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WARRANT FOR THE TOWN OF BROOKFIELD, N. H.

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Brookfield in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Brookfield on Tuesday, the Tenth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to hire a sum of money to pay Town Charges in anticipation of Taxes.

4. To see if the Town will vote to put \$2,000.00 of the 1958 surplus into the Capital Reserve Fund.

5. To see if the Town will vote to accept Town Road Aid on class V highways and appropriate \$278.75 as the Town's share.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$100.00 for the Sanbornville Fire Precinct.

7. To see if the Town will vote the sum of \$50.00 for use of the Sanbornville dump.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$50.00 for the Gafney Library in Sanbornville.

9. To see if the Town will vote to purchase a mowing attachment for the grader, and sand spreader and raise the sum of \$1,450.00 to pay for same.

10. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Planning Board of five(or seven) members with duties as set forth in Sections 1-15. Chapter 36, N. H. Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955, to make a study of the Town's development and report to the Town appropriate recommendations for the promotion and maintenance of the Town's best development. The Board shall consist of one Selectman and four (or six) other citizens appointed by the Selectmen, as provided in Chapter 36, N. H. Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955.

11. To transact any other business that may legally come before said Town Meeting.

FOREST FIRE WARDEN REPORT

Dear Mr. and Mrs. and Family:

Once again our region is covered with snow and the forest fire hazard has disappeared, but to your local forest fire warden it is just a time to check over his equipment and check the causes of the fires he has had. We know that our biggest cause of forest fires are careless people burning rubbish, brush or debris without a permit or in an unsafe place. When this fire gets away from them and help is needed to put it out they then plead that they did not know a permit was required for the incinerator or this type burning. Well, the old saying, "ignorance of the law is no excuse" fits here very well. The forest fire laws have been in the newspapers, on the radio and on television and are on some posters, and there should be no excuses for not knowing a permit is required for all outdoor burning. In this year's report we are going to quote the law of the State of New Hampshire in regards to permits, this is found in Chapter 233, Section 35, Revised Laws, State of New Hampshire.

Permits

35b No person, firm or corporation shall kindle or cause to be kindled any fire or shall burn or cause to be burned any material, and no city or town shall kindle or maintain a fire or a public dump in or near woodlands, pasture, brush, sprout, waste, or cutover land or where fire may be communicated to such lands, except when the ground is covered with snow, without first obtaining a written permit from the forest fire warden of the town where the burning is to be done unless the same is in the presence of the warden or his agent.

Liability for fires without permit.

36 Any person causing or kindling a fire without permit of the forest fire warden when such permit is required and any person by whose negligence or the negligence of his agents any fire shall be caused, shall be liable in a civil action for the payment to the town or the state or both, of the expenses incurred by the forest fire warden or his deputy warden in attending or extinguishing such fire.

Penalties

38 Any person violating any provisions of Section 35 shall be fined not more than two hundred dollars or imprisoned not more than sixty days.

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the School district in the town of Brookfield qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the 10th day of March, 1959, at One (1:00) o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.

2. To choose a Clerk for the enusing year.

3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.

4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.

5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.

6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.

8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

9. Resolved that the Brookfield school district petition the State Board of Education to become a member of a cooperative school district which may include, in addition to this district the following districts, namely Effingham, Freedom, Madison, Ossipee, Tamworth, and Wakefield.

10. To choose two representatives of the district to serve on an interim committee which shall prepare a financial budget for the proposed cooperative school district. 11. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting on this date.

The school census of September, 1958 shows that there will be five pupils to enter the first grade in September, 1959. Since there are none to be graduated from the eighth grade there should be a total of 21 elementary pupils next year. The present high school enrollment indicates that there will be three high school pupils. Tuition rates for 1959-60 have been announced as follows:

Wakefield, \$217.45; Wolfeboro, \$240.00; Brewster Academy, \$360.00; Nute High School, \$320.00; Spaulding High School, \$351.50.

Average cost per elementary pupil for 1957-58 was \$367.23, and \$301.32 per high school pupil. State average cost per elementary pupil is not available at this date. The maximum high school tuition rate established by the State Department of Education for the current year is \$367.00 which represents the state average cost of last year but does not include the cost of transportation.

A study of the feasibility of forming a cooperative school district of some of the school districts in this supervisory union has been carried on during the year. Representatives on the study committee include the three school board members, Mrs. Edna Manzer, Mr. Godfrey Mattson, and Mr. Bruce Tasker. They are to be highly commended for their faithful attendance of the many committee meetings and their contribution to the study.

A report of the Cooperative Study Committee appears elsewhere.

The cooperation of the School Board members is acknowledged and our pleasant association much appreciated.
