#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Stewartstown, in the county of Coos, in said State qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the town hall in said town of Stewartstown on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid. 1.
- To see if the town will vote to accept the budget, 2. and raise money for the same. If not, to see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to defray town charges for the ensuing year as follows:
  - (a) Town Officers' Salaries.
  - (b) Town Officers' Expenses.

  - (b) Town Officers' Expenses.
    (c) Election and Registration.
    (d) Municipal Court Expenses.
    (e) Town hall, office and other buildings.
    (f) Damage and Legal Expenses.
    (g) Health Department.
    (h) Town Dump.
    (i) Vital Statistics.
    (j) General Expense of Highway Department.
  - (k) Interest on Temporary Loans.(l) Civil Defense.

  - (m) County Tax.
  - To raise such sums of money as may be necessary 3. for support of poor.
  - To raise such sums of money as may be necessary 4. for support of Libraries.
  - To raise such sum of money as may be necessary 5. for care of cemeteries.

- 6. To see if the town will vote to raise one thousand five hunded dollars (\$1,500.00) for street lighting.
- 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the following departments:
  - (a) Police Department.
  - (b) Fire Department.
  - (c) Sewer Department.
- 8. To see what sum of money, if any, the town will vote to raise in addition to that required by law for the town maintenance.
- 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for winter roads.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to tar or pave Church Street in Riverside, Stewartstown, N. H., from the intersection of said street and N. H. Highway #27 to the Oscar Cote property, and make appriation for same.
- 11. To see if the town will vote to instruct and authorize the Selectmen to administer and dispose of at a public auction any and all real estate acquired by the town through Tax Collector's deeds.
- 12. To nominate and elect two members to serve three years on the Municipal Budget Committee.
- 13. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to incur debts, for temporary loans in anticipation of taxes of the Municipal year and pay out of the tax money when it is received.
- 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of 94.56 to the White Mountains Region Association, being 10c per 1,000 of the assessed valuation (1/100th of 1%), for the purpose of publicizing the advantages of the town, in cooperation with the other 45 towns in the region.
- 15. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the road leading from the Sadie Frizzell place to the Joe Lakin place subject to gates and bars.

- 16. To see if the town will vote to instruct its Selectmen to appoint all other officers as required by law not elected by Non-partisan ballot.
- 17. To choose by Non-partisan ballot the following Town Officers:
  - (a) Town Clerk.
  - (b) Selectman for the three years ensuing.
    (c) Town Treasurer.
    (d) Three Road Agents.

  - (e) One or more Auditors.
  - (f) Collector of Diamond Pond Rent.

  - (g) Overseer of Poor.(h) One or more Sextons.
  - (i) Trustee of Trust Fund.
  - (j) One library trustee for the three years ensuing.
- 18. To transact any other business that may be legally brought before this meeting.

#### **Report of Salk Vaccine Clinics**

To the Citizens of Stewartstown:

During the year 1957, 4 Salk Vaccine Clinics were held in Colebrook, sponsored by the N. H. State Department of Health, in cooperation with the local School Nurse, and the Supt. of Schools. 440 children from Stewartstown attended these clinics, 96 received first injections, 126 received second injections, and 218 received third injections. The children attending St. Albert's School are included in this report. In June 1958, we will hold the last clinic in Colebrook, and I hope any who have not taken advantage of this opportunity to date, will do so at this time.

In the Spring of 1957, Triple Toxoid Clinics for the Immunization of Whooping Cough, Diphtheria, and Tetanus, were held, and the following number of children completed their series of 3 injections.

Infant 12, Preschool 36, School 12, and 13 children received Boosters. We will again hold these clinics in the Spring of 1958 and I would like to urge the parents of preschool children to take advantage of these clinics.

It has been a pleasure to work with the Citizens of Stewartstown, and at this time I would like to thank them for their cooperation, and at any time I hope they will feel free to call on me if I can be of any service to them.

## Superintendent's Report

To the School Board and the Citizens of the School District of Stewartstown:

### Foreword

By the successful launching of satellites, Russia may well have done us a good turn, much as we may hate to admit to her "beating us to the gun" in the accomplishment of this technological feat. The ensuing grave concern for our survival for very long, epitomized by the intensity of the current debate on the role of science in our national life, may prove to be most beneficial in spotlighting what are believed to be the shortcomings in our educational system. Certainly there has been a marked upsurge in the demands for both educators and laymen alike that more attention be given to the education of the gifted, and that the science program be intensified. Parallel to these demands, although perhaps not quite as insistent, has been the call for a redefinition of what the schools are expected to do, and to recognize the fact that they cannot be all things to all men.

It is noted, however, that in all that has been said and written on the urgent need for more attention to qualify, more emphasis upon science, and for a more confined curriculum, in no instance has there been a suggestion that the educational system, which has brought America to where she is today, be abandoned. Criticism has not been of that long-standing dream of our society of universal education at least through high school. Rather it has had to do with the fulfilling of this commitment effectively. And as we begin to steady down a bit in our thinking and "once more get our feet on the ground" in making our judgments, we may find that we are not as badly off as during the past few months we may have been led to believe.

