13. To raise such sums as are necessary for Winter Roads.
14. To raise sums necessary for General Expense of the Highway Department.
15. To see if the Town will raise a designated sum for T.R.A.
16. To see what sum the Town will raise for the Library.
17. To raise such sums as are necessary for Town Poor.
18. To raise such sums as are necessary for Old Age Assistance.
19. To see what sum the Town will raise for Observance of Memorial Day.

20. To raise such sums as are necessary for Cemeteries.
21. To raise such sums as may be necessary for White Pine Blister Rust.
22. To raise such sums as may be necessary for Damages and Legal Expenses.
23. To see what sum the Town will raise for Advertising and Regional Assn.
24. To raise such sums as are necessary to defray Interest charges.
25. To see what sum the Town will raise for support of Hospitals.
26. To raise such sums as may be necessary for County Tax.
27. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$500.00 to be placed in a capital reserve fund for the purchase of Highway Equipment.
28. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to sell Town Property.
29. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
30. To take up any other business that may legally come before this meeting.
31. To see what action the Town will take regarding the use of Town funds for opening graves for residents of the Town.

FOREST FIRE WARDEN'S REPORT

Preventing Forest Fires Is Our Responsibility

Costs of suppressing carelessly set outdoor fires in New Hampshire in 1962 cost the persons responsible \$5,545. In the same period, the cost to the cities and towns for control of such fires for which no responsibility could be placed cost another \$24,634. What utter waste of tax money and what shameful and needless loss of timber and esthetic values in the 2200 acres burned. Residences, farms, and other business places were threatened with possible total destruction.

Carelessly set man caused fires can be prevented if every citizen remembers his responsibility in regard to any source of fires in the open. We can help to keep our fire loss low by remembering these simple rules.

1. Dispose of burnable waste at the town dump.
2. If waste or brush is to be burned on the premises, obtain a permit from the forest fire warden. Seasonal permits may be issued for approved incinerators and sites.
3. Burn safely by picking a clean site, avoiding dry windy weather and preferably burning late in the day.
4. Have something to keep the fire under control — pails of water, garden hose, sprinkling can, broom for grass fires or shovel will help.
5. Be sure your fire is dead out before you leave it.
6. If the fire gets out of control or if you see a fire out of control, report promptly to your warden or fire department. Continue to fight it until help arrives.

There is potential danger when matches fall into the hands of children. It is never too early for parents to instill in the child's mind a respect for fire.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Goshen-Lempster Cooperative School in Lempster on the twenty-third day of March, 1963, at 12:00 Noon, to act upon Articles 1 and 2; the meeting to be recessed and opened again at two o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the remaining articles in the Warrant (Articles 3 through 9):

1. To choose a Moderator for the ensuing year.
2. To choose three members of the School Board;
 - a. One for five year - Goshen
 - b. One for one year - Goshen
 - c. One for three months - Lempster
3. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subjects embraced in this warrant.
4. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
5. To determine and approve the salaries of the School Board and fix the compensation of any other officers or agents of the district.
6. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization and building funds, together with other income; the School Board to certify to the Selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.
7. To see if the district will authorize the School Board to appropriate receipts from federal lunch reimbursements, tuition, gifts and other receipts from miscellaneous sources, in addition to the original appropriation for 1963-1964, for the school lunch program, general expenses, equipment and improvements.
8. To see if the district will authorize the School Board to make application for and to receive, in the name of the district, such advances, grants-in-aid or other funds for educational purposes as may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the U. S. Government and/or state agencies.
9. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

GOSHEN-LEMPSTER SCHOOL DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of the Goshen-Lempster Cooperative School District, I herewith submit my Annual Report as Superintendent of Schools:

TEACHING STAFF

Mr. John Nettle, Principal of the School, resigned at the close of school last June. He felt that his church responsibilities, and the long distance to travel from Keene, was too great an assignment.

Mr. George Miller was appointed Principal to succeed Mr. Nettle. He graduated from the Maine Maritime Academy and also has a degree from Rutgers University.

Mrs. Hester Morrissey, Mrs. Doris Newman, and Mrs. Myrtle Starkey, teachers of former years, returned to assume their regular assignments as instructors in the lower grades.

CAFETERIA

Mrs. Roy Balla has again been in charge of the school cafeteria. The quality of the food, and the organization of the lunch period ranks high among the Hot Lunch Programs in Union #5. We consider this added service of great benefit to the children. Mrs. Balla should be commended on her good work and the interest she has shown in our school.

