THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Piermont, in the County of Grafton, in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs :

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Piermont on Tuesday, the 10th day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects :

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To raise and appropriate money to maintain Highways and Bridges.
4. To raise and appropriate money to maintain street lights.
5. To raise and appropriate money for snow removal.
6. To raise and appropriate money for poor relief.
7. To raise and appropriate money for support of Library.
8. To raise and appropriate money for Memorial Day.
9. To raise and appropriate money for town maintenance of highways with State Aid, or State Aid New Construction on Lake Tarleton road.
10. To raise and appropriate money for Pine Blister Rust Control with State Aid.

11. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks at the time they examine the taxable property.

12. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds.

13. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of the Municipal Budget Act.

14. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

15. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

ANNUAL PIERMONT PUBLIC LIBRARY REPORT

At the last Town Meeting a motion was made and carried to buy the Methodist church for a library building. The alterations were completed in July, and we moved from our temporary quarters into the new building on July 30th. While making this change library service was interrupted for one day only.

A formal opening was held on August 15th.

The library is equipped with four large book cases, one of which was donated by Mrs. Elwin Chase, a magazine rack, reading table for the children, a gift of Mrs. Julia Hannaford, two reading tables given by Mrs. Luella Bickford and Mrs. Belle Bowles.

Three pieces of statuary have been given by Mrs. Louise Horton and Mrs. George Putnam which add greatly to the appearance of the room.

There has also been purchased a desk for the Librarian, and twelve chairs for use at the reading tables.

Our records show that we have 1654 books, and of this number 3524 books and magazines have been in circulation the past year: 2154 adult fiction, 106 adult non-fiction, 947 juvenile fiction, 24 juvenile non-fiction, and 478 magazines.

Since the last report was made the Rodimon School has been closed and a transportation route to the Brook Road School established. Aside from the financial saving made by this consolidation, it is to the advantage of the children to mingle with others in a larger group.

The classrooms of both buildings were much improved by being repainted in the summer. In order to cause a more even distribution of heat in the Brook Rd. building, a jacket around the box stove has recently been installed. Aside from the ordinary minor repairs it does not seem that much will have to be done to keep both buildings in good condition for the next year.

In November 1934 Federal funds made it possible to hold a dental clinic where thirty children received treatment. As there is always more or less relief work needed every winter, the school nurse could give out any articles of children's clothing which might be placed at her disposal.