With a little time now taken out for meditation, it may be easier for us to see the position we hold in the overall educational achievements in this day and age. When this prime requisite is once known, it will be possible to proceed to the second step in the solution of our problem, the determination of goals. After these are finally decided upon, the selection of the subject matter believed essential for their attainment, and the most effective way of teaching it, will logically follow. Where science takes us, how much the humanities try to control it, what is done with the talented, how successful we are in fostering in both parents and children a fuller appreciation of the values of intellectual endeavor, the extent to which pupils are made to work harder, the degree to which they work up to their capacities, provision for individual differences, establishment of definite objectives, subjects retained in the programs of studies to attain these objectives, depth we are willing to dig into these subjects, extent to which their content is brought to life, extra-curricular and extra-class activities we are induced to drop, and what is done to improve the status of teachers will all be decided upon from the standpoint of one or more of these categories. And the signs of the times are, if what is being done about defense is indicative of Amerca's way of doing things, that what improvement is made in the overall educational program of our schools will be directly proportional to how much we really want and are willing to pay for it.

### Teachers

It means a great deal, as the very serious shortage of teachers continues on and on with no indication of relief in sight, to have experienced teachers in all positions. The three veterans at the West Stewartstown School include Mrs. Velma H. Gray, principal, who teaches Grades 6-7-8; Mrs. Dorothy E. Blodgett, who teaches Grades 3-4-5; and Mrs. Cleora M. Richardson, who teaches Grades 1-2-3. As will be noted, the Third Grade is divided between the two last named teachers. At the Hollow School, Mrs. Jo Ann M. Davis teaches Grades 1-4; and at the Cedar Brook School, Mrs. Marion F. Parrish, a new teacher, teaches Grades 5-8. Mrs. Parrish followed Mrs. Velma C. Ames, also a new teacher, when the latter was forced to resign due to her health.

### School Nurse - Health

With the administration of polio immunizations, complete physical examinations given every four years

after entering school, the conducting of pre-school and X-ray clinics, special attention and help given individual cases where needed, plus constant check-ups on height, weight, hearing and eyesight, and continuous supervision of the overall health of our pupils, the importance of all that is done by our school nurse in contributing to what is accomplished in our schools is readily seen.

The need for a dental clinic, however, is more urgent each successive year, and unless something can be done to provide this vitally important health service, it is feared that the lack of it will become increasingly evident as time goes on. It is believed, also, serious consideration should be given to the possibility of administering the customary immunizations against smallpox, tetanus, and diptheria at the pre-school clinics.

### **Building and Equipment**

As has been done in previous years, the policy of keeping the buildings in a good state of repair and maintenance has been continued during the past year. At the Cedar Brook School the building was painted, the toilet roof shingled, the playground fence repaired, and the surface of the play area improved by filling wished-out places with gravel. The playground fence was repaired also at the Hollow School and the old window shades were replaced with new ones. At West Stewartstown the lunchroom, basement room, toilets and outside porch floors were painted; the entrance door on the north side was repaired; table tops in the lunchroom and desk tops in the upper grade room were sanded and refinished; and the black window shades purchased by the Parent Teacher Association were installed in the windows of the south room over the second floor so that it can be darkened for the showing of film strips, colored slides and moving pictures.

Outside of the purchase of a Bell and Howell Moving Picture Projector by the pupils in the West Stewartstown School, items of equipment added during the past year have been such replacements as were needed for instructional purposes.

### School Lunch Program

The relatively large number of pupils continuing to take advantage of the School Lunch Program at the West Stewartstown School bespeaks its outstanding success. The important work done by the operator, Mrs. Eva M. Day, in maintaining high morale and good health, contributes much to the overall educational effort of the school.

### Notes on the Budget

The School Board's budget for 1958-59, which is the same as that of the Budget Committee, is \$48,425.00 as compared to \$45,782.00 raised and appropriated by the district to operate the schools for the current year. This amount is reduced by an estimated income of \$14,000.00 which leaves a requested appropriation of \$34,425.00 to be raised by taxes by the town in comparison to \$35,782.00 for this year. Provision for increases in salaries and tuition costs, for the most part, explain the increase in the budget for next year. Detailed information of the budget breakdown will be found on subsequent pages in this report.

### **Enrollment and Attendance**

The enrollment of pupils in our schools has shown no appreciable change for some time, as there are 112 enrolled at the present time, as compared to 113, 117, 113, and 110, for the respective preceding four years. A breakdown of the present enrollment shows there are 70 at the West Stewartstown School, 22 at the Cedar Brook School, and 20 at the Hollow School. The average percentage of attendance at these schools during the past year, and in the same order as listed, was 96.61, 91.80 and 93.36 while the average number of tardinesses per pupil for the period was 1.51, .67, and .16.

### **Tuition Pupils**

The number of pupils enrolled in Schools outside the district shows the same general pattern as inside it, of little change during the past 5 years, as there are 37 for the current year in comparison to 35, 38, 31 and 38 for the respective preceding four years. Of the number of pupils for which the district is paying tuition for the current year, 13 are at Colebrook Academy, 22 at Canaan High School, 1 is at Pittsburg High School, and 1 is at Kidderville.

### Miscellaneous

As will be noted in the copy of the warrant included in this report, an article is included to see if the district will vote to elect a committee to study school problems. The pressing one at the present time has to do with the requirement of the State Board of Health for the provision of running hot and cold water and the installation of flush toilets in our rural schools. Whether it is decided to equip the present buildings with these plumbing conveniences, or to work out some other feasible solutions of the problem, the various factors involved will require careful consideration.

### Conclusion

Again, I wish to thank the members of the School Boards, parents, teachers and citizens for all the help and co-operation received in our work together to provide good schools. It is only with the assistance from you all that high standards can be achieved and maintained.
