

You are hereby notified to meet at Cogswell High School Auditorium in said Henniker on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March, next at one of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Town meeting will be recessed for School meeting.

Polls open at 1:00 p. m. and close at 9:00 p. m.

The articles in the Warrant will be taken up at 8:00 p. m.

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

2. To hear and act upon the reports of Town[•] Officers, Library Trustees, Trustees of Trust Funds, and other Committees.

3. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year.

4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repair of highways and bridges, repair or purchase of machinery. 5. To see what action the Town will take in regard to the Public Health, and raise money for the same.

6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise or appropriate to defray the expense of observing Memorial day.

7. To see what sum of money the Town will raise or appropriate for the support of the Tucker Free Library.

8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Fire Department.

9. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for maintaining hydrant service for the ensuing year.

10. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for street lighting for the ensuing year.

11. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to prevent the spread of white pine blister.

13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for State Aid Construction of Class V Roads. 14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Merrimack Valley Region Association.

15. To see what action the Town will take relative to maintaining a Town Dump, raise money for same, or take other action relative thereto.

16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote raise and appropriate for Old Age Assistance.

17. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Concord Hospital.

18. To see if the Town will vote to limit the Selectmens tenure of office to two (2) consecutive terms or take any action relative thereto.

19. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for grading and surfacing Fairview Avenue.

20. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for street signs.

21. To see what action the Town will take in regard to re-assessment of taxable property, and raise and appropriate money for the same.

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22. To see if the Town will vote to accept "Hope Road", or take any action relative thereto.

23. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to sell the Box Shop gravel bank.

24. To see if the Town will vote to employ a full time Police Officer and raise and appropriate money for the same.

25. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purchase of a new Truck.

26. To see if the Town will vote to raise the salary of the Judge of Municipal Court \$100.00, from \$250.00 to \$350.00

27. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for paint and material for the Town Hall.

28. To see what action the Town will take in regard to procuring a parking lot, raise and appropriate money for same. 29. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Town Planning Board of 5 or 7 members in accordance with provisions of Chap. 36, Sections 1 - 15, N. H. R. S. A.; said board to consider present needs and orderly development of the Town, prepare such zoning or other regulations as may appear necessary in the manner prescribed by law, and submit its recommendations (if any) to subsequent Town Meetings.

ANNUAL MEETING 1957

Article 2. Voted, that the Reports of Town Officers, Library Trustees, Trustees of Trust Funds, and other Committees be accepted as printed in the Town Report.

Article 3. Voted, that Town Officers salaries for the ensuing year be fixed at the following rates: Selectmen \$ 8.00 per day. Supervisors of Checklist 6.00 per day Ballot Clerks -Moderator 15.00 per day Town Clerk 100.00 per year Town Treasurer 300.00 per year Tax Collector 1% of taxes collected

- Article 4. Voted, that we raise and appropriate the sum of \$20,000.00 for repair of highways and bridges and the purchase of machinery.
- Article 5. Voted, that we raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,100.00 for the District Nurse, to be paid at the rate of \$2,800.00 for services, and \$300.00 for the use of ear for the eensuing year.
- Article 6. Voted, that we raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to defray the expense of observing Memorial Day.
- Article 7. Voted, that we raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the support of Tucker Free Library for the ensuing year.
- Article 8. Voted, that we raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for the maintenance of the Fire Department.

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- Article 9. Voted, that we raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for maintaining hydrant service for the ensuing year.
- Article 10. Voted, that we raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,800.00 for street lighting for the ensuing year.
- Article 11. Voted, that the Selectmen are authorized to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- Article 13. Voted, that we raise and appropriate the sum of \$955.73 for State Aid Construction of Class 5 Roads for the ensuing year.
- Article 15. Voted, that we raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for maintenance of Town Dump for the ensuing year.
- Article 16. Voted, that we raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 for Old Age Assistance.
- Article 18. Voted, that this Article be transferred to the School Warrant.
- Article 21. Voted, by a two-thirds vote, that we take the sum of \$100.00 for Street and Road signs in the Town from the unexpended balance of \$250.00 raised and appropriated in 1956 for the removal or relocation of Proctor Memorial Fountain.
- Article 23. Voted, that we raise and appropriate the sum of \$997.00 for the support of Concord Hospital.