All children, who have wished to do so, have had an opportunity to take advantage of this service. Monthly shipments of Government Surplus Foods have helped finance the lunch program, and enabled us to serve meals at a minimum cost to the child.

MAINTENANCE

Mr. Wesley Witham continued this year as janitor of the Cooperative School. His work has been most satisfactory and our teachers, as well as the Superintendent, have been pleased with the condition and up-keep of the building.

During the summer vacation, the entire building was cleaned and the floors waxed. This work is considered a part of our annual maintenance program.

The exterior of the building was painted a second coat, the first coat having been applied last year. This should preserve the outside for several years to come.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Your superintendent would like to make the following suggestions for the consideration of the School Board:

1. That some provision be made to landscape the building and beautify the premises. This could be a joint affair in which pupils might participate as an educational project.

2. That an electric water cooler be installed in the cafeteria room, to replace the present fixture which is neither adequate nor satisfactory.

3. That teachers be granted ten days sick leave with pay, two days to be permitted for personal business, and the leave by accumulative for two years.

SCHOOL ENROLLMENT 1963-64

It is expected that we will have a First Grade Entering Class of nine pupils in September, 1963. Of this number three will be from the Town of Goshen and six from the Town of Lempster.

SCHOOL SURVEY

The Superintendent's Office has completed a school survey of all towns in Union #5, to determine the projected school population for the next four years. The results of this survey would indicate that no appreciable change in our enrollment should be expected within the period 1963-1967. Below is the table showing the grade distribution beginning September, 1963:

This year has seen an improvement in playground activity with various kinds of organized games. We are pleased to have the new swings, and the basketball standard was also a welcome addition.

At this time I would like to comment on the fine teaching being done by Mrs. Newman, Mrs. Starkey, and Mrs. Morrissey. Their work enables us to maintain our academic standards. They have been most professional, cooperative, and helpful; and I have found my administrative duties very enjoyable.

The morale of teachers and students seems to be high. It is hoped that a degree of school spirit is being developed.

In order to aid in the transition from elementary to high school, an orientation trip is being planned. This will acquaint the eighth grade with what they will encounter next year.

SCHOOL NURSE'S REPORT

In submitting my tenth annual report to the citizens of Goshen and Lempster I would like to summarize a portion of the work carried out in the school health program during the 1961-62 school year.

One hundred nineteen vision tests were done. Thirteen defects were found and reported. Of this number twelve children were seen and examined by an eye specialist.

One hundred eleven hearing tests were done. Two hearing losses were found and these children were examined by a hearing specialist. In one case a tonsillectomy resulted in improved hearing.

One hundred eleven children were weighed, measured and checked for noticeable defects.

Dental Health continues to present its problems but not as acutely as in years past. In the spring of 1954 dental clinics sponsored by the Parents' Clubs of Goshen and Lempster were started. These clinics have continued yearly. There has been marked improvement in the dental health of our school children. These clinics are carried out with the assistance of the N. H. State Department of Health in a Matching Fund Program. Dr. Houlihan of Claremont does the work of this clinic. We appreciate the fine work he does as well as his genuine interest in the children. The children, for the most part, look forward to "going to the dentist."

A Tuberculin Patch Testing Program is carried out yearly with the assistance of the N. H. Tuberculosis Association and the N. H. State Department of Health. Seventy-four children in grades one, three, five, seven and eight were tested. All findings were negative. No chest X-rays were indicated.

Immunization Clinics were held during the year. Seventy-eight school children received booster inoculations of Salk Vaccine as well as 18 pre-school children and 11 adults. Nine school children in grades one and two received Diphtheria-Tetanus Toxoid. Five pre-school children received Triple Toxoid and five pre-school children were vaccinated against Small-Pox.

In September, 1962, Sabin Vaccine (Oral Polio Vaccine) was made available to school children, pre-school children and adults. The Sullivan County Medical Association made this possible. A small donation was requested from persons receiving this Vaccine. No one was denied the Vaccine for lack of a donation. Type I Vaccine was given in September, Type III in October and Type II in November. Eighty-one school children completed the series despite the untimely publicity. I sincerely hope that when the Vaccine is available again we will be able to complete all of the school children.

I would like to take this opportunity to express my appreciation for your continued interest in the health of our school children and in the programs which are carried out.
