THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Stewartstown, in the County of Coos, in said State qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the town hall in said town of Stewartstown on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid.
2. To see if the town will vote to accept the budget, and raise money for the same. If not, to see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to defray town charges for the ensuing year as follows:
 - (a) Town Officers' Salaries.
 - (b) Town Officers' Expenses.
 - (c) Election and Registration.
 - (d) Municipal Court Expenses.
 - (e) Town hall, office and other buildings.
 - (f) Damage and Legal Expense.
 - (g) Health Department.
 - (h) Town Dump.
 - (i) Vital Statistics.
 - (j) General Expense of Highway Department.
 - (k) Interest on Temporary Loans.
 - (l) Interest on Bonds.
 - (m) Payment on Bonds.
 - (n) Civil Defense.
 - (o) County Tax.
3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for support of poor.
4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for support of Libraries.

5. To raise such sum of money as may be necessary for care of cemeteries.
6. To see if the town will vote to raise one thousand four hundred dollars (\$1,400.00) for street lighting.
7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the following departments:
 - (a) Police Department.
 - (b) Fire Department.
 - (c) Sewer Department.
8. To see what sum of money, if any the town will vote to raise in addition to that required by law for the town road maintenance.
9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for winter roads.
10. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to layout a road across the southwest corner of the park and continue on so-called Blodgett field as far as house lots are sold and make appropriation for same.
11. To see if the town will vote to dig a water hole for fire protection at Stewartstown Hollow, also provide adequate fence and make appropriation for same. The water hole to be dug on or before June 1st, 1957.
12. To nominate and elect two members to serve three years on the Municipal Budget Committee.
13. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to incur debts, for temporary loans in anticipation of taxes of the Municipal year and pay out of the tax money when it is received.
14. To see if the town will vote to instruct its Selectmen to appoint all other officers as required by law Non-partisan Ballot.

15. To choose by Non-partisan ballot the following Town Officers:
- (a) Town Clerk.
 - (b) Selectmen for the three years ensuing.
 - (c) Town Treasurer.
 - (d) Three Road Agents.
 - (e) One or more Auditors.
 - (f) Collector of Diamond Pond Rent.
 - (g) One or more Sextons.
 - (h) Overseer of Poor.
 - (i) Trustee of Trust Fund.
 - (j) One Library trustee for the three ensuing.
16. To transact any other business that may be legally brought before this meeting.

Superintendent's Report

To the School Board and the Citizens of the School District of Stewartstown:

Foreword

Regardless of what our thinking may be relative to where present day education is leading us, and of the extent to which the press, radio and television have influenced it during the past several months, it is believed that one thing will be agreed upon, namely that more time, space and expense has been devoted in focusing our attention upon public education than was ever before known. True, much that has been said has been questionable and even condemning in nature. Even in such instances, however, there has been, now and then, a ray of hope. Probably, the best example which could be cited in this respect is Johnny's "growing up educationally," even though we were told he couldn't read. Now we hear more about him as "John" in high school who, in some miraculous manner, has picked up sufficient information along the way to know that he wants to shy away from mathematics and science.

To become really serious though, we are much concerned about the teaching of the three R's, especially reading, in the elementary school. Likewise, we are equally concerned over the selection of the subjects, particularly those of a technical nature, in the high school. As has been alluded to above, apparently either nearly everything has been said that could be said about the need for more effective teaching in our grades or something is definitely being done to improve the once claimed deplorable conditions. Indications to this effect are found in the switch in emphasis to more upon the professed need of greatly increased enrollments in the mathematics and science courses at the secondary school level. A goodly number of people believe this to be imperative, if we are to continue to enjoy our position of world leadership. Undoubtedly this is true to a certain extent. However, is there a danger here of yielding to technical hypnosis?

Although granted that the processes of physical research and the application of engineering methods enter into the solution of our present day problems in multitudinous ways, we have only to look about us to quickly sense that there are still problems of long standing yet to be solved. As a matter of fact, most of them would be just the same had the atom never been split. They require not so much a knowledge of the nature of matter as they do a clear mind, the power of logical analysis, wisdom born of experience, and an understanding of how to get along with others. Personnel relations between capital and labor, and international politics, proved good examples in this respect. The indications are that even though perhaps more attention should be given to specialized education, demands for the provision of a parallel in general education seem equally apparent. It is proven capacity to learn, rather than what has been learned, that really counts when one's formal education is completed, and he is out in the world on his own.

Teachers

Two new teachers have been employed by this district this year. Mrs. Carlotta E. Hart, a former retired teacher with extensive experience in several states over a period of many years, is teaching Grades 5-8 at the Cedar Brook School. Miss Jo Ann M. Parker, a graduate of Plymouth Teachers College, teaches Grades 1-4 at the Hollow School.

