STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of Dalton, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Dalton on Tuesday, the 12th of March next at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects. The polls will be open at 12 o'clock.

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

2. To see if the Town will accept the Budget for 1963 prepared by the Selectmen and appropriate the amounts therein or to make any changes.

3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$108.85 for the purpose of uniting with the other 45 towns in the White Mountains Region Association in the Cooperative development and promotion of the North Country's economy.

4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.

5. To see if the Town will vote to give the Selectmen the right to issue temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.

6. To see if the Town will vote to increase all town officers salaries and raise and appropriate a sum of money to pay for the same.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purpose of having the Town appraised by either the State or an outside firm of appraisers.

8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to purchase a new truck, hoist and body, and authorize the selectmen to borrow on the credit of the town the necessary amount by the issuance of serial notes for a period of four years, in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act.

9. To see if the Town will vote to apply all profits from outside work by the Highway Department to pay off any existing notes for new highway equipment purchased by vote of the Town.

10. To see if the Town will vote to close the road from the buildings of the Wallace Rarm, so called, to the Ralph Rodgers Homestead subject to gates and bars.

11. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

In May, 9 children were examined at the Preschool Clinic by Dr. Elwin Falkenham.

One child regularly attended the Orthopedic Clinic in Littleton during the year.

In June, under the capable chairman, Mrs. Edith Burbank, a house to house canvass was conducted for children 6 weeks of age to six years, for Sabin Vaccine Immunization. The clinics were held in Lancaster, and in June 60 children were immunized, in July, 63, and in August 49. On July 17, 100 children and adults received Type III Sabin Vaccine at a Clinic conducted at the Dalton School, on September 7, 73 school children and 90 adults received Type I Vaccine, and on October 5, 84 children and 54 adults received Type II Vaccine. Mrs. Rita Blakslee was the Chairman for these clinics, and due to her persistent efforts they were a success.

It is hoped that during the year 1963, a Well Child Conference can be held in the town for preschool children at least every two months. This is a service which should be most helpful to parents, and we sincerely hope they will all bring their children to these Conferences, at least once a year.

It is always a pleasure to work with the Citizens of Dalton, and I would like to thank them for their cooperation during the past year.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Dalton:

It is with pleasure that I submit to you my annual report relative to your schools.

School opened in September with a total enrollment of 75 as compared with a total enrollment of 76 one year ago.

There have been no changes in the teaching staff since my last report. Mr. Willard Streeter was appointed custodian following the resignation of Mr. Charles Knudson, and Mrs. Vera Bacon was appointed school lunch operator following the resignation of Mrs. Eleanor Bell.

Mrs. Blakslee, who is employed on a part-time basis for special reading, meets with a total of 21 pupils during the morning session. These pupils meet in small groups or as individuals with the teacher because of varying needs and difficulties. When the need arises children are assigned to the program and discharged from it when sufficient progress is made to allow the child to read with his class. Dalton can be very proud that it offers this service to its pupils.

Since my last report a water softener and filter has been installed in the school which will reduce the problem arising from the high iron content of the water. This installation has made the water more palatable and will cut down its corrosive action on boiler and pipes.

Your school still continues to be used as a center for youth and civic activities in the community.

The budget for the coming year is of necessity somewhat higher than that of the past year. The major cause of this increase is due to the increased cost of tuition for pupils in Grades 7-12. Tuition rates for Grades 7 and 8 have increased from \$240.00 to \$250.00, and for Grades 9 through 12 from \$375.00 for this year to \$425.00 for the coming year. Only minor increases are evident in other areas of the budget.

Included in this report will be found the report of the school nurse who carries on a very efficient and effective health program. You will also find statistical report, financial report, budget for this year and next year, teacher list and tuition list for the present year.

In closing, I wish to express my appreciation to the citizens of Dalton, the school board and all other school district personnel for their continued cooperation.

I am most grateful for the interest and help given our health program by interested citizens and organizations. We have had financial assistance for tonsil and adenoid operations and special dental problems. The Salvation Army Fund, as well as the Red Cross, was used in some cases. Our teachers show their continued interest and cooperation in the health program. I certainly appreciate their help.
