To the inhabitants of the Town of Strafford in the County of Strafford in said State qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Strafford Elementary School in said Strafford on Tuesday, the ninth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

PLEASE NOTE: Articles 2-21 will be taken up at 8 p.m.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for Public Welfare including Old Age Assistance and Soldiers' Aid.

4. To hear the report of the Committee on Zoning and act on same.

5. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for highways and bridges.

6. To see if the Town will accept Town Road Aid, and raise and appropriate the sum of \$887.43 and the State will contribute \$5,916.17.

7. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$3,000.00 and the State will allocate \$3,000.00 for Class Il construction on the Province Road. 8. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the Lakes Region Association.

9. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.

10. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the control of White Pine Blister Disease.

11. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for Civil Defense.

12. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 to develop the swimming facilities on Water Street and Bow Lake.

13. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$300.00 for maintenance of Bow Lake Fire Department.

14. To see what the Town wishes to do in regard to a Library.

15. To see if the Town wishes to Amend the 1958 Building Code to necessitate the obtaining of a permit, before buliding docks, piers, etc.

16. To see if the Town wishes to fix the salary of bookkeeper for Trustee of Trust Funds at \$50.00 per year, and raise and appropriate same.

17. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

18. To see if the Town will grant any discount on property taxes paid in full within thirty days of date of issue of tax collector's warrant.

19. To see if the Town wishes to establish a five man Town Planning Board to be appointed by the Selectmen.

20. To see if the Town wishes to elect the Road Agent for three years instead of one year.

21. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

School opened in September with only one change in the school staff. Mrs. Dorothy Daly replaced Mrs. Edna Young as teacher of grades three and four. The impact of twenty-three first grade pupils entering school this year created an undesirable pupil load in the combination first and second grade classroom. We were fortunate to be able to secure the experienced services of Mrs. Sarah Huckins to assist Mrs. Hayes on a part time basis. This arrangement is working as anticipated in providing the necessary teacher instructional time so necessary with primary children.

The Strafford Woman's Club, P.T.A. and the students of Mrs. Scribner's room have supported the school library again this year as in the past, and through the efforts of Mrs. Williams and Mrs. Scribner, the books have been cataloged and all newly acquired books are processed properly.

Music instruction continues with Mrs. Ramsdell as the music supervisor, and the representative of Carl Fischer Company provides individual and small group instrumental music instruction at a minimal charge to the pupils.

The Physical Education program, under the direction of Mr. Lynbourg, provides the pupils with a much needed supervised activity. During the good weather this program is conducted on the playground, and then during the winter months these activities are moved to the all-purpose room.

The effective utilization of Channel 11, Educational Television provides for an enriched curriculum. The programs viewed this school year are as follows:

REPORT OF THE SCHOOL NURSE TOWN OF STRAFFORD

To the Superintendent of Schools:

The school year of 1963-64 saw many children absent because of German Measles. However, with this exception, I feel that the Strafford Public School had a very good health report.

The school health service included a routine health inspection of each child by the nurse. The parents were informed whenever defects were found, and all of these children were seen or treated by their family physician. The success of the health program depends largely upon such cooperation as the parents of Strafford have shown.

The following summary lists the tests and examina-

tions done by the school nurse, the defects found, the number of corrected cases, and the number of cases of communicable diseases:

A clinic for Tuberculosis Patch Testing was held on April 13, 1964 at which time 108 students and 6 adults (teachers and cooks) were tested. There were 4 positive reactions and all of these were x-rayed. These clinics are made possible by the sale of Christmas Seals.

The annual Pre-School Clinic was held in May, and was attended by 14 children. Each child was given a routine health inspection by the nurse. Parents were then informed of any defects noted at the time.

One child was seen at the Pediatric Heart Clinic in Manchester, and 1 was referred to the N. H. Crippled Children's Services for diagnosis and treatment.

During the year 26 home visits were made.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Mr. Martineau, Mr. Smith, the School Board, teachers, parents and students for their constant cooperation.
