TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Gilsum in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Gilsum on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March, next at 7:30 of the clock in the evening to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To receive the report of the Budget Committee and act in any manner relating thereto.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 5. To see if the town will appoint a committee to take charge of the observance of Memorial Day.
- 6. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to sell any or all pieces of real estate, either by auction or private sale, now acquired by Tax Deed.
- 7. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 as its fair share of the operating cost of the Elliot Community Hospital.
- 8. To see if the town will vote to appropriate a sum not exceeding \$4,800.00 for the purpose of adopting the terms of the Town Road Aid Accelerated Program, such sum to be raised through the issuance of notes under and in compliance with the provisions of Chapter 241, New Hampshire R. S. A. Annotated, 1955, as amended by laws of 1957, Chapter 273:3, and to authorize the Selectmen to

determine the date and place of payment of such notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other steps as may be necessary to negotiate such notes as shall be to the best interest of the Town of Gilsum.

- 9. To see if the town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$1200.00 for the purchase of a Snow Plow as recommended by a committee appointed at the last Town Meeting, and to authorize the Selectmen to borrow the sum of \$1,200.00 through the issuance of notes, for the purchase of same.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,000.00 to purchase the Legion Building, so called, from the Gilsum Veterans Association, and authorize the Selectmen to borrow \$1,000.00 by issuing notes for the purchase of said property.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$500.00 either by appropriation or by issuing notes, with which to buy the Whitten Property, so called, from Forest L. Carey.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to establish a committee of five, to be elected for one year, for the purpose of developing constructive forestry work in cooperation with the County Forester on the Carpenter Lot without expense to the Town.
- 13. To transact any other business which may regularly come before it.

TRUSTEES' REPORT OF GILSUM PUBLIC LIBRARY

During the past two years many new reference books for children and young adults have been purchased. The interior of the Library has been painted, books and shelves cleaned, and new, more efficient lighting has been installed. As a result, we find that grammar and high school pupils have been using the Library more for study and research.

Excellent publicity of Gilsum's participation in National Library Week in April appeared in issues of "Yankee" and "North Country Libraries". The gifts of portable bookcases from the Grange, an Atlas from PTA, "The Complete Works of Robert Frost" from the American Legion Auxiliary, and the National Legion Magazine from the American Legion were presented at an "open house" during National Library Week. The Ladies' Aid held a food sale for the National Geographic Binding Fund, and members of the Home Demonstration Group spent time covering book jackets of some of the new books.

The Trustees voted to organize a group to be known as "Friends of The Library" to stimulate public support and interest in the Library. Art exhibits have been displayed in the Library using materials from the Metroplitan Seminars in Art. Action was taken in December 1960 to sponsor a discussion group in Gilsum in connection with the National Group on "Great Decisions 1961." Plans are now being made to show educational films for children and adults once a month.

The Library has been represented at two meetings of the N.H. Association of Library Trustees in Concord.

We would like to thank all individuals and groups for their help in our work.

SCHOOL WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the school district of the Town of Gilsum qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the 13th day of March, 1961 at 7:30 in the evening to vote upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a moderator for the ensuing year.
- 2. To choose a clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a member of the school board for the ensuing three years.
 - 4. To choose a treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the school board and truant officer and fix the compensation of any other officers or agents in the district.
- 6. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees and officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose agents, auditors, and committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 8. To see what sum of money the district will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

- 9. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to make application for and to accept, on behalf of the district, any or all grants or other funds for educational purposes which may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the United States Government or from the State of New Hampshire.
- 10. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of seven hundred dollars (\$700.00) for the purpose of engaging the services of the firm of educational consultants, Engelhardt, Engelhardt and Leggett to make a complete study of the Gilsum School System.
- 11. To see if the School District will vote to authorize the School Board to negotiate a tuition contract with the Keene School District.
- 12. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

REPORT OF SCHOOL NURSE

The following is my report for the year ending June 30, 1960.

- 118 pupils had vision tests given by the school nurse
 - 5 pupils received vision notices
 - 68 pupils had hearing tests given by the school nurse
- 132 pupils were weighed and measured
- 118 pupils were given inspections by the school nurse
 - 77 pupils were found in need of dental care
- 123 pupils attended polio clinics
 - 12 pupils attended Pre-registration Clinic
 - 15 pupils were checked and necessary follow-up done for smallpox vaccination
- 118 pupils were instructed in dental education

Within our school health program we attempt to attain health improvement of each individual within the group. No two children are exactly alike, each child has distinctive characteristics and special needs. Today we have better understanding of nutrition, new methods of instruction, materials for instruction are more plentiful, interest in mental health has a deserved prominence, school environment is improving, in most areas, and with continued cooperation and interest child's total development will benefit from the school health program.

