THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE TOWN OF SEABROOK TOWN WARRANT FOR 1964

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Seabrook in the County of Rockingham, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in the Lower Hall of the Seabrook Firemen's Association Building, Route 86, on Tuesday, March 10, 1964, at ten o'clock in the forenoon and to cast ballots from that hour until at least six o'clock in the evening of the same day and to act on the following Articles:

Article 1. To elect by non-partisan ballot: a Town Clerk; one Selectman, Assessor and Trustee of the Trust Funds for a Term of Three (3) years; a Town Treasurer; a Collector of taxes; Three (3) Constables; a Chief of Police; a Chief of the Fire Department; One member of the Budget Committee for a term of Three (3) years; One member of the Park Commission for a term of Three (3) years; a Road Agent; and any other officers for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To choose Delegates-at-Large, Alternate Delegates-at-Large, Delegates and Alternate Delegates to the National Convention of various political parties to be held to nominate party candidates for President and Vice President of the United States. (To be voted by separate ballot).

Article 3. To choose Delegates to the Constitutional Convention. (To be voted by separate ballot).

Article 4. To vote on the question "Shall sweepstakes tickets be sold in this town?". (To be voted on separate ballot). Article 5. To vote on the question "Shall the Town of Seabrook continue to maintain its existing Municipal Court so long as its present Judge remains in office?". (To be voted by separate ballot).

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to amend the Zoning Ordinance by striking out the definitions of a trailer coach and a trailer house in Section V and on page 15 of the Seabrook Zoning Ordinance and to substitute therefor the following definitions:

> Trailer, house trailer type, (one trade name is "mobile home"): - a fabricated structure having bearing members for mounting wheels used in delivering it and especially designed; (1) to provide for hauling it on highways, and (2) for use as permanent living quarters and having sanitary facilities equipped for connecting with septic tank and sewage disposal installations. For the purposes of this Ordinance a house trailer shall be considered as a dwelling or a residence and subject to all of the provisions of this Ordinance which govern other architectural styles of dwellings.

> Trailer, travel trailer type: - a fabricated structure mounted on wheels and especially designed; (1) for hauling it on highways with a motor vehicle, and (2) to provide temporary living quarters during travel, camping, recreational, or vacation trips.

> Trailer, utility type as used temporarily for office, shop, laboratory, or tool and materials storage: a portable structure designed for temporary use at the site of a construction project, field survey work, or similar project and removed from the site of its use at the termination of the work.

And to insert in the glossary the following additional definitions:

House, boarding rooming: - a building in which bedrooms are rented to semi-permanent guests whose meals, when consumed on the premises, are prepared only by the proprietor or his employees. House, single-family: - a dwelling designed for occupancy by one or more persons living as a single, housekeeping unit which has the exclusive use of the rooms, furniture, and facilities within the house. The foregoing definition shall not apply if an additional housekeeping unit should occupy the same quarters, either in total or in part, in return for a rental fee or a service charge for the use, either jointly or separately, of any of the rooms, furniture, or facilities of the same house. House, two-family: - a single dwelling under one roof designed for occupancy by two separate housekeeping units, each of which has exclusive use of the rooms, furniture, and facilities required by and available to a single housekeeping unit. (Recommended by the Planning Board). (To be voted by

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to amend the Zoning Ordinance by striking out the contents of item b of paragraph 1 in Section II and substituting therefor a clearer statement of the same to read as follows:-

b. Exceptions. A Building Permit shall not be required for undertaking the following kinds of work on an existing building;

1. Work on any part of a building involving; (a) repairs, (b) redecorating, or (c) replacement of any defective part,

2. Minor additions to a building not involving an increase in its floor area when the cost of all materials required for such construction is less than (\$300), and

3. Emergency repairs, when emergency and temporary repairs are needed to retain the value and usefulness of property damages by storm, wave action, fire, or other disastrous forces. Likewise, the permanent repairs of or the restoration of buildings so damaged shall conform to the original plans and dimensions unless a Building Permit shall have been obtained which verifies sanction of any departures therefrom.

(Recommended by the Planning Board) (To be voted by separate ballot)

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to amend the Zoning Ordinance by striking out the contents of items 2 and 3 of paragraph C in Section III on page 11 and substituting therefor the following:

2. The **Building Permit**, which shall be issued by the Building Inspector only when the plans and specifications set forth in the Application for such a Permit have been found by him to comply in all respects with the provisions of this Ordinance. This Buildng Permit must be retained and preferably posted or displayed at the site of the work operations for which it was issued.

