ARTICLE 1.

To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE 2.

To receive reports of the Selectmen, Town Treasurer and other Town Officers including agents and committees and act thereon.

ARTICLE 3.

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the following sums for the following purposes, or take any action thereon.

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or direct the Selectmen to borrow repayable, \$3,000.00 annually, a sum not to exceed \$18,000.00, to purchase two new fire trucks, Meeting general specification.

ARTICLE 5.

To see if the Town will direct the Selectmen to appoint a committee of three, to improve the fire system of the town.

ARTICLE 6.

To see if the town will vote to increase the hourly pay of the Firemen, from \$1.00 to \$1.25 and the salary of the Janitor of the fire station, from \$67.50 per year to \$125.00 per year.

ARTICLE 7.

HOWARD STREET EXTENSION

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or direct the Selectmen to borrow, repayable \$2,000 annually, a sum not to exceed \$7,800.00 for the purpose of extending the Town Water System from the Wood Flour Plant on Howard St., to the home of Steven Kossokoski, a distance of approximately 2,540 feet.

ARTICLE 8.

SCOTLAND ROAD EXTENSION

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or direct the Selectmen to borrow, repayable \$2,000.00 annually, a sum not to exceed \$14,500.00 for the purpose of extending the Town Water System from the Philip Hyde Residence on Richmond Road a distance of approximately one mile on the so-called Scotland Road.

ARTICLE 9.

WARWICK ROAD EXTENSION

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or direct the Selectmen to borrow a sum not to exceed \$16,-844.32 repayable \$2,000.00 annually, for the purpose of extending the water system from Coomb's corner to the Fred Gately estate a distance of approximately 1.2 miles.

ARTICLE 10.

To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the purpose of rebuilding and tarring the Fiddle Hill road, from the Main road to a point opposite the Powell House a distance of approximately 600 feet.

ARTICLE 11.

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,000.00 to rebuild the Old Westport Road, starting North from the Lindstrom place.

ARTICLE 12.

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two thousand dollars (\$2,000) provided a like amount is donated by Hon. Francis P. Murphy, for the purpose of building and maintaining a permanent public wading pool and other play ground facilities, together with proper supervision at the Community Center. Not more than eight hundred dollars (\$800.) of said sum shall be used for said supervision.

This appropriation to be administered jointly by a committee of three members appointed by the Budget Committee and three members appointed by the trustees of the E. L. M. Memorial Association.

ARTICLE 13.

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$264.00 for the purpose of installing twelve street

lights on Warwick Road beginning at Coomb's Corner and stopping at a pole near Fred Gately's Residence, a distance of approximately 1.2 miles.

ARTICLE 14.

To see if the town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have the annual Audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting. This article to remain in effect until rescinded by vote of the town.

ARTICLE 15.

To see if the town will vote to direct the Selectmen to appoint a committee of five members, one each from the Fire Dept., Highway Dept., Budget Committee, Selectmen and one garage owner to purchase any vehicles authorized at this town meeting.

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of Taxes. This article to remain in effect until rescinded by vote of the town.

ARTICLE 17.

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to accept Trust funds in the name of the Town. This Article to remain in effect until rescinded by vote of the Town.

ARTICLE 18.

To see if the Town will vote to direct the Selectmen to appoint a committee of Five, one Selectman, one each from the V.F.W. Post and Auxiliary, and one each from the American Legion Post and Auxiliary, to investigate a suitable permanent War Memorial, and report at the next annual Town Meeting.

ARTICLE 19.

To see if the Town will vote to direct the Water Commissioners to install Flouridation in the Town Water System.

ARTICLE 20.

To see if the Town will vote to rescind the Article No. 47, voted at Town Meeting held March 12, 1935, adopting the Municipal Budget Act, this article to take effect upon passage.

ARTICLE 21.

To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen, Town Representatives, State Senator and District Councilor to take the necessary steps to establish a State liquor Store in Winchester, N. H.

ARTICLE 22.

To see if the Town will vote to direct the Selectmen, the Library Trustees and the School Board, to employ counsel to take the necessary legal steps to determine the use of the Town Library Building.

ARTICLE 23.

To see if the Town will vote to adopt the following by-laws

A. Building Permits—

No person shall erect a building, house or other structure, make any addition to existing structures nor move a building or structure in the Town of Winchester, unless a license in writing be granted therefor by the Selectmen. Applications for such license shall be accompanied by a fee of one dollar and the Water Department and Sewer Department shall make no connections to any structure as outlined above unless a license as provided herein has been granted by the Selectmen.

8. Taxis Control—

No taxis shall operate in the Town of Winchester except as licensed by the Board of Selectmen, Fee \$10.00.