I wish to take this opportunity to thank you all for cooperation with the school nurse, Mrs. Damon, during my leave of absence.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Gilsum:

I herewith submit my annual report as your Superintendent of Schools:

Gilsum's elementary per pupil instructional cost for 1959-60 was \$212.94 which is an increase of \$25.27; however, Gilsum's cost of instruction is \$53.00 less than the state average.

The principal area of increase this year is teacher salaries. It shows an increase of \$1,225.00 which is a considerable increase for one year. Part of this increase occurred this year as an additional \$450.00 was used for salaries to enable us to hold our present teaching staff.

Gilsum teachers plan to take part in a Supervisory Union workshop to be held August 30, 31 and September 1st at the Walpole High School. It is planned to study methods of improving teaching techniques in Science, Arithmetic and Reading with the help of outstanding consultants in each field.

The workshop is in addition to the 180-day school year for pupils as is the day allowed in the schedule for the annual teacher convention in October.

The guide book of school regulations mentioned in last year's report has been completed and adopted by the School Board. Each teacher and School Board member has a reference copy.

A closet formerly used to store janitor supplies has been arranged with shelves and now serves as a library and central storage for reference materials. We have been able to purchase more reference books and teaching aids, such as the mobile demonstration laboratory table, with the matching funds received under the provisions of the National Defense Education Act. These materials make it possible for the teachers to do a better job in the fields of Science and Mathematics.

Mr. Davis and Mrs. Jernberg have departmentalized their teaching in English and Science. This allows each teacher to teach in the area of their major preparation.

During the 1959-60 school year there were several joint meetings of the school boards of Alstead, Acworth, Marlow, Langdon, Walpole and Westmoreland for the purpose of discussing the possibilities of forming a cooperative district. This year the school boards of Gilsum and Surry have also attended the meetings.

Interest last year was directed toward the formation of a grade 7-12 cooperative. However, information presented by Superintendent Keach and Mr. Russell, from the State Department of Education, indicated that a grade 1-12 cooperative would be more beneficial than the 7-12 cooperative.

Considerably more study is needed to gather factual material that is needed by the school boards of each community in order that they may have information to aid them in making their recommendations and also to aid the citizens of each district in their decision as to what is the best educational pattern to follow.

Each board is planning to include an article in the school district warrant that gives the opportunity for the district to decide whether or not to take part in an educational survey.

An educational survey will cover every major aspect of the school situation in each town including an analysis of existing facilities, forecasts of future enrollments, study of the educational needs, suggested curriculum offerings, a review of the advantages of establishing a cooperative school district, and an analysis of the financial problems and tax implications of a cooperative system versus continuing as a separate unit.

Three of the school districts mentioned above send their high school pupils to Keene as tuition pupils. It would appear that these communities should have available alternate plans in the event that Keene decides to discontinue their present policy of taking tuition pupils from surrounding communities.

I strongly recommend that each district vote to take part in this educational survey. A district may decide not to follow the recommendations, however, the decision can be made on the basis of factual information.

Miss Marjorie Shay replaced Mrs. Shirley Houle on February 1st, 1960. Mrs. Houle returned this year as teacher of grades three and four.

A decrease in the estimated State Aid and an increase in the estimated balance resulted in a final figure of \$21,-301.38 to be raised by taxation for the school year 1960-61. This is \$135.98 less than the amount estimated at the time the budget was voted.

YOU, whether YOU be a farmer, homemaker, business or professional man or woman, municipal, state or federal official, clerk or woodsman can play an important part in the continuing and vital prevention program.

First — by setting a good example YOURSELF — being sensible and complying with the necessary laws and regulations governing the use of fire in and near woodlands.

Second — by using YOUR individual influence in your community and valued council with others in insisting and encouraging them to do likewise.

The following simple rules may be used as a guide both for YOU and for them.

- Before burning, secure a permit from your local forest fire warden — the law requires it.
- 2. Be sure to properly supervise your burning don't leave it.
- Make certain your fire, camp or debris, is DEAD OUT before leaving it.
- Don't throw down lighted matches, cigars and cigarettes or from moving vehicles — make sure they are out — Use your ash tray.
- Don't burn at home use your town dump and save yourself much possible difficulty, both personal and financial.
