

To the inhabitants of the Town of Sandwich, in said County and State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town, on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March, next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles:

- 1. To see if the Town will determine by vote the salary to be paid any of its officers and agents.
- 2. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 3. To raise and appropriate \$133.92 to pay interest on the School Fund Note.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate money for the support of the Library in addition to the amount required by law. The sum recommended to be raised as a whole is \$797.25.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate money for the observance of Old Home Week. The amount recommended is \$150.00.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate money for the observance of Memorial Day. The sum recommended is \$50.00
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$126.00 for the Town's quota to the Lakes Region Association.
- 8. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate money for the maintenence of the Notch and Dale Roads. The sum recommended is \$550.00
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to accept Town Road Aid and vote to raise and appropriate for that purpose the sum of \$380.00, the State contributing \$1,519.98.
- 10. To see if the Town will accept State Aid for the construction of Class II roads, and raise and appropriate for that purpose the sum of \$1,894.00, the State contributing a like amount.

- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate 1/10th of 1% of the valuation of the Town under Chapter 160—of the Public Acts of 1943 to set up a capital reserve, in the hands of the Trustees of Trust Funds for Post-War projects in the Town of Sandwich. The amount is \$1,263.20.
- 12. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for continuing the control of the white pine blister rust. The State Forester's letter states "The Town appropriation will, as usual, be increased 25% by State Funds, and probably further increased from Federal Funds.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the support of the Fire Department and vote to authorize the Selectmen to use, if necessary, the unexpended Forest Fire Appropriation of 1943, in surplus, for Forest Fire purposes.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate money for the support of the Laconia Hospital and the Huggins Memorial Hospital. The sums are \$200.00 and \$50.00 respectively.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the care of cemeteries.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of highways and bridges and for winter care for the year ensuing and pass any vote relating thereto. The sum is \$13,000.00
- 17. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of paying Town Charges for the ensuing year. The sum recommended is \$3,000.00
- 18. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of paying the expenses of General Government. The sum recommended is \$3,500.00.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate funds as recommended by the Tax Commission for the purposes of paying added expenses of surveying and assessing, if necessary, under requirements of the new inventory of 1944. The sum recommended is \$1,000.00.
- 20. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to act as its agents in all matters relating to Town

Property for the purpose of granting easements, making sale and conveyance of any property or properties which may be acquired by the Town by tax deed.

- 21. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen, in their discretion, to purchase for the Town such land or lands as they shall deem necessary or useful for Town or public purposes.
- 22. To hear reports of Town Officers or Committees and take any appropriate action thereon.
- 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for office equipment.
- 24. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.
- 24A. To see if the Town will vote to elect a Board of SIX library Trustees, in place of a Board of three trustees, two Trustees for a term of one year, two, for a term of two years and two for a term of three years and thereafter two elected annually for a term of three years.
- 25. To choose by ballot all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Cemetery Department

Under prevailing conditions it is impossible to proceed with improvement projects as rapidly as we would like. Reference to "Expenditures" on opposite page will indicate that some new work has been accomplished and

that improved plots have been maintained.

Most of the larger cemeteries are under the supervision of some one of the six Cemetery Associations. In the case of the numerous outlying plots, the Trustees are attempting, as fast as possible, to bring these to a satisfactory condition by cutting bushes, repairing enclosures and resetting stones.

The scarcity of burial lots in existing ecemteries becomes more apparent and action has been taken, within the year, to have the Elm Hill Cemetery surveyed and plotted so that burial lots may be available for purchase.

The size of the fund and the interest accruals, on the Charles H. White Trust, will assure a well cared for cemetery, when the necessary improvement work has been completed. We hope this may be accomplished during the coming year.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

Some changes in the direction of consolidation have seemed advisable in the administration of Sandwich schools this year. The Whiteface school, small in enrollment for several years past, has grown even smaller, and under present conditions of teacher shortage the Board felt that it should be united with the school at North Sandwich. The Lower Corner pupils, for similar reasons, are now being transported to the Center.

However, it does not seem likely than Sandwich can eontinue with only four teachers after the present boom of war production begins to subside. Families attracted away from here by high wages are apt to return, and this may mean reopening schools that have temporarily been

closed.

Fundamental teaching of reading, writing, arithmetic, spelling and the like go on in war time as always. Geography has taken on a new interest as boys from our town are stationed in distant parts of the world. Weekkly newspapers, written on the level of the various school grades, provide timely material for the study of current events. An effort is made to distinguish between true and false impressions in the propaganda which comes to our attention daily.

The work of the schools in developing good attitudes of citizenship and patriotism, and in giving children a thorough background of fundamental skill and knowledge, is recognized as a necessary wartime activity. The War Production Board gives to schools a high priority rating for the purchase of supplies and materials; the War Manpower Commission rates teaching high on the seales of necessary war work. In fact, we all should realize that Hitler and other dictators worked for years to educate their followers while they were still young children, so these boys would become loyal soldiers later on. Winning this war for the Allies must depend largely upon men and women already out of school; winning the peace, and preventing future wars, will depend in great measure upon the wisdom of those who are now in schools. The teacher in these days has indeed a grave responsibility.

Dental clinics were held during the year with the cooperation of Dr. Pottle and Dr. Denault of Meredith. A total of 48 pupils were treated—208 operations in all.

Five pupils were taken to an orthopedic clinic, and four to an oculist. The Department of Education loaned an audiometer to the schools, and out of 116 pupils tested with it, seven were found to have slightly defective hearing.
