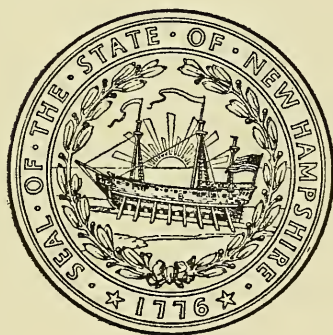

The State of New Hampshire

**To the Inhabitants of the Town of Danbury in the
County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote
in Town Affairs:**

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Danbury on Tuesday, the 9th day of March, next at one of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

Business meeting on all other articles to begin at 7:30 P. M.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of Highways.

4. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for maintenance and repair of bridges.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$800.44 T. R. A. money and receive the State's contribution of \$5,336.28.

6. To see if the Town will raise the sum of \$250.00 for the George Gamble Library.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$600.00 to meet the necessary expenditures of the Danbury Volunteer Fire Department.

8. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for the care of Cemeteries.

9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

10. To see if the Town will raise the required sum of \$100.00 and appropriate same for Forest Fire Division.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise the required sum of \$49.00 for the Control of White Pine Blister Rust.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding \$60.00 for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural resources of the Town with other towns in the Dartmouth - Lake Sunapee Region Association.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 to join the Newfound Region Chamber of Commerce for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the Resources of the Town.

14. To see if the Town will raise the sum of \$25.00 for Old Home Day.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$50.00 for Civil Defense.

16. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,140.00 principal and interest due on long term note.

17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell real estate taken by the Town for non-payment of taxes or by Tax Collector's deed.

18. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the road from Plowman's Driveway to the Boundary of Ragged Mountain Corporation Land as an open Highway and make same subject to gates and bars.

19. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

SELECTMEN'S REPORT

We wish to take this opportunity to review some of our projects of the past year and explain some of our future problems.

Town Hall Water Installation:

As you all know, we had \$1,700.00 to install toilets and water in the Town Hall. This fund came from a Grant of \$1200.00 by the Spaulding - Potter Charitable Foundation, and \$500.00 from the Town.

We advertised for bids for this project but found none that would meet our budget of \$1,700.00. For a while we thought we might have to abandon the project, but through determined personnel it was agreed that this project could be done with volunteer labor.

The project is now completed and we have spent approximately \$1,600.00. We have a few small bills for paint, but feel certain the total cost will be within the budget.

We wish to thank all the people who gave their time and effort to this project, it would have been impossible without their help.

Town Dump:

Once more, we wish to Thank all the people for their cooperation in keeping the dump clean.

Although this is still a big problem we feel we have eliminated the fire hazzard and the dump has received favorable recommendation from the state.

We saved money this year by donating our own time to burn the dump and attend it during dry spells. We hope to be able to hire a dump attendant in the future.

Fire Department:

We met with the fire commissioners this year in an effort to consolidate some of our expenses to make it

possible for them to use some of their appropriation to purchase new hose which is badly needed.

We feel that we could pay their fuel bill and insurance out of Town Appropriations and purchase gasoline, tires, and other supplies much cheaper by bulk purchases at state prices with tax exemptions.

For this reason we have asked for an increase of \$180.00 for insurance.

Highways and Bridges:

Highways and bridges are probably the Town's biggest problem. Gravel roads and wooden bridges are too expensive to maintain, but also too expensive to replace at one time.

We would like to start a bridge project with the hope of eventually replacing all of our wooden bridges in a period of about ten years.

The small bridges will be replaced with concrete culverts at a cost of \$43.00 per 4 foot section of pipe. We have been replanking these bridges every five or six years at a cost of about \$70.00. The cost of replacing these small bridges would be approximately \$300.00 each, but there would be no further maintenance required.

We tried paving over wooden planking on two bridges this year to see if it would help to preserve the planks. This might extend the life of the planks for a few years, but it still doesn't solve the problem.

