THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE**TOWN WARRANT**

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Deerfield in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:
(L. S.)

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Deerfield on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,127.68 for Town Road Aid, the State to contribute \$7,517.86.

4. To see if the Town will vote to proceed with the renovation of the Town Hall in accordance with vote of the Town at the 1960 Annual Town Meeting: total sum not to exceed \$11,000.00 and to authorize the Selectmen to borrow not to exceed \$4,000.00, this amount being the difference between the estimated total cost and the money in the hands of the Trustees of Trust Funds. This loan to be repaid in amounts of \$1,000.00 yearly, plus interest.

5. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for water holes.

7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell property acquired through Tax Collector's Deeds,

8. To see if the Town will vote to amend the rules governing the establishment of the Advisory Budget Committee as passed in the 1954 Town Meeting and changed in the 1962 Town Meeting and thereby eliminate the confusion and conflict which has ensued, by adopting the following:

That the Advisory Budget Committee be continued under the following conditions:

1. It shall consist of nine members. As the appointed members' terms expire, three shall be elected at each Town Meeting to serve a three year term, starting in 1963.
2. They shall meet with the Selectmen and with the School Board at least thirty days prior to the respective Annual Meetings to discuss and advise them with regards to the appropriate sums to be recommended to the voters for their action at the regular Town and School Meetings.
3. They shall have no authority with regards to appropriations and their recommendations shall be of an advisory nature only.
4. The Advisory Budget Committee shall serve for one dollar per year per member, and at no time shall their expenses exceed the sum total of fifty dollars per year, and the committee may only be dissolved by a majority of the registered voters at any regular town meeting, and at no time may be in conflict with any action passed by the town.
5. In case of need of counsel by the Board of Selectmen or the School Board, it shall be the duty of the A. B. C. to meet with either Board to consult and advise, upon said Board's request.
9. To see if the Town will vote to do away with the office of Overseer of the Poor, the Chairman of the Board of Selectmen to act in this capacity.
10. To see if the Town will vote to direct the Trustees of Trust Funds to liquidate all stocks and place all monies in sav-

ings bank accounts for each individual fund for which they are responsible.

11. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$500.00 from the Estate of Bertha Brown to be held "in trust however" the interest only to be used for the care of the two Brown Cemetery Lots.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust in Deerfield.

13. To see what action the Town will take to establish rental charges for the use of the Town Hall.

14. To see if the Town will vote to use the Class V Highway Maintenance Allotment on Mountain Avenue, starting at Junction with Nottingham Road and continuing toward Coffeetown.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$33.42 for membership in the New Hampshire Municipal Association.

16. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue, subject to gates and bars

a. Blakes Hill Road (State #51) from a point beginning on New State Highway (State #45) to Northwood Line.

b. Coffeetown (State #90) from Blakes Hill Road (State #51) to Ben Road (State #99).

c. Ben Road (State #99) from Coffeetown Road (State #90) to end of road.

d. Coffeetown Road (State #109) from Mountain Ave. (State #110) to house of Witham.

e. Mt. Avenue (State #109) from New State Road (State #45) to Coffeetown Road (State #109).

f. Road (State #68) from corner Ridge Road (State #68) and Road (State #71) to Leavitt's Hill Road at the junction of State #68 and Allenstown Road (State #53).

g. Road (State #96) beginning on Nottingham Road (No. 6 Road) State #52 and connecting with Pawtuckaway Road (State #85).

h. Road (State #95) beginning on Nottingham Road (No. 6 Road) State #52 and ending at junction with Pawtuckaway Road (State #85).

i. Road (State #94) beginning on Route 107 in the vicinity of home of Stewart to end at Hattie Brown Road (State #84).

j. Road (State #93) beginning on Route 107 adjacent to the Raymond Line.

k. Road (State #80) beginning on Route 107A in vicinity of Cotton Road (State #81) and ending at Raymond Line.

l. Mountain Avenue from Coffeetown Road (State #109) to entrance to Charles Copeland home.

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for signs for Town roads.

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$245.72 for membership in the Merrimack Valley Region Association.

19. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Polls to remain open until 7:00 P.M. unless otherwise voted by the meeting.

PREVENTING FOREST FIRES IS OUR RESPONSIBILITY

Costs of suppressing carelessly set outdoor fires in New Hampshire in 1962 cost the persons responsible \$5,545. In the same period, the cost to the cities and towns for control of such fires for which no responsibility could be placed cost another \$24,634. What utter waste of tax money and what shameful and needless loss of timber and esthetic values in the 2200 acres burned. Residences, farms, and other business places were threatened with possible total destruction.

Carelessly set man caused fires can be prevented if every citizen remembers his responsibility in regard to any source of fires in the open. We can help to keep our fire loss low by remembering these simple rules.

1. Dispose of burnable waste at the town dump.
2. If waste or brush is to be burned on the premises, obtain a permit from the forest fire warden. Seasonal permits may be issued for approved incinerators and sites.
3. Burn safely by picking a clean site, avoiding dry windy weather and preferably burning late in the day.
4. Have something to keep the fire under control — pails of water, garden hose, sprinkling can, broom for grass fires or shovel will help.
5. Be sure your fire is dead out before you leave it.
6. If the fire gets out of control or if you see a fire out of control, report promptly to your warden or fire department. Continue to fight it until help arrives.

There is potential danger when matches fall into the hands of children. It is never too early for parents to instill in the child's mind a respect for fire.

Keep our town safe from fire.

In 1962 we had 1 fire.

We burned 2 acres.

REPORT OF CIVIL DEFENSE

Deerfield, New Hampshire

1 Jan. 1963

1. All previous instructions as published in previous town reports remain in effect.

2. To date no — repeat no building in town has been approved as constructed properly to be considered as a shelter for public use — i.e., since no building is constructed of solid masonry of sufficient size to meet standards established by the federal government.

3. A central short wave radio station has been purchased which will operate in conjunction with our two “walkie talkies.” This central station will be set up in the town hall. This station can operate on either 110 or 12 volts and is portable if events require it. (Note. Channel 10 is a citizen’s band channel. Any citizen may purchase a set for their own use and can become a part of the system if they buy a channel 10 crystal.

4. Plans for the coming year, of course providing the town votes the money therefore, include fixing an operating room in the town hall where in the event of an emergency a control organization would make its headquarters. This room would also be used to store as much equipment already purchased as could conveniently be stored therein. This of course would not include the portable generator and the underground cable. It is planned to place this cable between the firehouse and the Town Hall so that both buildings would be assured electricity in the case of an emergency.

5. Additional volunteers for civil defense are always welcome.

6. It is to be noted that Civil Defense equipment procured through "matching" Federal funds cannot be used for other than Civil Defense functions. In the event that an emergency occurs where its use is required, be certain that your civil defense staff, the director or assistant director or deputy directors authorize its use. This rule of course is a sensible one since in many communities the equipment has been placed in use for other than emergency missions and has become worn out and therefore is not usable if an emergency does occur.

7. With the advent of the transfer of Civil Defense control in Washington, evacuation of towns and cities is no longer planned. This decision, while relieving the town of the responsibility to house and feed these evacuees, places a big problem on the town for the control of unorganized bands of stragglers who may invade the town during a crisis.
