REPORT OF THE ANNUAL TOWN MEETING DEERING, N. H., MARCH 11, 1947

A legal meeting of the inhabitants of Deering, N. H., was called to order at 10:45 in the forenoon by the Moderator, Carlton M. Sherwood. The warrant was read.

An explanation of the delay in receiving the town reports due to printing difficulties was made by Arthur O. Ellsworth. It was voted to act on Article 2 through 19 at once.

Article 1. Ballots were cast for all officers on the Australian ballot as follows:

Selectman for 2 years: Chester M. Durrell had 10 votes, Leroy H. Locke had 36 votes, Roscoe S. Putnam had 50 votes and took oath of office.

Selectman for 3 years: Chester M. Durrell had 2 votes, Arthur O. Ellsworth had 92 votes and took oath of office.

For Town Clerk: Mabel R. Wood had 3 votes, Marguerite L. Dutton had 87 votes and took oath of office.

For Town Treasurer: Mabel R. Wood had 3 votes, Marguerite L. Dutton had 87 votes and took oath of office.

For Overseer of Poor: Arthur O. Ellsworth had 91 votes and took oath of office.

For Tax Collector: Mabel R. Wood had 39 votes, Joseph Carew had 55 votes and took oath of office.

For Road Agent: Howard E. Whitney had 2 votes, Bernie Pierce had 38 votes, Winniatt K. Griffiths had 59 votes and took oath of office.

Auditors: Marjorie A. Holden had 86 votes and took oath of office. Eunice E. Willgeroth had 90 votes and took oath of office.

Library Trustee: Hazel Putnam had 29 votes, Charlotte Holmes had 58 votes and took oath of office.

Trustee of Trust Funds: Gladys Ellsworth had 91 votes and took oath of office.

Chief of Police: William J. Dumais had 60 votes and took oath of office.

Constable: Gordon Rich had 87 votes and took oath of office.

Surveyor of Wood and Lumber: Everett H. Abbot had 40 votes, Ernest Johnson had 48 votes and took oath of office.

Article 2. Upon motion made by Ernest Johnson it was voted to raise \$2,000 to defray town charges.

Article 3. Upon motion made by Ernest Johnson it was voted to raise \$3,000 for roads (\$2,000 for winter—\$1,000 for summer).

Article 4. Upon motion made by Arthur O. Ellsworth it was voted to raise \$300 for interest and insurance.

Article 5. Upon motion made by Ernest Johnson it was voted to raise \$250 for P.W.A. Bond.

Article 6. Upon motion made by Ernest Johnson it was voted to raise \$300 for street lights.

Article 7. Upon motion made by Arthur O. Ellsworth it was voted to raise \$300 for Blister Rust Control.

Article 8. Upon motion made by Marie Wells it was voted to raise \$40 for the Monadnock Region.

Article 9. Upon motion made by Arthur O. Ellsworth it was voted to raise \$900 for Old Age Assistance.

Article 10. After a motion made to raise \$2,200 for a truck it was voted in affirmative after a lengthy discussion.

Article 11. It was voted to authorize the selectmen to borrow money on short term notes in anticipation of taxes.

Article 12. It was voted to authorize selectmen to deliver inventory blanks when assessing.

Article 13. Upon motion made by Ernest Johnson it was voted to raise \$644 for T.R.A.

Article 14. It was voted to raise \$50 for Old Home Day.

Article 15. A motion was made by Jesse Griffen that selectmen be authorized to ask for bids. An amendment to this was made by Rev. Charles Reidt that selectmen be em-

powered to take action in regard to securing water for town hall and to use an amount not exceeding \$1,000. It was voted on favorably.

Article 16. Upon motion made by Arthur O. Ellsworth it was voted that town labor be paid 80c an hour with the exception of the road agent who is to receive \$1.00. Upon motion made by Ernest Johnson it was voted to pay the moderator \$10 as salary—this amount to include traveling expenses.

Upon motion made by Arthur O. Ellsworth it was voted to pay the tax collector a yearly salary of \$175.

Upon motion made by Arthur O. Ellsworth it was voted that the town clerk and treasurer receive \$175 exclusive of fees.