3. **Inspection** service and the inspection deposit. Two sheets of the blank form, "Application for a Building Permit", shall be issued to prospective builders by the administrative office of the Board of Selectmen upon deposit at that Office of the minimum fees to cover the costs of inspection. The minimum rates for this service shall be established and collected as follows: (1) for new construction or trailer replacement - \$9.00, (2) for additions to existing buildings - \$6.00, and (3) for each inspection in addition to the minimum number required -\$3.00. The minimum inspection service required by this Ordinance are set forth in the following schedule:

a. New construction or the emplacement of a house trailer.

No. 1. Initial site inspection; to determine lot size, the distance of setback and side clearances, the proposed locations of septic tank and sewage disposal facilities, and the spaces planned for driveways and parking areas. Therefore it shall be a responsibility of the proprietor to use substantial stakes in marking out the proposed locations of the foundation lines and the outside corners of a building or of a house trailer as well as the proposed locations for the septic tank and sewage disposal facilities. These stakes must be set before the start of any building construction and before the delivery of any house trailer.

No. 2. Progress inspection: to be conducted immediately following the emplacement of a house trailer or, in the case of building construction, at an appropriate time between foundation construction and before "closing-in" of the interior walls.

No. 3. Final inspection: to be completed after the installation of septic tank and sewage disposal facilities and when the building or house trailer is ready for occupancy. This is to be a final inspection in determining the extent of compliance with the plans as set forth in the "Application for a Building Permit".

b. Construction on existing buildings. Any work project involving an increase in the total floor area of an existing building and any other exterior alterations requiring an expenditure for the materials of construction in excess of three hundred dollars shall require application for a Building Permit and the minimum inspection service shall include initial and final inspections. c. Additional Inspections. When changes are made from the approved plans or deviations from compliance with the provisions of this Ordinance occur, and when, as a means of preventing violations, additional inspections are necessary, then they shall be made and at a rate of \$3.00 per visit to the trailer or construction site. In the event of failure to make payment at the Office of the Board of Selectmen for the additional inspections the Building Permit shall be withdrawn pending such payment within the succeeding fourteen days.

4. The duties and public relations of the Building Inspector.

a. The Building Inspector shall be an agent of the Board of Selectmen and his headquarters shall be at their Office.

b. The duties of the Building Inspector shall include the following:

> (1) To assist the prospective builder to conform with the provisions of this Ordinance,

> (2) To determine at the site of work operations whether these follow the plans and specifications as proposed in the Application for a Building Permit and the extent of compliance with the National Electrical Code as published by the National Board of Underwriters.

> (3) To maintain a complete and accurate record of the work performed by the Building Inspector, keeping such records as are required for this purpose in files at the Office of the Board of Selectmen, and

> (4) To assist the Board of Selectmen in the enforcement of this Ordinance.

c. It shall also be an assigned duty of other Municipal Officers including members of the Police and other Town Departments who regularly travel the Town roads to assist the Building Inspector by notifying him forthwith of the occurrence of violations of this Ordinance or the appearance of violations.

And with the adoption of this amendment the numbering of items now designated 4, 5, and 6 of paragraph C shall be advanced to numbers 5, 6, and 7 respectively.

(Recommended by the Planning Board). (To be voted by separate ballot).

Article 9. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the expense of the General Government, for the Protection of Persons and Property, for Health and Sanitation, for Highways and Bridges, for Support for the Town Poor and all other necessary expenditures for the ensuing year.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to allow the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes and to renew and refund town notes.

Article 11. To see what action the Town will take regarding the balances of the following Special Appropriations: - Cross Beach Road Layout - \$1,000.00; Veterans' Memorial Park Special - \$400.00; New Lands Special-\$3,000.00; Resident Physician Special - \$1,500.00 and Water Main Extension Special - \$4,382.86.

Article 12. To see if the Town will approve the annual licensing of all restaurants, roadside stands, vendors and stores selling food and beverages and that a fee of \$5.00 be charged for this license, payable to the Town Treasurer. Such license to be issued by the Board of Health and only to those meeting the proper health laws. Article 14. Upon petition of Cynthia Brown and 28 others: To see if the Town will vote to raise and approriate the sum of Five Thousand Four Hundred and Eightythree (\$5,483.00) Dollars for the purchase and installation of a Closed Circuit Fire Alarm System. (Submitted without recommendation of the Budget Committee).

