recommended to be raised as a whole is \$697.25.
- 7. To raise and appropriate \$1000.00 to pay the fifth and last installment on the Town note to Sandwich Town and Grange Fair.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate money for the observance of Old Home Week. The amount recommended is \$150.00.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate money for the observance of Memorial Day. The sum recommended is \$175.00.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$126.00 to The Lakes Region Association

of New Hampshire to assist in planning and development of the town and for the issuance and distribution of printed matter and newspaper and magazine advertising calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the Town, in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region.

- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate money for the maintenance of the Notch and Dale Roads. The sum recommended is \$500.00.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to accept Town Road Aid and vote to raise and appropriate for that purpose the sum of \$843.10, the state contributing \$3372.40, or such lesser amount as shall be determined by the General Court.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the continuing of the control of the white pine blister rust.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the support of the Fire Department and for fighting forest fires. The sum recommended is \$200.00 for the Fire Department and \$800.00 for all other purposes relating to fires.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the support of the Laconia Hospital and the Huggins Memorial Hospital. The sums are \$150.00 and \$50.00, respectively.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate money for the care of cemeteries. The sum recommended is \$300.00.
- 17. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of highways and bridges and for winter care for the year ensuing and pass any vote relating thereto. The sum recommended is \$13,000.00.
- 17-A. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purchase of a tractor and plow for snow removal and take any vote relating thereto.
- 18. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of paying Town Charges for the ensuing year. The sum recommended is \$3,000.00.
 - 19. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to

raise and appropriate for the purpose of paying the expenses of General Government. The sum recommended is \$2.500.00.

- 20. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of providing additional police protection, for watchmen and facilities for their use, due to the war emergency, and, in particular for the maintenance of the observation posts. The sum recommended is \$200.00.
- 21. To hear the reports of Town Officers or Committees and take any appropriate action thereon.
- 22. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.
- 23. To see if the Town will vote to collaborate with the State and/or Federal Governments in rebuilding the Notch and Dale Roads in accordance with pending legislation and authorize the Selectmen to levy a tax to carry out said building program to such extent as shall appear to them to be advantageous for the Town, provided the amount of the needed appropriation has not been determined at time of the Annual Meeting.
- 24. To choose by ballot all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Cemetery Department

The second year's cemetery improvement efforts have been marked by considerable progress, and some disappointments. The latter mainly due to difficulties in getting work done.

The East Sandwich Meetinghouse and Cemetery Association (Vittum Hill) may justly be proud of the appearance of this cemetery since the completion of resurfacing

and other improvements.

At Little's Pond Cemetery authorization to complete work already begun was delayed owing to Mrs. Moorhouse's death. Early snow prevented carrying out this project, but the money is in hand for it, and plans made for work in the spring.

On three Maple Ridge Cemeteries, brush-cutting, resetting of stones, mending of fances and walls has been

done.

Maintenance and improvement work has been done on the Chick's Corner, George, Grove, Mcars, Quaker (Center

Sandwich), Hubbard and Thompson Cemeteries.

The Rural and North Sandwich cemeteries have been maintained in a commendable condition by the Associations organized to care for them and it is hoped that an organization may be formed for the Grove Cemetery this year.

Funds from interest accruals on the Charles H. White Trust being available for work on the Elm Hill Cemetery, nearly half of this burying ground has been resurfaced and seeded, and only early snow prevented the completion of

this work. We expect to finish it in the spring.

Labor shortage prevented clearing several wooded plots in East Sandwich and elsewhere. During 1943 we are hopeful of accomplishments beyond those aforementioned, but present uncertainties make future predictions unwise.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

SCHOOLS IN WAR TIME

More and more, the impact of wartime conditions is making itself felt in the lives of our children. Although we may work earnestly to provide the normal conditions of work, play, and growth to which childhood is entitled,

it is increasingly difficult to do so.

Your teachers and superintendent are called on to devote many hours to duties quite apart from the job you are paying them to do. The rationing of food and fuel oil, and the sale of war stamps and bonds, represent only a part of our duty to Uncle Sam and the boys in the service. In order to save gasoline and tires, it has been necessary to check over with care all the school bus routes, as a part of a national survey. These routes have been combined in some cases, and frequently children are required to walk part way between home and school. Lack of transportation has also obliged us to curtail teachers' meetings for the duration.

Some benefits to children, however, may develop out of the war emergency. An increased emphasis on health and physical education is one of the important advantages. Many teachers have availed themselves of the First Aid courses conducted by the Red Cross. Much attention is being given to the matter of nutrition of growing children, and school lunches are provided in many schools throughout the country. Special efforts are being made to interest children in gardening under the "Food for Freedom" campaign. Such things as these ought not to have to wait until a war comes; and it may prove worth while to continue them after the conflict is over.

Practical aspects of education, especially as related to war service, are emphasized, particularly in the high school. The progress of aviation demands more emphasis on mathematics, mechanical skills, study of weather conditions, and principles of flight. A new slant on geography has been developed; the distance between two cities may now be measured as a straight line, even though a a range of mountains may lie between them.

School costs shot upward rapidly during the course of the first World War in 1917 and 1918. The teacher shortage is definitely more serious now than it was then, and the high wages now paid for various types of war work are influencing the trend of teachers' salaries today. No one can foretell with accuracy what the prevailing rate of

increase may be for next year, but it takes no prophetic insight to forecast some increase in the salary schedules of teachers in general throughout the State.

SCHOOL NURSE'S REPORT

A report of the Health Work done in the Sandwich schools the past year.

School visits, 131; pupils inspected, 130.

All of the pupils at Quimby, Village and the rural schools have been weighed and measured several times. Vision tests were taken. Inspection of individual children when necessary.

Dr. Robert Quinby did a complete physical examination on 131 pupils. Results of examinations: Defective vision, 18 (16 wearing glasses); defective teeth, 44; en-

larged tonsils, 28.

A successful dental clinic was held last spring. Dr. Pottle and Dr. Denault of Meredith did the work at special rate. A summary of the clinic shows that 34 pupils were treated, with a total of 140 operations. A similar clinic is being planned for this spring.

Three children have had their eyes tested and obtained

glasses.

Three children had tonsillectomies.

One child was accompanied to the Balch Hospital.

I wish to express my appreciation for the cooperation of the Superintendent, members of the School Board, teachers, parents and officers of the Red Cross Association.