Article 17. A motion was made by Hobart Kiblin that a committee of two be appointed to serve with selectmen while re-assessing property. It was not a vote.

Upon motion made by Chester McNally it was voted that selectmen use their best judgement in assessing property; so that the town's tax rate will compare favorably with that of surrounding towns and make it lower.

There was a favorable vote to an amendment made by W. K. Griffiths that the selectmen may employ assistance in assessing timber.

Article 18. Upon motion made by Marie Wells it was voted to accept report of trustees, to let trustees pay for repairs to cemetery and to discuss the article.

Article 19. A suggestion made by Joseph Carew that the selectmen erect a sign in the Square at Hillsboro indicating the direction of Deering Center.

It was voted to accept resolution read by Rev. Charles Reidt in regard to improving the Deering-Weare Road.

It was also voted to accept suggestion made by Arthur O. Ellsworth that copies of resolution be sent to the Governor and his Council, the Tax Commission and the Town Clerk.

Upon motion made by Stewart Cooper it was voted to increase the amount of insurance on the town buildings.

It was voted to adjourn without date.

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Deering, in the County of Hillsborough, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Deering, on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next, at 10 of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$300 for street lights.
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$300 for Blister Rust Control or pass any vote relating thereto.
8. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$48 for the Monadnock Region Association.

9. To see if the Town will vote to sell or trade the Mack Truck and purchase a small tractor.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$1,000 for Old Age Assistance and Town Poor.

11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to deliver inventory blanks to residents when assessing.

12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money on short term notes in anticipation of taxes.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$650 for T.R.A. money.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$50 towards expenses of Old Home Day.

15. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.



GENERAL REPORT

With great pleasure at thoughts of the fine cooperation in Deering during the past two years, I herewith submit my third annual report.

It has been well said that only through thoughtful, organized, intelligent, and continuous discussion by the community can the purposes of a school or educational program be kept alive and vital. Usually when purposes are weak or wrong, it is because they have not been weighed and measured in the light of modern needs. They may be merely the result of accident or tradition rather than of careful thought. However, the determination of purpose is of no avail as they live in the minds of people and affect people's thoughts and actions, so that these purposes have meaning.

It is by no accident that Deering has a much more suitable method of school transportation. Your School Board spent many extra hours of work in getting the program working after your enthusiastic demands for something better at the last annual meeting. The two buses are doing a remarkable job at considerable saving to the district. It would be a great untruth, however, to say that the road conditions in Deering are acceptable. They are a hindrance to all desirable economic development of the town. Anyone interested in the future of Deering can easily foresee the drastic necessity for an immediate over-all road program. This of course would help our problem of transportation.

The East Deering school is being operated at about capacity. Miss Milliken is doing a commendable job under very adverse physical conditions. She has had wonderful cooperation from everyone-but the heating and plumbing

facilities belong in another era long since gone by. Not being able to find any excuse for such intolerable conditions, we have found it necessary to install a well, and new heating arrangements and are in the process of getting new plumbing installed. Parents have every right in objecting to such conditions. We anticipate better health among pupils when the corrections are made.

Carrying out orders of the special meeting of August 1946, we have completed the sale of the Pond School House and also the North School House. It now appears that the District owns the Library building and carries insurance on it. Since the building should never again be used for school, we have asked that it be given to the Library Association so that they will be responsible for it.

Investigation of the insurance program has caused us to revise that, so that we now have, \$5000 fire insurance on the East Deering schoolhouse and \$1,500 on its contents. Also \$2,000 on the West Deering schoolhouse. The new program has been written so that the payments will be the same each year.

Most important increase in the proposed budget is that for tuitions for pupils who must attend other schools. We estimate that high school tuitions may run at least to \$150 for next year and elementary to \$100. These are heavy increases but the change is universal.

There is a movement afoot to form a cooperative secondary school board some where in this area and your warrant provides you any opportunity to participate. Since Deering has long felt a need for a part in the administration of a high school attended by its boys and girls, we feel that there is everything to be gained by participating.

In conclusion, I wish to thank the voters of Deering who have provided such progressive educational leadership to the community in the personnel of the School Board. They have been most helpful in anticipating the needs of pupils and parents in the educational program.
