THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Rumney in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Rumney on Tuesday, the Tenth day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, at which time the polls shall be opened and shall close not earlier than nine o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following articles: all articles not on the ballot will be acted upon at seven-thirty in the evening.

1. To choose all necessary Town officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sum of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and to make appropriations of the same.

3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of its highways and bridges.

4. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Library.

5. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Fire Department.

6. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of the Cemeteries.

7. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of the Common and the daily raising and lowering of the flag.

8. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Street Lights.

9. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the LaMott-Kenneson Post No. 76, American Legion for Memorial Day and other patriotic purposes. 10. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of the Town Dump.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$341.03 to secure from the State \$2,273.53 to be expended for Town Road Aid.

12. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay the Lakes Region Association for the purpose of Publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the town in cooperating with other towns in the Lakes Region.

13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate towards the operation of the Sceva Speare Memorial Hospital in Plymouth, N. H.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$125.00 for White Pine Blister Rust Control Program in co-operation with the Forestry and Recreation Commission.

15. To see if the Town will vote to add to the Capital Reserve Fund, for the purpose of purchasing Highway equipment in the amount of \$1,000.00 to be transfered from surplus funds.

16. To see if the Town will vote to add to the Capital Reserve Fund, for the purpose of purchasing Fire equipment, in the amount of \$1,000.00 to be transferred from the surplus funds.

17. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the old route No. 25 between station 127+00 and station 138+50 as shown on the plans of Rumney TLR 14199, which was turned back to the Town of Rumney by the New Hampshire Dept. of Public Works and Highways, August 20, 1954.

18. To see what action the town will take with respect to adopting a resolution concerning the Livermore Falls Project as proposed by the United States Army Corps of Engineers, and to see what sum, if any, the town will vote to raise and appropriate in connection with such resolution. 19. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen, to investigate and purchase if possible a Public Beach site, at Stinson Lake and to borrow money to pay for same.

20. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer, lease, rent, sell or otherwise dispose of any real estate or mineral rights acquired by the Town at any of its tax collector's sales.

21. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

22. To choose Delegates to the Constitutional Convention.

23. To vote on the question "Shall Sweepstake tickets be sold in this city or town?"

24. Shall the provisions of Chapter 171-A of the Revised Laws relative to playing games of Beano be adopted in this town.

25. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors and Committees heretofore chosen and to pass any vote relating thereto and to transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

During the calendar year of 1963 seven new trust funds were established, six for the care of Cemetery lots and one for the purchase of new equipment, when needed, for the Fire Department. \$3,000.00 was withdrawn from the Highway Equipment Fund and used toward the purchase of a new truck for that Department.

150 funds are now being administered. Most of our funds are now invested in Mutual Funds approved by the State Banking Commission, on which we receive capital gains in the form of stock dividends in addition to the regular dividends. During 1963 we received 35 additional shares of a current value of \$381.65 on which we will receive additional dividends in 1964. All funds are in good condition and most are growing as income at present somewhat exceeds expenditures. A detailed report follows.

COLBY Trustees of Trust Funds Early in 1963, the "Work Plan" for the Baker River Watershed project was completed and forwarded to Washington for Congressional "construction" approval. The sponsors of the project, with the help of local people, town officials, State and Federal agencies completed these proposed plans which provide for: (1) Accelerating the installation of land treatment measures. (2) The construction of eight single purpose floodwater retarding structures. (3) Six multiple purpose floodwater retarding structures. (4) One single purpose recreational development.

These works of improvement, if approved by Congress, will be scheduled for installation within the next five year period.

This combined program of land treatment and structural measure will have a major effect in alleviating future floodwater and sediment damages in the valley. These works of improvement will also provide opportunity for increased agricultural and industrial land use. They will provide recreational lakes for wildlife habitat, new fishing sites, and other waterbased recreational development.

Picture in your mind fourteen man-made lakes ranging in size from 5 to 105 acres scattered on tributary streams at intervals along the 28 mile length of the Baker River Watershed, and you will be able to comprehend at least some of the scope and importance of this proposed watershed project, and what it will mean to the area. Six of these permanent pools are planned to have additional water for recreational pur-

poses. Two of these structures will be complete recreational developments.

