TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hill in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Hill on Tuesday, the 11th day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To authorize and empower the board of selectmen to borrow for the Town by the issue of notes a sum not exceeding \$15,000.00 in anticipation of taxes for the year 1952, said notes to be expressly payable from taxes within one year from the date of their issuance; and to authorize the board of selectmen to determine the rate of interest on such notes and to provide for the sale thereof.
4. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Hill:

I herewith submit my second annual report as your Superintendent of Schools:

Each year brings with it many problems which the schools must face. This one is no different. We see many instances of decline in political morality, scandals in athletics, attacks on school systems, and growing antagonism to rising taxes.

Your school is facing up these problems by teaching the children the right ways of living in this democratic life which we enjoy. They are receiving the fundamental training which will enable them to successfully enjoy this life. In order that the teachers would be able to combat some of these problems a two day workshop was held in Franklin prior to the opening of school. The meeting was devoted to the "Teaching of Moral and Spiritual Values in the Public School." Your teachers participated and gained much from these valuable two days.

Hill is a most fortunate community to be able to have in its school the two fine teachers. Mrs. Ruth Rounds is giving an excellent start to the pupils in the lower grades while Mrs. Elsie Fowler continues this in the upper grades. The pupils are profiting daily from their instruction.

In looking at the possible enrollment for the coming school year I am convinced that considerable saving can be made to the District if we continue to educate our eighth grade pupils in the Jennie D. Blake School. The School Board, in preparing its budget, is including figures which will enable this work to be done in Hill.

During the past year the school has been capped with insulating material. The heat loss will be cut down considerably and should make for much more comfort in the school. During this winter the ice and snow ac-

cumulated on the roof and during the melting process leaked into the classrooms. It has been recommended that the first few courses of shingles be removed, paper laid down, and the shingles replaced. This will insure the roof against leaking. This problem should be given consideration for the coming year.

Storage space in the basement of the school is at a minimum. Steps should be taken to have one end of the basement partitioned to allow for storing of janitor supplies, school supplies, and other materials necessary in the school. This will improve the appearance of the basement of your school.

I wish to express my appreciation to all who have helped in making this past year another successful and pleasant one. I look forward to many more.
