

**WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING**  
**STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE**

---

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Rollinsford in the County of Strafford, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday, the Eleventh day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- ART. 1 To bring in your ballots for Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, One Selectman and Overseer of the Poor for a term of three years, One Road Agent, and Chief of the Fire Department.
- ART. 2. To choose all other necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- ART. 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for the same.
- ART. 4. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount of 2% on all taxes of the 1947 levy, except poll taxes, paid on or before September 1st. next.
- ART. 5. To see if the voters of the Town of Rollinsford will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of the collection of taxes.

- ART. 6. To see if the town will vote to build a tarvia sidewalk on the easterly side of Washington Street, beginning at Dover Street and extending to Saint Joseph's Convent and raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for such purpose.
- ART. 7 To see if the town will vote to install an oil heating system in the Rollinsford Town Hall and raise and appropriate a sum of \$550.00 to cover cost of installing said heating system.
- ART. 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to lay a sewer on Prospect Street, with a sewer extension on Locust Street, beginning at the residence formerly owned by William Leonard and continuing South along said Street.
- ART. 9. To transact any other business that may legally come before said Meeting.

Appropriations will begin at eleven (11) o'clock sharp.

Given under our hands and seal, this twenty-fourth (24) day of February, in the year of our Lord, Nineteen Hundred and Forty-Seven.

## REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

---

To the School Board and Citizens of Rollinsford:

It is my privilege to submit my first annual report as Superintendent of Schools. This report includes the statistics and comments on the various phases of the school program.

### ENROLLMENT - TRANSPORTATION TUITIONS - AWARDS

Our school population continues to be quite stable with a registration for 1947 showing little change over 1946. The distribution by grades is inconsistent with such extremes as 11 pupils in grade III to 25 in grade IV. Miss Brown is handling grade I with 20 pupils and grade II with 12. Miss Doherty instructs grade III with 11 and 9 of the grade IV group. Miss Ordway works with the balance of grade IV numbering 16 and has in addition 9 of grade V. Miss Nelson's home room includes 15 of grade V and all of grade VI which totals 12. Mr. Bragg continues to his schedule with 11 in grade VII and 16 in grade VIII.

Tuition pupils attending Berwick Academy number 10 as compared with 6 for last year. Dover High School benefits to the extent of 62 pupils with tuition being paid at the rate of \$123.74 which is an increase of \$7.00 per pupil over last year. As you can well see, this is one of our most substantial expenditures.

The registration at St. Joseph's School was reported as 115 as compared to 110 for 1945-46.

The awards made annually at the graduation exercises went to Marie Morin and Rene Van deMuelebroecke. Marjorie Perry of grade VIII and Francis Carpenter of grade VII had perfect attendance records in 1945-46.

## PERSONNEL

It was with deep regret that the School Board accepted the resignation of Mr. Everett Tozier who served so efficiently for so many years in order that he might change his place of residence. I am sure that I express the feelings of the citizens when I say we are all deeply grateful. Mr. Charles W. Jackson was appointed to replace Mr. Tozier and to serve as Chairman.

Mr. Robert Bragg returned from the service to attend Boston University from May until September. He was back at his post when school opened, succeeding Mr. Theodore Blanchard who was filling in for the year. We were pleased to have Mr. Bragg back. He is at present taking Saturday courses at Boston University and will complete his work for his Master's Degree in June. His duties have consisted of teaching grades VII and VIII and serving as principal as well.

Miss Alberta Nelson of Rochester was elected to teach in grades V and VI on the resignation of Mrs. Robert Bragg. Miss Nelson taught at Belmont last year and received her training at Keene Teachers' College.

Misses Brown, Doherty and Ordway have returned and are doing their usual high quality work.

The position of janitor was put up to bid and Mr. Edward Bureau was elected to serve for one year.

## LUNCH PROGRAM

Mrs. Earl Chase was appointed to conduct the lunch program under Mr. Bragg's supervision. Despite shortages and high costs the program has been a huge success and makes a definite contribution to those boys and girls who travel by bus to school and cannot get home for a hot lunch. Mrs. Chase is to be commended for her fine work.

## NEW EQUIPMENT

A duplicating machine has been purchased to provide for the running off of copies for pupils seat work. This is a time saver and is useful in putting out menus, announcements, etc.

A progressive step in the improvement and enrichment of the educational program was made when the Bell and Howell 16 mm Projector and Screen were purchased to provide visual education. This has been in constant use and has been enjoyed by the pupils and teachers. Mr. Bragg has arranged for film showings and programs for the various grades. Learning results from this method of instruction which would not be possible under the traditional methods of teaching. Social studies, science and health are only three fields of great potential reawaking with the use of films. All progressive communities are working in this field of Visual education. I feel that the School Board made a definite contribution to our school by this purchase.

We should consider within the next year of purchasing an oil burner for our school. This would likely insure better controlled heat and conserve many hours which could be used for building maintenance. It would be cleaner, time saving and economical. In addition it is more satisfactory in the fall and spring when little heat is needed in the morning to take off the chill.

## IN SERVICE TRAINING

The time and efforts of Mr. Tozier, Mr. Jackson and Miss Brown working in the Lay-Professional Council in Strafford County were appreciated. This group made a study of education in the state and made recommendations to the State Board of Education for its improvement.

Several meetings of the teachers were held in the Union. Among them were the get-to-gether with Dr.

Howard Jones, President of Plymouth Teachers College and Miss Gertrude Lewis, Elementary Supervisor of the State Department of Education. These meetings were held to discuss ways and means of improving our schools.

An Institute was held at Stratham for a full day and all teachers were in attendance at the Convention in Concord in October 16 and 17.

Your superintendent attended the November Conference of New England Superintendents in Boston. He is a member of the Education Council and the Legislative Committee of the Superintendents' Association.

#### MINOR REPAIRS

A much needed redecorating job was completed this summer with the complete painting of the interior of the building. The building is now in excellent condition as a result of this work.

#### STATE AID

Education in New Hampshire was indeed fortunate to secure the services of Dr. Edgar Fuller as its new Commissioner. He has reorganized the State Department of Education so that many new services are now available to our school. His major contribution however has been in state finances. A thorough study revealed that New Hampshire was low in its support of education at the state level. A bill has been introduced in the Legislature for more state aid. If this bill is enacted into law the School District of Rollinsford will receive about \$12,000 in place of the \$1,990.87 received this year. This will make it possible for us to improve our schools at no extra cost to the property taxpayer.

#### SCHOOL COSTS

The budget for school operation will increase as has every phase of our economy. Scholars' supplies, text-

books, repairs, etc. have all risen. We will be as economical as possible yet there are certain minimum expenditures which must be made. The salaries of teachers must be increased. They have been underpaid in the past and the shortage in the next three years will continue due to the small enrollment in the teachers' colleges. If we are to retain or replace teachers we must pay comparative salaries. I hope you will support this recommendation.

The advancing curricula of the elementary school calls for work in art, music and physical education. It is hoped that something can be done to work this into our program on a part time basis. Our regular teachers are doing some work in these fields but they have neither the time nor the training to carry it on effectively. Our future program should call for the building up of our enrollment to set up a single grade for each teacher and for offering the above mentioned subjects to our pupils to insure a well rounded and balanced education. When this is achieved I feel sure we will measure up to the best schools in our area in every respect and that Rollinsford will be making the maximum contribution to the full development of its youth.

#### CONCLUSION

I am pleased with the progress in our school. We have a fine school plant with excellent facilities and an able group of experienced teachers who are working with a School Board which is interested in its work. I want to thank them for their cooperation and support. I look forward optimistically for the continued growth of our school.
