## SCHOOL WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the School district in the town of Middleton qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the 14th day of March 1967, at the close of town meeting, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.

2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.

3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.

4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.

5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.

6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.

8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by the town.

9. To see if the district will vote to accept the provisions of Title 1, Public Law 89-10 (Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965), and to appropriate such funds as may be made available to the district under said Federal Act for such particular projects as may be determined by the school board. Further to see if the district will authorize the school board to make application for such funds and to expend the same for such projects as it may designate.

10. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing year.

ll. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

The amounts for which a sending district will be liable for tuition in 1967-68, in the absence of a contract, on the basis of estimated state average per pupil cost in 1966-67 have been determined as follows:

Elementary grades (1-6 or 1-8)	\$401.00
High School grades (9-12 or 10-12)	589.00

Based on per pupil cost, Farmington School District has adopted the following rates:

Elementary grades 1-8	\$300.00
High School grades 9-12	500.00

Due to the cooperation of the Middleton School Board, with the Farmington School Board, it has been possible through Title I Funds Public Law 89-10 to purchase adequate library shelving, thereby improving the library storage facilities for the two communities.

A six weeks' summer reading program for those students who needed additional help in reading was made available through the same source of revenue. Necessary reading equipment was also made available to improve their ability in that area.

Under current funds provided by Title I, we now have

three teacher aides to assist the first grade teachers in non-teaching duties; therefore, it is hoped that the citizens of Middleton will continue to accept this supplementary aide to education.

These are changing times in educational circles, and signs point to growth and innovation in the immediate future. The AREA Concept and Co-operative School Districts will receive much attention in the wake of recent State Board of Education pronouncements concerning secondary school enrollments. There will be a continuance of Federal programs which will affect education in one form or another. We should be watchful and informed so that our decisions, concerning the education of boys and girls, will be based on facts rather than emotions and hearsay.

Throughout these days ahead we will appreciate, as in the past, your continued cooperation in the best interests of boys and girls.
