## TOWN WARRANT

## STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Langdon in the County of Sullivan in said State qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Langdon on Tuesday, March Thirteenth, at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

Art. 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

Art. 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges and make appropriation for same.

Art. 3. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for the support of Highways and bridges, and make appropriation for same.

Art. 4. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount on taxes paid before a specified date, and if so, how much?

Art. 5. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for fire protection and make appropriation for same.

Art. 6. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for State Aid Construction and make appropriation for same.

Art. 7. To see whether beer or other alcoholic beverages shall be manufactured or sold locally as permitted under Chapter 99, Section 22 in Laws of 1933.

Art. 8. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's Deeds.

Art. 9. To see if the Town will vote to lay a new floor in the Town Hall and make appropriation for same.

Art. 10. To see if the Town will vote to buy a snow fence and make appropriation for same.

Art. 11. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the road from the Kelley Place to the old Griffin Place, or any other road that they may see fit.

Art. 12. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Art. 13. To transact any other business proper to be brought before this meeting.

Art. 14. To allow Accounts.

## REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Langdon School Board:

I herewith submit my fourth annual report as your superintendent of schools.

The reorganization of school districts has placed Langdon with Cornish, Charlestown, Acworth, and Unity. The new union has 36 teachers in 21 buildings; the old union had 29 teachers in 13 buildings.

Miss Lora Horton and Miss Minnie Bonnette are teaching their fifth and third years respectively at the Centre School. The schools are progressing well even with the congested conditions in the upper grades. A sizeable, well lighted, well ventilated room helps with the general order, and with the pupils' attitude toward their work.

The pupils that would attend the Holden Hill School were so few that that school was not opened in the fall.

We expect teachers to prepare carefully each lesson to be taught, to correct every error in the papers passed in, to help any and all pupils who have special difficulties, to play with the children at noon and recess, and teach with vigor and kindness. Even with able teachers, when a few activities of a school are over emphasized due either to a teacher's enthusiasm or to outside pressure from the superintendent or public, other valuable activities are neglected. It is the even businesslike schools where a variety of faithful tasks are done each day by modern methods without running to fads that help prepare the boys and girls for happy and successful lives. One should take into consideration the problems a teacher faces each school day when discussing salaries.

It has been the spirit of the times to cut salaries for the last few years. Langdon now has her salary schedule well below the average of the State. The last teachers' cuts did not save anything for the local tax-payer as the teachers with their experience would have been approved for a higher instead of a lower salary.

Mrs. Z. L. Hasham has continued her excellent work as school nurse. Cod liver oil, milk and now noon lunches are being furnished by the State and Nation. I wish that funds might be obtained to have a dental clinic.

Again I wish to thank the Langdon School Board and the teachers for their cooperation and help.