Therefore we are asking for an appropriation to purchase steel bridge planking. We will use this on bridges which now have steel girders and pave over the steel plates. With a little maintenance these bridges should last a good many years.

During the past six years we have spent \$1,801.18 for bridge plank.

In 1960 we spent an additional \$3,300.00 to repair four bridges. Two of them with wood stringers which will have to be replaced in a few years.

Steel bridge plank and hot top will cost between \$600 - \$900 plus labor depending on the size of the bridge. Wooden bridge plank averages about \$150.00 and has to be replaced in six years.

We ask your consideration on this article in the Town Warrant.

This past year we had to abandon our regular road projects to rebuild Bog Road. Our first estimate for this project was \$22,000.00 for an 18 foot paved surface. We later decided it should be paved to 20 feet. By doing much of this work with our own men and equipment we completed this project and paved Ward's Hill and part of Eastern District which was badly broken up for a total cost of \$23,065.02, of this amount \$6,593.03 was taken from Duncan Money. We overdrafted TRA Funds by \$4,076.03 which will be paid out of this year's TRA Fund. We saved about \$1,500 on this project by using our own grader and other equipment whenever possible.

Although our Town Highway Appropriations were overdrafted by about \$900.00 we had rebates from State gasoline tax, and a little income from this Department which amounted to about \$400.00 receipts to the General Fund, so the actual overdraft was about \$500.00.

We had to make some major repairs on our truck and Austin Western Grader during the year which accounts for the overdraft in General Expenses.

We would like to commend our Road Agent for the job he did with his limited budget.

We also wish to thank the N. H. Municipal Association and its Executive Director, David L. Mann, for all his assistance in helping the Town save money. The

savings on gasoline and tires alone amounted to over \$500 this past year.

Street Lighting:

We have been planning to change some street lights in Town for the past year but so far have not done so. Myrl Phelps has gone over the Town and given us recommendations for these changes. We hope to replace these lights in the near future with brighter ones.

Inventories:

Once more we would like to impress upon you the importance of returning an inventory. We have spent much time and money to bring our records up to date and the inventory reports are needed to keep our records in order.

We call your attention to RSA 74:12 (Doomage) printed on the back of the inventory form.

FIRE COMMISSIONER'S REPORT

Eighteen years have passed since the Danbury Volunteer Fire Department was inaugurated.

The Officers and Members of the department wish to take this opportunity to pay our respects to those both past and present who labored so hard to organize the department and continue on to make it a success.

The department has tried to operate as economically as possible and not burden the taxpayers. Within the past three years the department has purchased the following items that were quite necessary.

The Booster Pump on the tank truck had to be replaced, so we purchased a Midship Pump with all fittings for \$471.07, the labor cost for installing was saved as the boys of the department did the work. The water tank on the tank truck, which carried approximately 500 gals., sprung a leak, we replaced it with a tank carrying 600 gals., for \$521.69. We replaced the Booster Hose on the tank truck, \$195.00, and added 2 fog nozzels, caps and couplings, \$118.75. We have also installed a central heating system in the Fire House for \$675.00. Our last purchase for this year was 2 Walkie-Talkies at a cost of \$334.66. With these we can contact both Cardigan and Kearsarge Mountains and relay messages to the outside in case Danbury might be cut off from communication by telephone. We have spent a total of \$2,316.17, money raised by the fire department by our various projects, and spent for the benefit of the residents of the town.