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to accept as public streets those parts of heretofore privately owned and improved streets known as (1) Lake Shore Drive, which begins at the Lafayette Highway and extends as far as, and provides street frontage for, Lots No. 34 and No. 39 and also (2) that part of Forest Drive which begins at Lake Shore Drive and extends to provide frontage to Lots No. 3, 4 and 35 as shown on Seabrook Development Inc. "Section One" of Registered Plan No. 1454 as approved for development on March 1, 1962; said acceptance being subject to the Town of Seabrook receiving satisfactory deeds of conveyance from the present owners of the aforesaid streets, and also subject to the approval of the Board of Selectmen.

Article 16. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to grant rights of way, and to sign and execute a deed or deeds to Exeter and Hampton Electric Company to construct and maintain a line or lines of poles and wires over two parcels of land owned by the Town, the first being a parcel of land acquired by said Town from one Ned W. Fellows and being located on the Southerly side of Rocks Creek, so-called, as shown on a certain plan entitled "Proposed Right of Way of Exeter and Hampton Electric Co., Across Land of Town of Seabrook, New Hampshire, Seabrook, New Hampshire'' by John W. Durgin, Civil Engineers, Scale 1" - 100', Feb. 1964, and the second being a right of way one hundred (100) feet in width throughout extending from land of Oliver W. Fowler on the East, 1,200 feet more or less, to the land or right of way of the Boston & Maine Railroad on the West;

the center line of said right of way to commence about three hundred (300) feet Northerly, measured along said Fowler land, from Rocks Road and to run Westerly and intersect said Railroad property at a point approximately five hundred (500) feet Northerly of said Rocks Road, as shown upon a certain plan entitled "Proposed Right of Way of Exeter and Hampton Electric Co., Across Land of Town of Seabrook, New Hampshire, Seabrook, New Hampshire" by John W. Durgin, Civil Engineers, Scale 1" - 100', Feb. 1964, said right of way and easements to be intergal parts of the power line which is to serve The Bailey Company, Inc.

Article 17. To see if the Town will authorize the Board of Selectmen to accept bids for the purchase of a new combination Cruiser-ambulance for use by the Police Department and to raise and appropriate the sum of Eleven Hundred (1,100.00) Dollars for the purchase of the same. (Approved by the Budget Committee.)

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to accept a gift of a two-way radio mobile unit from the Seabrook Fire-Fighters' Relief Association such gift to be installed in Engine 1 of the Seabrook Fire Department.

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen, with the consent of the Planning Board, to appoint a representative to represent the Town of Seabrook at future regional meetings of the Seacoast Regional Airport Committee.

Article 20. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to purchase a snow plow now being leased by the Town, on condition that the sum of \$685.00 that has been paid in rental of said plow to be deducted from the total cost of said plow and that the total cost of said plow shall not exceed Nineteen Hundred (\$1,900.00) Dollars and the sum of Twelve Hundred and Fifteen (\$1,215.00) Dollars to be raised and appropriated for the purchase of said plow. (Approved by the Budget Committee). Article 21. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen and the Planning Board to put the recommendations of the Engineering survey of the Exeter & Hampton Electric Light Company into effect and to authorize the re-locating of any existing lights now installed and to raise and appropriate the sum of Sixty-eight Hundred (\$6,800.00) Dollars for the project. (Without recommendation of the Budget Committee.)

Article 22. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to sell tax titled property at "Public Auction", after publication for three (3) consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation.

Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Forty-five Hundred(\$4,500.00) Dollars to renovate and restore the Town Pier at River Street. (Approved by the Budget Committee).

Article 24. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to have an engineering survey conducted on the following Town accepted streets: Boynton's Lane, Dow's Lane and Pine Street and to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars for this project. (Approved by the Budget Committee).

Article 25. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to take deeds, or easements, to properties on Dwight Avenue as shown on a survey by True W Chesley Engineering Co., in February, 1964.

Article 26. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to engage an engineering concern to make partial surveys to start a so-called Tax Map and to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand (1,000.00) Dollars for said project. This project to be on a five (5) Year basis.

(Approved by the Budget Committee).

