REPORT OF TRUSTEES OF TRUST FUNDS

The trustees of trust funds, in response to an expressed opinion of those interested in the town's cemeteries, decided to spend a sufficient amount of the accumulated income from trust funds to put the lots of the donors of these funds in proper condition as well as to clean up and make general repairs in the cemeteries.

This work was practically completed before Decoration day, the following amounts being spent on the various cemeteries:

Old cemetery,	\$172	70
New cemetery,	191	25
Stevens cemetery,	23	82

In addition to the work on cemeteries and after legal advice and with approval of two members of the board of selectmen, the trustees voted to repair the hearse house at the old cemetery, in order to provide a proper shelter, under lock and key, for the town's hearses and for the tools of the trustees. To have allowed the building to remain in its state of disrepair would have taken away from the value of the cleanup work in the cemetery. For this work the trustees spent the sum of \$238.15 and it will be necessary to spend an additional sum for a final coat of paint in the spring.

It is hoped that future trustees will spend sufficient sums each year, out of incomes, to further improve the cemeteries and to keep them in repair. This was the condition under which the town received these funds.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and citizens of the Stoddard N. H., School District, the annual report of the Superintendent of Schools is respectfully submitted.

Mrs. Marjorie MacMahon returned to us as teacher with an enrollment of 16 pupils. Before the year closed she was obliged to leave on account of ill health, and her sister, Mrs. Agnes Dolan, substituted for her with satisfaction to all concerned.

Although our school is small, our children deserve all the opportunities for an education that any children have. With that in mind I suggest that it would be well to have at least 180 days actually in session. We had only 173 school days last year.

There were 16 different pupils in school during the year, but Rodney Batchelder, Priscilla Mattoon, and Marion Beal left before the close of the year, so that the average membership was only 12. To this number should be added the tuition pupils in Hillsboro, Keene and Munsonville.

Your superintendent made 20 visits of supervision and inspection during the year. He found the discipline satisfactory, and the school work progressing according to the program of studies recommended by the State Department.

There were 6 visits by members of the School Board recorded, and 51 visits by parents and friends. There were only 5 cases of tardiness during the whole year, and three of them were on the first stormy day of a very severe winter, a very good record indeed.

On the Roll of Honor of perfect attendance are:

Edith Lambert, Emily Lambert, Raymond Read.

Billy Gregor was present every day and was tardy only once.

It would be a valuable addition to the training of our children to have more social events connected with the school. In the larger towns and cities the large number of social events actually interferes with school work and often with the health of the children, but we seem to have gone to the other extreme. The only social event for the school children of which I had notice was the Community Christmas exercises, which were excellently carried out and participated in by both children and adults. Such events are always among our most pleasant memories, and we can well afford to have a few more similar occassions.

The Superintendent wishes to express his appreciation of the faithful work of both Mrs. MacMahon and Mrs. Dolan, and of the hearty cooperation of the School Board and the citizens.