With no relief in sight to alleviate the teacher shortage which, if anything, is becoming progressively more serious every year, we are extremely fortunate to have our three veteran teachers return to the West Stewartstown School. Mrs. Velma H. Gray, the principal, teaches Grades 6-8; Mrs. Dorothy E. Blodgett teaches Grades 3-5; and Mrs. Cleora M. Richardson teaches Grades 1-3. As will be noted, the 3rd grade is divided between the two last named teachers.

School Nurse - Health

We are much pleased to have our school nurse, Mrs. Ethel S. Sturgis, with us again after recovering

from an operation which confined her for several weeks in the hospital and at home. It is during such a prolonged period, when the schools are not served by the school nurse, that the great importance of the work done by her in helping the pupils maintain good health is more fully realized.

Although it was not possible to perform the customary routine health work while Mrs. Sturgis was away, thanks to the sponsorship of the Mohawk Parent Teacher Association and the excellent cooperation of many willing workers, much was accomplished to protect the physical well being of the people in this area. Two very successful polio clinics were conducted, one each in November and January for ages six months to twenty years inclusive, and a chest x-ray clinic was held in the latter month for all ages. It should be noted here, also, that in addition to the above clinics, Mrs. Sturgis had a very well attended pre-school one last spring, and that complete physical examinations were made of all Fourth Grade pupils shortly after the opening of school in September.

Buildings and Equipment

Thanks to the continued practice over a long period of time of keeping the buildings in a good state of repair and maintenance, comparatively little work in this respect has been necessary during the past year. Outside of touching-up surfaces with paint where needed to keep the classrooms clean and attractive, most repairs made at the Hollow and Cedar Brook Schools were minor in nature. At the West Stewartstown School the floors in the school lunch room and boys' and girls' basements were painted; the sink in the school lunch room was raised to a more convenient working height; the top of a utility table in the upper grade room was covered with linoleum; the furnace stoker was overhauled; and the old window shades in the halls were replaced with new ones. Through the sponsorship of the Parent Teacher Association, also, several truckloads of sand were spread on the playground. Black window shades have been purchased, too, by this organization for installation in the large south windows in the room used for showing moving pictures.

Such items of equipment as have been added since a year ago have consisted, for the most part, of those customarily purchased for instruction purposes.

School Lunch Program

The continued increase in the number of pupils taking advantage of the School Lunch Program at the West Stewartstown School to the extent that most of them now eat at the school, indicates the outstanding success of this program. As has been pointed out previously, much credit is due the operator, Mrs. Eva M. Day, for all the work she has done in promoting the growth of this program conducive to the building of good morale, and to the overall happy and healthful life of the school.

Notes on the Budget

The School Boards' Budget to cover the cost of the operation of the schools for 1957-58, and which is the same as that of the Budget Committee, is \$45,782.00 as compared to the \$41,675.00 raised and appropriated by the district for the current year. This amount is reduced by an estimated income of \$10,000.00 from State Aid, which leaves a requested appropriation of \$35,782.00 to be raised by taxes by the town in comparison to \$32,175.00 for this year. For the most part, the increase in the budget for next year is explained, as will be noted in the budget breakdown found on subsequent pages in this report, by provision for raises in salaries, greater transportation costs, and higher tuition rates.

Enrollment and Attendance

After increasing for the past successive three years, the enrollment of pupils in our schools this year has decreased, as there are 113 enrolled at the present time as compared to 117, 113, 110 and 97 for the respective preceding four years. A breakdown of the present enrollment shows there are 73 at the West Stewartstown School, 21 at the Cedar Brook School, and 19 at the Hollow School. The average percentage of attendance at these schools during the past year in the

same order as listed was 96.64, 95.82 and 96.40, while the average number of tardinesses per pupil for the period was 1.30, .28 and .00.

Tuition Pupils

The number of pupils enrolled in schools outside the district for the current year is 35 as compared to 38, 31, 38 and 42 for the respective preceding four years. A breakdown of this year's number of tuition pupils shows there are 16 at Colebrook Academy and 19 at Canaan High School, Canaan, Vermont.

Legislation

Since the Governor is in agreement with the Commissioner in petitioning the Legislature for a substantial increase in general school aid for the next bien-nium, and the establishment of school building aid on a permanent basis, the outlook is promising for additional financial assistance from the State level to help pay the rapidly mounting costs of operating our schools. Other possible legislation which will be of vital concern to teachers, especially, will be the action taken by the lawmakers in their consideration of the proposed conversion of the present Teacher Retirement System into one of combination with Social Security.

Conclusion

May I again express my sincere thanks to the members of the School Board, parents, teachers, and citizens for all the help and co-operation received in our work together to provide good schools.