Only one of the fourteen planned stuctures is located in the town of Rumney. This is sit #10, which is located on an unnamed brook about one-half mile west of West Rumney. The earth dam will create approximately a five acre permanent pool with 47 acres for flood water storage.

In addition to site #10, the New Hampshire Fish and Game Department plans to develop lake trout spawning reefs in Stinson Lake as part of the project. This single purpose development will enhance the reproduction of lake trout in Stinson Lake.

The floodwater retarding dams planned for construction upstream from West Rumney will control approximately 76 percent of the drainage area above that area, which would be a very high degree of flood prevention.

The Baker River Watershed Work Plan has resulted from the coordinated effort of local people taking the initiative to solve their own problems through long range planning, coupled with technical and financial assistance from State and Federal agencies.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND YOUR DISTRICT CHIEF

During the past year New Hampshire faced the greatest forest fire threat to its woodlands in more than sixty years. The continued drought brought home to our citizens, as never before, the potential threat of destructive fires to their beautiful and valuable forests, homes and livelihood. In true American tradition of meeting a common threat by volunteer effort, this fire danger was minimized by active prevention. patrol and relinquishing of personal rights for the common good. It was a greatest demonstration of public cooperation ever experienced by those responsible for local and state fire control. The ready forces of volunteer fire services kept the losses low. For their effort and public response the general fire service expresses. its heartfelt thanks for a job well done.

Prevention however, is not just an activity for the bad fire years. It must be practiced until it becomes a part of our public conscience—a habit. Just plain carelessness with fire causes too many of our fires.

The following practices and suggestions will help:

- 1. Always have a permit for outdoor burning and burn within the terms of the permit and in a safe place. Burn late in the afternoon when the wind is down or on rainy or damp days. Check your fire and if winds develop extinguish it promptly.
- 2. Carry your rubbish to the public dump-its safer. A neglected backyard incinerator causes. many fires.
- 3. Nover discard lighted cigarettes or match. Make this a year round habit regardless of the safety of your surroundings.
- 4. Children caused fires are now a major concern. Keep matches away from them and teach them to respect fire and not make it a subject of play.

Let's all join with "Smokey the Bear" and "Keep New Hampshire Green" and growing in 1964. Number of fires and burned area in 1963.

The following is a report of activities conducted by the N. H. Division of Public Health, Public Health Nursing for Rumney for 1963. Please have printed in your town report.

On March 15/63 a Sterneedle Tuberculin Testing program was conducted in the school. 121 were tested. Home visits were made for follow-up of reactors to the test and they were referred to family physicians and or chest X-ray clinics at Plymouth conducted by the N. H. Tuberculosis and Health Association.

Sabin Oral Polio Vaccine clinics were held at the school for all ages. The school chidren received their vaccine during school hours and adults and preschools attended evening clinics. Total vaccine given Type 3-153 Type 2-126. The last in series of Sabin clinics will be held in early 1964.

Many preschool children from Rumney have attended the Clinics held at Warren during the year for physical examinations and immunizations.

Home visits have been made in the community on mothers, babies, preschool and others and assistance given as indicated. Arrangements made for attendance at Cripple Children's Clinics, Cardiac Clinics and applications for Sight Conservation assistance.

My sincerest thanks to the School Nurse, Mrs. Helen Fisher, R. N., Members of the School Personnel, the P. T. A. for assisting and furnishing supplies for giving Sabin; and any others who have assisted in our program.

Hereby submitted is my annual report as your Superintendent of Schools.

Another year has passed in our continued efforts to improve our school and instruction. Your aim, like mine is to see that we make the best use possible of teachers, materials and buildings in order that the children get the best education possible.

Two new teachers were employed to replace Mrs. Britton and Mrs. Greenwood. We were again fortunate to again acquire good replacements. We were not so fortunate in replacing the music teacher. Mrs. Wilson resigned to teach full time in Laconia and to date I have been unsuccessful in securing someone to replace her. The position for various districts in the union requires only three days a week and it is almost impossible to find anyone who does not desire full-time work in this field. At the present time I am working with the Superintendent in Ashland and Holderness where together we could use a music supervisor full time. I am hopeful that for next year the problem will be solved.