Article 27. To see what action the Town will take in authorizing the appointment of a committee to make a study of the feasibility of constructing, renting, or buying a municipal building for the housng and/or storage of all town offices and equipment. This Committee to make its report to the 1965 Town Meeting.

Article 28. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to auction, or otherwise dispose of, an old safe no longer in use and stored at the former David Chase property.

Article 29. Upon petition by Cynthia Brown and 27 others: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Four Hundred Fifty (\$450.00) Dollars for the purchase of Five Hundred (500) feet of $1 \frac{1}{2}$ inch hose for the Fire Department. (Disapproved by the Budget Committee).

Article 30. Upon petition by Donald A. Eaton and 22 others: To see if the Town will vote to improve the surface of River Street and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 (Fifteen Hundred Dollars) for said purpose. (Disapproved by the Budget Committee).

Article 31. Upon petition by Bruce G. Brown and 12 others: To see if the Town will vote to recommend to the Planning Board the installation and maintenance of a street light on Exeter & Hampton Electric Company's pole number 753 on Route 86 near Shyer's Lobster Pound, and the Dairy Queen, and to raise and appropriate the sum of Forty-four (\$44.00) Dollars to cover the cost of the same. (Without recommendation of the Budget Committee).

Article 32. Upon petition by Ernest G. Hutchins and 10 others: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Forty-four (\$44.00) Dollars to install and maintain a street light on Exeter & Hampton Electric Company's pole number 652 located on New Zealand Road. (Without recommendation of the Budget Committee).

Article 33. Upon petition of James E. Champoux and 10 others: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Forty-four (\$44.00) Dollars to install and maintain a street light on Exeter & Hampton Electric Company's pole number 649 located on New Zealand Road. (Without recommendation of the Budget Committee).

Article 34. To hear the report of the Planning Board and to act thereon.

Article 35. To transact all other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The 1963 Summer playground was a highly successful season. The total enrollment for the playground was 145 children. This resulted in an average attendance of 32 at the morning session and 33 at the afternoon session. On Tuesday, beach day, the average attendance was 17 which often included several adults. The average evening attendance was 16 including adults. A total of 23 persons went on the two campouts that were held at Monadnock State Park.

In addition to the regular playground activities which included organized sports, table games, and handcrafts, a series of special activities and tournaments were held. Tournaments were held in five pins, chess, checkers, tetherball, ping pong, and others. Special activities included the state archery contest, a bicycle rodeo, a lh mile bike hike, a pet show, and olympic day races. At least one day per week was spent at the beach. Several children learned to swim for the first time.

Evening programs were set up each Tuesday and Thursday and generally the attendance was good. Among the activities having the best attendance was a cockout, a scavenger hunt, a family archery shoot, two family bowling nights in Exeter, and a watermelon shoot. The evening programs were open to the entire town with no limitations as to age.

Much new equipment was added to the playground this season, making a full inventory of equipment which will not need to be replaced for several seasons. At the close of the season this equipment was carefully inventoried and then stored at the Sanborn School. Other than expendable items, no new equipment will be needed. Expendable equipment includes such things as ping pong balls, arrows, and such.

The children financed their own handcrafts. This meant that they ordered what they wished, bought in their money and then the equipment needed was purchased. No money, other than for direction manuals was paid for from the town funds. Altogether the children bought and used \$70.93 worth of handcraft materials!

Altogether the season was very successful. Seabrook again made an excellent showing in the state archery tournament. Seabrook took three first place ribbons, two second place ribbons, and one third place ribbon in addition to individual awards. A quotation from the final results of the New Hampshire Recreation Association says, "A two tournament total of 3735 earned for the Seabrook Playground the second leg on the boys rotating trophy. This Seacoast community has won the boys tournament for five successive years." Richard A. Tapply has been holding the trophy until such a time when the townspeeple would like to honor their archers properly.

Many improvements can be made, but this season proved that the playground can be run successfully with profit and enjoyment for the residents, whether young or old.

SELECTMEN'S SPECIAL REPORT

We are pleased to submit the following Selectmen's report for the year of 1963.

The Board of Selectmen feels that this has been a most successful year for the Town of Seabrook and that the Town's future is very bright.

A milestone was set this year with the coming of two new industries to Seabrook. This is of particular significance and it speaks very well for the Town that these two industries have chosen our Community in which to establish their future.

