

#### NOTICE TO DOG OWNERS

#### Chapter 151 Laws of New Hampshire

Section 6—Every owner or keeper of a dog three months old or over shall annually on or before April 30 cause it to be registered, numbered, described and licensed for one year from the first day of the ensuing May, in the office of the clerk of the city or town wherein said dog is kept, and shall cause it to wear around its neck a collar distinctly marked with its owner's name, and bearing attached to said collar a metal tag distinctly marked with its registered number. Said tag shall be furnished by the clerk at the expense of the city or town from the amount received from dog license fees.

Section 18—The mayor of each city and the selectmen of each town shall annually within ten days from May first issue a warrant to one or more police officers or constables directing them to proceed forthwith either to kill or cause to be killed all dogs within such city or town not licensed and collared according to the provisions of this chapter, and to enter complaint against the owners or keepers thereof; and any person may, and every police officer and constable shall kill or cause to be killed all such dogs, whenever and wherever found.

#### Town Warrant

#### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

(L. S.) To the inhabitants of the Town of Cornish in the County of Sullivan qualified to vote in Town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House, in said town, on the second Tuesday, being the tenth day, of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects.

- 1. To elect one selectman and one Trustee of the Trust funds for three years and all other necessary Town Officers and agents for the ensuing year.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.
- 3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the repair of highways and bridges.
- 4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Memorial Day.
- 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the repair of cemeteries.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of fifteen hundred dollars (\$1500.00) for maintenance of State aid roads.
- 7. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to apply for State aid on highways and raise the sum of (\$1,465.50) fourteen hundred sixty-five dollars and fifty cents.
- 8. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of (\$1,500.00) fifteen hundred dollars for trunk line maintenance.
- 9. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.00) to help pay for lighting the streets of Cornish Flat with electricity.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) for E. L. Huse, M. D., for the ensuing year to insure the services of a Doctor for the people of Cornish.

- 11. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to borrow money if necessary, in anticipation of taxes.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of four hundred dollars (\$400.00) for the control of white pine blister rust.
- 13. To see if the town will instruct the selectmen to dispose of two old road machines, two rollers and hearse.
- 14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to widen the turn at Hoban's corner.
- 15. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) for graveling the road from the corner at E. B. Hunt's house on the hillroad as far as O. F. Atwood's.
- 16. By request. To see what sum of money the town will vote to repair and gravel the road from the State road to P. F. Burr's.
- 17. To see if the town will raise or appropriate the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) to the stage road leading from George Cunningham's to Oborne house.
- 18. To see if the town will vote to build a new cement bridge on the Plainfield road, south of Fred Kibby's and raise the necessary amount therefor.
- 19. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to purchase a new tractor, snow plow and road machine at a cost not exceeding six thousand dollars (\$6,000.00) and raise two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) and borrow the balance on the credit of the town.
- 20. To see if the town will vote to purchase one or more one and one half ton Ford heavy truck or trucks, purchase price not to exceed nine hundred fifty dollars (\$950.00) and to raise the necessary amount therefore.
- 21. By request. To see if the town will vote for the road commissioner not to use his own truck on the road for town trucking.
- 22. By request. To see if the town will vote to keep the tractor and snow plow in the town buildings.

- 23. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) to build a tool and shelter house in the Child Cemetery.
- 24. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to sell or dispose of the Wheir Grader and Tractor with snow plow and the proceeds applied to a new one.
- 25. To hear the reports of Officers, Agents, Auditors and Committees heretofore choosen and pass any vote in relation thereto.
- 26. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

