

# THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hebron in the county of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Hebron Chapel in said Hebron on Tuesday, the ninth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the followig subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for town highways and bridges.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to accept Class V Highway Aid and raise and appropriate \$146.76 for the same.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$60.00 for Lakes Region Association for issuance of printed matter, publicity, etc.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$29.00 for the Newfound Region Association for publicity and other activities.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$400.00 for Blister Rust Control.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to continue the Lake Shore Memorial Park Committee for three years and raise and appropriate \$1,000 for each of the next three years for the Memorial Park Capital Reserve Fund.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1200. for the purchase of the A. E. Moore property or appropriate \$1,200. from Fire Insurance Fund, for same.

- 10. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$75.00 for purchase of snow fence.
- 11. To see what action the Town will take in regard to the \$1200. reserved for bridges on the George Road.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum to compensate Warren Harvey for increased and unusual expenses plowing snow for the season 1947-'48.
- 13. To see what action the Town will take in regard to removing bandstand from the Common and raise and make an appropriation for same.
- 14. To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate to continue the improvement of the Common.
- 15. To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for the maintenance of cemeteries.
- 16. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.