A committee of teachers from the union is now studying the various mathematics series for adoption of a new program beginning next year. The books we are using are about ten years old and with all the emphasis and improvements made in arithmetic teaching, the ones we are now using should be replaced. It will not be a waste of the taxpayers' funds because most of the arithmetic books we have are in poor condition.

We have also started to renew the reading program and have adopted the new revised edition of the same basal text which is Scott Foresman. Any extra funds we obtain for books in the years immediately ahead, will be used in these two areas. In the over-all expense of schools, textbooks and supplies are such a small part of the entire budget, I do not recommend trying to get along with outdated books. The lunch program continues to go along very nicely and participation stays at the high level of the past. On any number of occasions I have been informed by the State Director of hot lunches that she considers it one of the model programs in the state for small schools.

We are still making use of educational television in the classrooms and find it to be a valuable teaching tool.

I am not sure at this point how much interest the district has in the area of cooperative schools, but at least I think you should be kept abreast of developments so that at some future date the district can intelligently make a decision on the problem. The Cooperative School Law has changed. The law now states that a committee of three, one of which must be a school board member, must be appointed or elected at a regular or special school district meeting to make a study and recommendation to the district. The other change is that now before any district goes into a cooperative school, so-called "Articles of Agreement" have to be drawn up which tell exactly under what conditions any district will enter including formular and guaranteed costs. If for no other reason than to keep you informed. I would hope that such a committee could be appointed at your March meeting this year.

Our athletic program under the guidance of Mr. Corey is popular and beneficial and I would hope it continues. Activities of this nature, although they may have little direct connection with textbook earning, are a decided factor in the overall development of youngsters and vicariously help those who do not participate.

I wish to thank the School Board and teachers for their cooperation during the past year.

EXPLANATION OF SUPERINTENDENT'S SALARY

Section 5, Chapter 243, Laws of 1953 of the State of New Hampshire, requires that school district annual reports show the total amount paid to the superintendent of schools as per the following quotations: "Reports. Each superintendent of a supervisory union shall annually prepare a report showing the total salary paid to the superintendent, which report shall show in detail the amount derived from the per capita tax and the amount paid directly by each school district in the union."

One-half of the supervisory union expenses is prorated among the several school districts of the union on the basis of adjusted valuation. One-half is prorated on the basis of average daily membership in the school for the previous school year ending June 30th. The Superintendent of Supervisory Union No. 48 during 1962-63 received a salary of \$9,250.00 which was made up as follows: \$4,250 paid from the per capita tax and \$5,000 prorated among the several school districts. Allowances of \$1,200 for travel within the union was also prorated as stated above.

The table shows the portion of salary and travel charged to each school district.

REPORT OF SCHOOL NURSE

January 1, 1963 to December 30, 1963

Forty-three visits were made to the school classrooms for pupil inspection.

Vision and hearing tests were made on each pupil and notices were sent home on the ones who failed the tests.

Weighing and measuring and health records were kept on each pupil.

First aid supplies were bought for the school and first aid treatment given when at school.

Twenty home visits were made, conferences with parents held and appointment applications made out for various clinics.

One hundred twenty-one Stern needle T. B. tests were given and follow-up made on all who had a positive reaction.

Two attended chest clinics in Plymouth.

Sabin Oral Polio Vaccine was administered twice with 153 receiving Type III in October and 86 receiving Type II in November..

Pre-School registration was held in May. Parents came with children for health appraisal.

Visits were made with Doctors, Eye Doctors and Dentist. Some children went to the Warren Medical Center State Board of Health Clinics for immunizations and physicals.

I attended a workshop for speech and hearing at Crotched Mountain May 15th, Hanover for Welfare Conference, and to the School Nurses Section of Teachers' Convention in Manchester October 25th. Fourteen children had complete dental corrections at Dental Clinic at Dr. Crowell's office and were transported by members of the P. T. A., teachers and the school nurse.