- Article 24. Voted, that future major meetings of the Budget Committee be declared open to the public and that adequate notice of such meetings be given and publicised.
- Article 24. Voted, that in the annual meeting in 1958 the articles of the Town Warrant be taken up in the evening, the time to be determined by the Selectmen.

SCHOOL WARRANT

The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the School District in the town of Henniker qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Cogswell School Auditorium in said district on the 11th. day of March 1958, at 2:00 o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary School Officers for the ensuing year.

Polls open at 1:00 P. M. and close at 9:00 P. M.

2. To hear reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees or Officers chosen and take action relating thereto.

3. To choose Agents, Auditors, and Committees in relation to any subject in this warrant.

4. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officers and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income: the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

5. To see if the district will vote to adopt a plan for extending to employees of the town the benefits of title 11 of the Federal Social Security Act (Old Age and Survivor's Insurance) as authorized by Chapter 101 of the Revised Statutes Annotated Amended by Chapter 301 and 332 of the Laws of 1955. 6. To see if the district wishes to exclude from the plan services in any class or classes of positions filled by popular election.

7. To see if the district wishes to exclude from the plan services in any class or classes of positions the compensation for which is on a fee basis.

8. If a plan for Social Security coverage is adopted, to see if the town will authorize the selectmen to execute on behalf of the town the necessary agreement with the State of New Hampshire to carry into effect the plan and to see if the town will designate the School Treasurer as the officer to be responsible for the administration of the plan.

9. To see if the school district will vote to hereafter use a check-list for the election of its officers, beginning with the 1959 annual district meeting, and will adopt as its school check-list the Town check-list, as provided in RSA 197:12a, as inserted by Laws of 1957, Chapter 57.

10. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT

OF SCHOOLS

There have been several changes in the high school teaching staff this year. Mr. Dwight Baker was appointed Principal. Mr. Louis Kasairas is the new English and Social Studies teacher; Mr. Donald Brennan is the new shop teacher; and Mrs. Amy Simpson is the new homemaking teacher. In the Elementary school Mrs. Louise Faulkner is the new fourth grade teacher. The first semester we have had Edna Baldvin as a cadet teacher in English and French. The second semester Mr. Donald Simpson will be cadet teaching in Mathematics and Science.

On November 4, 1957, a committee from the State Department of Education visited Henniker High School. The purpose of the visit was two fold: to classify what action, if any, was necessary to qualify Henniker High as an Approved School under the Minimum Standards which will go into affect September 1, 1958; the second purpose was to identify aspects of the school plant and program which are in need of attention if we are to offer a comprehensive high-school program in Henniker. The following is a digest of the resulting report.

Action Necessary Under Minimum Standards

1. At least 12 units in practical arts subjects must be offered. Henniker now offers eight, including four each in homemaking and general shop. It is expected that the additional units would be offered in the business field. This would mean an additional teacher in the high school.

2. Three regularly scheduled offerings in the Fine Arts Area must be provided. Henniker now has only two opportunities, including one in Band and one in Chorus. This can be corrected by one more offering in music or one in art.

- 3. All courses must meet the time allotment requirement. There can be re-arrangements made on next years schedule, with an adjustment in the length of the school day and noon recess.
- 4. No teacher shall be assigned a teaching schedule which requires more than five academic preparations a day. Only one of our teachers is affected by this requirement. This can be corrected on next years program.