### LIBRARIAN'S REPORT

We refrain this year from quoting figures, but we are very glad to state that the interest and patronage of the library this past year has been fully up to normal. More and more our reference books are used and the non-fiction books read form a fair percentage. You will see that we have been able to add over 30 volumes to our collection during the year. Many of these are first edition books. Taking out a membership in the Junior Literary League early in the year has enabled us to secure some high priced, first class books at a reasonable price for our young readers of ages 9 to 16. Many of our adult readers have enjoyed these also. We have gladly acknowledged gifts from Mrs. Robert Barrett, Miss Cora Gaines, Mr. Burton Blanchard, Mrs. J. J. Rollins and others. We now have our town reports nicely bound to date and in shape to be preserved and accessible during the coming years. Early in the year we bought a nice up to date, nonfreezing hand fire extinguisher which was, we thought, a wise precautionary measure. The routine work as well as the Branch work has gone on in the ordinary way. Our fire insurance tax coming due for a three year period somewhat depleted our treasury. Always our small income of \$425 has to be stretched very thin to cover all the demands of the work. The trustees carefully consider and weigh the several expense accounts as they make out the yearly Budget before submitting it to the Board of Selectmen.

We believe the library to be a most important and educational work and we are ever thankful for the nice building and equipment that is ours to use. One great regret is that there are some families in town who do not improve the opportunity to use the library. Remember our open hours, 3 to 5:30 and 7 to 9 each Saturday. Come, look over the shelves, read the books and enjoy your library—it is your library.

To the School Board of Cornish:

I hereby offer for your consideration my twelfth annual school report.

The schools were opened on Tuesday, the second of September, with a force of nine teachers, four of whom are without experience. Seven teachers are normal school graduates.

The others have had long and successful experience.

The name of the teacher, the fall term enrollment and the December enrollment are exhibited.

On January 16, owing to illness, Mrs. Northrop resigned her position at the City School and Miss Ellen Hadley has taken charge of the school.

As shown by the Sept. 30, 1930 school census the number of children (5-16) living in town were 189. The returns for 1929 1928 1927 1926 1925 1924 1923 1922 1921 1920 were 165 168 173 166 172 174 161 163 166 179

One hundred seventy-three children were registered in the local schools. Twelve were attending secondary schools. Five between five and eight were not in school attendance and one between fourteen and sixteen, although he had completed the elementary course of study, was not in high school attendance.

### GENERAL STATISTICS

July 1, 1929 to June 30, 1930

The total school membership was 152. The average membership was 142. The per cent of attendance was 93.71. Ten pupils were neither absent nor tardy for the entire year:—Philip Wardner, Lena Cole, Rodney Palmer, Ralph Welch, Helen Flanders, Myrtle Rollins, Roland Keniston, Waneta Manley and Kathern Philbrick.

### School Nurse

Mrs. Hasham was reelected as school nurse for the year 1930-1931 by the school boards of Cornish and other towns in the Charlestown, Newport and Plainfield unions. She reports the inspection, weighing and measurements of 146 Cornish Scholars. Defects found were malnutrition 15, hearing 1, nervous condition 1, cardiac disease 4, orthopedic trouble 1, teeth 78, tonsils 55. Parents of children suffering from defects should consult a physician that remedial treatment may be received. 13 children have already received corrective treatment. Five others are now under treatment. 29 unvaccinated children were found. Smallpox authorities recommend vaccination at the age of six months and again at the age of six years. A few cases of mumps and whooping cough were found. 97 home visits were made for advice and follow-up work. The largest item undertaken by her this fall was the toxin antitoxin clinics for which she arranged in October. She secured Dr. Weaver of Manchester and the nurses Mrs. Barton and Mrs. Gobie as assistants. 125 school children and 40 children of pre-school age received treatment. The expenses of the clinics were financed by the local chapter of the Red Cross.

### REPAIRS

During the summer a maple floor was laid at the city school. New single desks were installed in place of the old outworn double desks. The stove was provided with a jacket which has worked satisfactorily in equalizing the heat of the room thus increasing the comfort of teacher and pupils. New blackboards were placed on the wall in place of some which had outlived their usefulness. At the Dingleton school a much needed woodshed was built and modern toilets were connected with the building. A cloak room was also provided. Some minor repairs were made at the Chadbourne school.
