

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Mont Vernon in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Mont Vernon on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects; the polls not to close at an earlier hour than 12:00 o'clock noon:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount on property taxes of three per cent if paid in full before July first and two per cent if paid in full before August first.
- 4. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 5. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired through Tax Collector's deeds.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to accept Town Road Aid for construction of Class 5 roads, and raise and appropriate for said purpose the sum of \$510.39.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to purchase new snow plowing equipment and for that purpose to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw from the capital reserve fund \$4,000.00 previously set aside for this purpose and to supplement this amount, to appropriate \$5,000.00 and to authorize the Selectmen with the cooperation of the Town Treasurer to borrow said sum for the purchase of such equipment in accordance

with the provision of Chapter 72 of THE REVISED LAWS OF NEW HAMPSHIRE, and amendments thereto, and to issue therefor notes or bonds of account bearing such rates of interest and having such maturities as they may be able to negotiate.

- 8. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate \$10,000.00 for the construction of a building for the housing of town property and equipment, and to authorize the Selectmen with the cooperation of the Town Treasurer to borrow said sum to construct such building in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 72, of THE REVISED LAWS OF NEW HAMPSHIRE, and amendments thereto, and to issue therefor notes or bonds of account bearing such rates of interest and having such maturities as they may be able to negotiate.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding \$50.00 (1/100 of one per cent of the Town's valuation based on the 1946 assessment) to the Merrimack Valley Region Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town in cooperation with the other 37 communities in the Merrimack Valley Region.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to be used toward the eradication of poison ivy on public grounds and road sides.
- 11. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

#### DALAND MEMORIAL LIBRARY

Another year has elapsed with not much other than the usual routine of library activities to report.

It is always gratifying to note an increase in the use of the Library and this has raised the circulation about 1,000 more than last year. One afternoon in August 80 books and magazines were loaned. In terms of use and appreciation of the facilities of the Library, it may be considered to be successfully functioning, but financially we are in the red.

The higher cost of fuel and supplies, the uncertainty of the amount that can be expected from the Daland Book Fund, and our zeal to furnish as many books as possible for popular demand, have contri-

buted to this situation.

This deficit must be met from this year's appropria-

tion which it is hoped will be much larger.

67 books have been added, 8 from the Alice Parker Fund which has been expended, some from donations from the following persons which we acknowledge with deep gratitude, Charles S. Hatton, Miss Bertha Rogers, Mrs. G. D. Kittredge, Mrs. J. L. Bailey and W. B. Wood, and 10 from State Aid with others which are being added in January and will be recognized in the 1947 report. The majority of these are for children and young people, as Miss Pratt of the N. H. State Library agrees with us that it is of vital importance that our youth should be encouraged to form the habit of reading, by access to interesting and informative new books.

In May the Librarian attended the Regional N. H. L. A. meeting in Wilton receiving information and help from exchange of ideas and discussions, exhibits of current books, etc.

Mr. and Mrs. Hooper, janitor and assitant librarian respectively have felt it necessary to resign, which we regret.

Used books and magazines which have been discarded have been placed where they could be of further service.

As always, any expression of appreciation for services rendered is gratefully received and an incentive to more worthily merit the same.

### Warrant for Annual School Meeting

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the School District in the town of Mont Vernon, New Hampshire, qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the 11th day of March 1947, at 2 o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
  - 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
- 6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.

- 18. To see if the district will appropriate the sum of \$5,000 for remodeling and converting the present village school into a two-room elementary school.
- 19. To see if the district will vote to raise the sum of \$5,000 for the purpose of remodeling and equipping the present village school and in order to provide such funds to authorize the school board to issue serial notes or bonds in the name of and on the credit of the district for this amount, in accordance with Chapter 72, the New Hampshire Revised Laws (Municipal Bond Act) and any special action governing the issuance of bonds and notes that might affect the school district of Mont Vernon.
- 20. To see if the district will vote to transport all the pupils below the ninth grade to the elementary schools in the Milford school district and in order to provide such transportation to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,800 for this purpose.

### REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Mont Vernon:

I herewith present my eighth annual report, the twenty-eighth in the series. I present three topics for your consideration; Teachers, Accomplishments, Suggestions.

### **Teachers**

The same teachers, Miss Jenkins and Miss Wheeler, remain with you. Although the latter comes but one

day per week, I report her just the same.

Salaries are again of major importance. I again urge you to increase them to as high a point as you possibly can. Without adequate increases, we will have difficulties in securing teachers and keeping all departments in operation. I have presented a plan calling for salaries ranging from \$1,800 to \$2,400 for teachers with bachelor's degrees; more for master's and less with less prepartion. I hope that plan or a better one will be used as a basis for employment next year and will insure an adequate staff.

There are a few points I wish to discuss relative to the employment of teachers. They are the barriers I must face and argue against as I interview teachers to go to smaller towns. First, the salary is inclined to be low in comparison with a larger town or a city. Second, living conditions for board and room might not compare with that to which the candidates are accustomed. This might be extended to include the lack of movies and other recreational pursuits. Third, the schools are organized with more than one grade to a teacher. Fourth, candidates have heard that people in the smaller towns are very critical of teachers, often to the extent of verbal abuse and social isolation. All of these factors contribute to my difficulties. Possibly they point to the salary scale—that it ought to be higher

than the city or larger town in order to attract people and overcome these handicaps mentioned above. Surely, everyone can examine his part in the affairs of the town and see if there is something he can do to correct the difficulty.

# Accomplishments

I trust more stable conditions will soon prevail so that more time can be devoted to this subject. I desire to continue a testing program to determine educational possibilities as well as educational accomplishments. Without the benefit of this material, teachers feel handicapped in their work. We now have some test material at hand ready to use in the next two or three months.

A study of pupil promotions, and the difficulties encountered, is interesting. The five towns of this Union are listed below by number only.

The above refers to pupils in the first eight grades and shows the number in per cent promoted, trial promoted and not promoted. Of course, the figures cover only six grades in your town, which numbers three on the list. Although the number of pupils to compare with other towns is small, and the figures may be somewhat distorted on account of small numbers, it seems to me that there is a problem there. Almost 25% of these children are having difficulty to meet the standards of their grades. I hope their adjustment is now complete and that they will not have to lose ground again in their progress through the grades.

Suggestions

I trust you will examine the other sections of this report.

You are confronted with a problem of numbers and facilities to care for them. If the present enrollment holds and the expected first grade enters next year, there will be approximately forty children in the first six grades and another five in the next two grades. Forty children in six grades is too many for one teacher, and I suggest a division of grades into two rooms. If the eighth grade were added (there will be no seventh grade), the first four grades would have twenty-four and the remaining grades twenty-one. I may have difficulty to find the teachers necessary, but nevertheless the children should have the benefit of this additional school opportunity.

I am very grateful to all who have helped the school meet its goals, especially to the School Board

and the Teachers.
