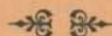

Warrant For Town Meeting

TOWN OF HART'S LOCATION

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Hart's Location in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Willey House Post Office in said Hart's Location on Tuesday, the 11th day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of same.
3. To authorize the Selectmen to borrow sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of same.
4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of 16,61 (amount being seven cents per thousand dollars of equalized valuation) for the White Mountain Region Association.
5. To see if the town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Municipal Accounting Division and make appropriation to cover the expense of same.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise Town Road Aid, \$20.90 to be used with State Highway Department quota of \$139.35 for all town roads, and make appropriation of same.

7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for all town roads.

8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$200.00 for fire expenses.

9. To see if the Town will join the Municipal Association.

10. To see what the Town will do regarding the disposal of rubbish in an approved manner.

11. To see if the town will assume payment for part of the minimum monthly guarantee that is not covered by the individual signers, for the extension of the power line to Hart's Location, and to raise and appropriate money for same.

12. To see what the town will vote to raise for ambulance service.

13. To act upon any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

School Report

Hart's Location is an unorganized school district. The Tax Commission is responsible for collecting the school tax. It annually assesses against the real and personal estate of the property holders in Hart's Location. The amount assessed equals the sum certified by the Dept. of Education. The Town has voted previous years to assume responsibility for the tax. However, it was voted in 1967 not to do so. There were no tax bills sent out by the State Tax Commission for 1968 as they had enough revenue to take care of same.
