STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Wilmot in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Wilmot on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of Town highways.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$50 for Old Home Day.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate any money for Memorial Day.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to borrow \$3,000.00, the State to furnish \$67,000.00 for the completion of the fourth New Hampshire Turnpike, and issue serial notes if and when, the construction begins.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to make any change in the number of Road Agents elected.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to dispose of the Bond place, so-called.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell the Hearse house.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to accept the bequest as specified in the will of the late Dr. Loren A. Sanders.

- 11. (Requested) To see if the Town will vote to accept a section of road leading from the Cascade corner to what was known as the Howe Place.
- 12. (Requested) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Wilmot Volunteer Fire Department, a sum not to exceed \$300.00.
- 13. (Requested) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding \$35.00 for the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate any money for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.
- 15. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to secure the assistance of the State Tax Commission in re-appraising the taxable property in the town in order to secure greater equality as between taxpayers, and to insure the assessment of all property in the town on the same standard of value, and to raise and appropriate money to pay for the same.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting, and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.
- 17. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.