Your Board has striven by all possible means this past year to control unnecessary expenditures and to prevent any further increase in taxes. Once again, we were successful in keeping the tax rate from increasing and at the same time have managed a Budget Surplus of \$18,000.00 (Eighteen Thousand Dollars) which may be applied to next year's tax rate, thereby keeping any increase at a minimum.

Another matter that the Board of Selectmen feels is of considerable importance to the Voters and Taxpayers and which should be mentioned in our report to you, is the future of our local Court. As many of you are already aware, the 1963 Legislature passed a new law which provides for a District Court System which will mean that, unless a majority of the Voters in Town vote "Yes" on the question that will be submitted on the Ballot as a Referendum Question, our local Court will be abolished and will be absorbed into a District Court which will be located in Hampton. We feel this would be a great loss to the Town of Seabrook in many ways. Economically, the Town of Seabrook stands to lose thousands of dollars over the years in revenue that the Town now receives from our local Court. It would also mean a loss in the prestige that a town gains by having a Municipal Court in the community; and further, it would be one more loss in "HOME RULE" that the Town would have in the control of it's own affairs.

Your Board of Selectmen has gone on record as being unanimously in favor of keeping our Municipal Court in Seabrook.

Our sincere and heart-felt thanks are extended to you, the Voters and Taxpayers, who have, with your faith and co-operation, made this a year of progress and success.

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Municipal Court and Trustees of Trust Funds.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Comparative Balance Sheets: December 31, 1962 - December 31, 1963: (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1962 and December 31, 1963, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein the Net Debt increased by \$18,098.73 in 1963.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit A-2)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. These were as follows:

As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit A-4), a revenue surplus of \$13,134.15, plus a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$5,456.71, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$18,590.86.

Summary Statement of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit B-1)

A summary statement of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1963, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1963, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

Statement of Long Term Indebtedness: (Exhibit G)

A statement of outstanding long term indebtedness as of December 31, 1963, showing annual debt service requirements, is contained in Exhibit G.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made up from statements obtained from depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records. The amounts of uncollected and unredeemed taxes as indicated in this report are therefore subject to any changes which may be necessitated by the return of veriSeabrook

fication notices.

GENERAL COMMENTS

Current Surplus:

The current surplus (excess of total assets over current liabilities) increased by \$901.27, from \$43,604.73 to \$44,506.00, in 1963, as shown herewith:

Inasmuch as most of these taxes are apparently uncollectible it is recommended that the Board of Selecemen authorize their removal from the warrants by abatement procedure. There is also an uncollected yield tax on the 1956 tax warrant which should be abated.

To include such uncollectible taxes as assets in the balance sheets year after year not only tends to distort the true financial picture of the Town, but also adds to the time spent in making the annual audit, with the resulting increase in the expense of the audit. Conclusion:

In accordance with the provisions of Chapter 184 of the Laws of 1955, this report or the summary of findings and recommendations (letter of transmittal) should be published in the next annual report of the Town.

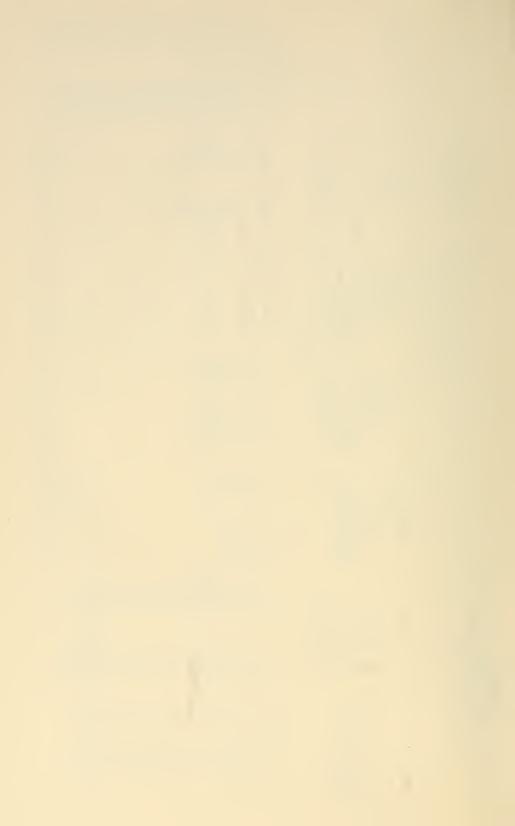