Action Sharply Recommended

1. The program of studies should be rearranged with particular attention paid to the following areas.

- a. At least one language should be offered for three years. Experience on the college level supports these recommendations very sharply. At the present time we are offering two years of French and two years of Latin.
- b. Band should be scheduled for more than one period. Mr. Desrochers has done a fine job with band but is hampered by the limited amount of practice time.
- c. Electricity should be added to the general shop program. Plans were made by Mr. Kontinos to add electricity, and Mr. Brennan will teach some electricity this year.
- d. A physical education program should be instituted for all high school students at least twice a week and the Junior high classes which meet only once a week should meet twice a week. This would mean a teacher would have to spend half his time teaching physical education.
- 2. Every effort should continue to be made to determine how existing space can be efficiently used. Considerable attention to this problem has been given by the board as evidenced by the improvement in shop space and the homemaking rooms. They are also considering a folding partition in the large upstairs classroom, to make an extra classroom. One of our problems is the fact that our classrooms in the high school building are small in comparison to a typical high school classroom

and some of our classes in the elementary school are quite large, thus we are going to have some difficulties unless our enrollment trend changes.

- 3. The library is inadequate both as a materials center for the instructional program and as a teaching aid. The annual budget should appropriate not less than \$300.00 for library materials. We have recognized this as a weakness and have been attempting to gradually build up our library resources.
- 4. Every effort should be made to provide a well rounded activity program. This means assembly programs, dramatics, student council, school paper, science clubs, etc. We are hoping to schedule an activity period next year to solve this problem.

The schools have been caught in the inflation which has been taking place nationally over the past ten years. Costs continue to mount. Competition for new teachers continues to be great and indications are that the beginning teachers will be asking and getting \$200-\$500 more than they did last spring. With both Maine and Vermont improving their salaries we will not be attracting teachers from those states as we have in the past, so we will have to depend on our source of supply in New Hampshire. If it were not for our married teachers coming back into service we would be in a hopeless situation.

It is unfortunate that with increased demands on education made by the state in the Minimum Standards and by the nation during the present crisis, the schools are expected to carry on with an antiquated tax base. The real estate tax requires the property owner to carry the major burden of supporting the community, with no relation whatsoever to ability to pay taxes.

I wish to express my thanks for the fine cooperation I have received from the parents, teachers, and school board. I have enjoyed working with your children.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

To the Superintendent of Schools, members of the School Board, and the citizens of Henniker.

I am happy to submit my first annual report to the above named persons.

Our enrollment is about the same as last year, because of transfers and drop outs.

We graduated 14 students in June, most of whom went on to higher education. Seven enrolled at Universities and Colleges, two went to Air-Line Hostess School, one went to Commercial School, two entered the Armed Service, one is working in the Artesian Well business and one is anticipating the General Electric Apprenticeship Program. This is a record that speaks well for the students of Henniker.

The year has not passed without incident. Due to two most unfortunate accidents, Mr. Donald Brennan has been incapacitated for a rather lengthy period of time. This situation required us to obtain temporary replacements, and we were fortunate to have Mr. George Lambert and Mr. Louis O'Mara. It is most helpful to have teachers return who have been in the school system. Mrs. Evelyn Woollett returned to handle the English Department. Mr. Eugene Lord is once again with us to direct the Math-Science program, and Mr. Dean DesRoches occupies the same position this year as Social Studies instructor and Music director. We also have had two able practice teachers, Miss Edna Baldvin and Mr. Donald Simpson, whom I know have been a great help to Mrs. Woollett and Mr. Lord. Mr. Simpson has also handled the coaching duties. A rather noticeable change took place by the complete re-decorating of the Home Economics room.' It is now a most productive and pleasant place to work. Less noticeable changes have occurred as follows: Latin has been added to the curriculum, more individual guidance has been attempted, our library has a new set of encyclopedias, and our time schedule has been altered slightly.

The future offers still further changes. Most Significant is the offering of Commercial subjects to those interested. Others are the reduction of teacher load, addition of an Art course, minor changes in the program and time schedule, increased planning for group guidance, and continued improvement of our library. I know the parents and people of Henniker are interested in continued improvement of their school. The above changes are steps in that direction.

In closing, I wish to thank the persons responsible for making Henniker High School a functional and productive secondary institution. You should be proud of the graduates who are so ably making their way in a difficult and complex society. Let's look toward further interest and co-operation between school and community, for without this no education system can survive.


