13. Will the town vote to raise the sum of \$1,500.00 and interest amounting in all to \$2,679.36 to take up water bond and interest due April 1st, 1930?

14. Will the town vote to raise \$3,000.00 for the purpose of constructing a sidewalk from the Lincoln Inn thru to North Woodstock line?

15. How much money will be raised for maintenance of water department?

16. Will the town vote to raise \$1,500.00 for street lighting?

17. To transact any business that may legally come before the meeting.

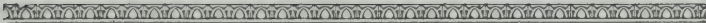