This year we have put an article in the Warrant

asking the taxpayers for the sum of \$600 dollars for operating expenses for the ensuing year.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND YOUR DISTRICT CHIEF

The 1964 forest fire season surpassed the record year of 1963 in both length and severity. For the second successive year, we experienced a rainfall deficiency of more than ten inches and the compounding of such drought conditions, together with the many days of strong, dry winds, characterized 1964 as one of the most hazardous years in the past half century. Although our fire season was three weeks longer than that of 1963, the number of fires showed only a slight increase and more remarkable was the fact that the area burned dropped from 2280 acres in 1963 to 900 acres in 1964. Early detection and rapid response kept many potential fire disasters from becoming reality. We all owe a debt of gratitude to the men in this community who responded and fought our fires so efficiently. Our state is now 86 percent wooded and its economy - both industrial and recreational - is greatly dependent on this forest resource. The responsibility for adequate fire protection of this great area - 4,350,000 acres - is everyone's responsibility and prevention is one of our most effective tools.

Prevention is good common sense.

1. Take your rubbish to the town dump. If you must burn, obtain a permit and watch your fire until it is dead out.

2. Instruct your children in fire safety. Keep matches from young children. Explain to them the dangers of lighting and making outdoor fires.

3. Be sure discarded smoking material and matches are out.

A major portion of our preventable fires this year are chargeable to three causes: (1) permit fires allowed to escape; (2) children playing with matches; and (3) smokers. Let's be mindful of the fact that all such fires endanger property and lives.

We wish to thank you for your very fine cooperation during the past fire season and with your continued cooperation we are confident that we can improve our fire record in 1965.

RECREATION IN THE NEW "OLD TOWN HALL"

DANBURY'S useful and attractive Town Hall: Now, a real center for part-time indoor recreational activities — "Hats off" to the CITIZENS who have made it so!

Hall improvements — such as the installation of a central heating system; painting; a new floor; new roofing and addition of insulation; and — with the aid of a \$1200 Grant from the Spaulding-Potter Charitable Trust Fund — installation of water for drinking and toilet facilities — have been made possible through: First, Public Vote of the necessary funds; and, secondly, Volunteer Labor — a "Yankee" economy-stretching trait.

Maintenance funds for the Hall — including lights, fuel, and general repairs — have been appropriated annually at Town Meetings.

All of these benefits, derived from general maintenance and gradual improvements, have not been only to the advantage of those participating in recreational activity but to others who meet: Town officials in conducting their business; citizens who applied their privilege at voting times; interest groups with special events such as Extension Club, 4-H, Firemen, and private gatherings for special parties. The PUBLIC knows that there is an available meeting spot ready for immediate use by simply opening the doors.

RECREATION-wise, statistics — 1964 based — would find recreational activities being conducted 1 out of 3 nights (approximate average) during the year, with a sum total 2635 participators. Developed, under the initial sponsorship of the Danbury PTA, is a recreational

program now serving directly, and indirectly, a large proportion of the families in the community. This program is still considered important in view of its fostering many practical opportunities, not otherwise available in our small community, for physical, mental, and social development. Skills and other attributes such as poise, posture, and sociability obtained through participation over the years in the program, have decidedly resulted in a tremendous noticeable carry-over into these participants' activities in their community and school. This, in itself, should bring self-satisfaction to all those volunteer leaders, workers, helpers, private contributors, plus our taxpayers who give much to carry on the Recreational Program.

In 1964, four activities were under wing: Basketball (girls, gals, boys), cheerleading, baton twirling, and square dancing.

Basketball (for girls, gals, and boys) included practices, games, and a six-division foul shooting contest. The boys were in the Kearsage-Cardigan Mountain Junior Basketball League and also participated in the Enfield Lions Annual Basketball Tournament.

The cheerleaders encouraged our boys with their vigorous and various cheers. A new outfit of maroon cheerleading skirts and pants did much to improve the appearance and performance of the leaders.

The well-known twirlers entertained at basketball games, at the Granges, and other organizational programs, and participated in many parades. A twirling workshop was conducted again this year in the Fall.

The Danbury Promenaders continued with their dance instructional sessions, monthly dance parties, and dance demonstrations for the PTA, Grange, Newfound Area Festival, and State Folk Festival. Their New Year's Dance marked the observance of the passing of the seventh year of the organization of the recreational program's first activity — square dancing.