C. Town Meetings—

Except for the election of officers and voting at the polls all other business to be transacted at town meeting shall be considered and acted upon at an adjourned business meeting at 7:30 P. M. on the Wednesday following town meeting day Effective 1953 and thereafter.

Whoever shall offend, or fail to comply with any of the provisions of these by-laws, shall, unless some other penalties provided by law, for each and every offense forfeit and pay a penalty of not less than \$2.00 and not more than \$20.00.

To see if the Town will vote to direct the Selectmen to immediately proceed to take any action necessary to collect any amounts due the Town from any person for the use of Highway Dept. equipment, labor and materials which have been owed the town more than six months.

To see what action the town will vote to take on the Airport work charged against George F. Brown Acc't Highways.

Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of an audit and examination of the accounts of the Town of Winchester for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1951, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Library Treasurer, Municipal Court, Fire Department, Playground Committee and Water Department. The records of the Trustees of Trust Funds were not completed for the fiscal year and were not available to the auditors at the time of the audit.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Comparative Balance Sheets: Dec. 31, 1950-Dec. 31, 1951: (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1950 and December 31, 1951, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein the Net Debt decreased by \$22,484.55 in 1951.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit A-2)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the town during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. These were as follows:

Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures — Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits A-3 and A-4)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1951, are presented

in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit A-4), a net overdraft of appropriations of \$6,290.71, plus a net revenue deficit of \$2,483.09, resulted in a net budget deficit of \$8,773.80.

Summary of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit B-1z)

A summary of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1951, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1951, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

Statement of Long Term Indebtedness: (Exhibit J)

A statement of long term indebtedness as of December 31, 1951, showing annual maturities of principal and annual interest requirements, is contained in Exhibit J.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds, with the exception of the Trustees of Trust Funds, were examined, and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the collector's records.

GENERAL COMMENTS

Appropriation Overdrafts:

The budget summary (Exhibit A-4) indicates:

Section 5 of Chapter 52, Revised Laws of New Hampshire, as amended, (Municipal Budget Act) the provisions of which have been adopted by the Town of Winchester, provides as follows:

"5. (Ch. 228, Laws 1949) Exceeding Appropriations. In towns adopting the provisions of this chapter, no board of selectmen, school board, commissioners of a village district wholly within said town, or other expending agency shall pay or agree to pay any money or incur any liability involving the expenditure of money for any purpose for which an appropriation has not been made, or in excess of any appropriation or allotment made to it, except for the purpose of paying judgments rendered against the town or school district or said village district, provided, however, that in case of sudden and unexpected emergency the selectmen or village commissioners on application to the tax commission and the school board on application to the state board of education, after hearing, may be given a certificate of emergency authorizing them to make such expenditure or incur such liability, provided that no such certificate of

emergency shall be granted unless the budget committee of the town has approved the expenditure. In cases arising during the year following the annual meeting where changes occur which make it unnecessary to use the amount appropriated for a specific purpose, an unexpended balance may be transferred by the board of selectmen or the school board or the village commissioners of such village district from one appropriation to another, provided the total amount expended for all purposes does not exceed the total amount appropriated at the town, school or village district meetings for all purposes."

It is noted, therefore, that contrary to the provisions of Section 5 of the Municipal Budget Act, — (1) expenditures exceeded total budgetary appropriations and (2) application was not made by the Board of Selectmen to the Tax Commission for authority to exceed appropriations except in the case of the appropriation for the fire department. In this instance a supplemental appropriation was made at a special town meeting to cover the costs of fighting forest fires.

Tax Accounts:

In the report of our previous audit, dated February 15, 1949, it was recommended that the uncollected and unredeemed tax lists of prior years, levies be carefully examined by the Board of Selectmen for the purpose of removing therefrom by abatement such taxes as appeared to be uncollectible, and by issuance of tax deeds to the town the unredeemed taxes in cases where the two year redemption period had expired.

Progress was made in this direction but further efforts should be made in respect to this matter. Uncollected and unredeemed taxes on account of tax levies of 1948 and prior years were found to be as follows:

Conclusion:

The accounts of all town officials which we examined were found in good condition and the accounting and financial procedure, with exceptions as noted herein, conformed to the prescribed methods and procedure.

The provisions of Section 31, Chapter 211, of the Laws of 1939, require that this report or a summary of its essential features shall be published in the next annual town report.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Town of Winchester for their assistance during the course of the audit.

FIRE DEPARTMENT REPORT

During the year 1951 the Fire Department responded to five general alarms, nineteen chimney fires and twenty-five still and miscellaneous alarms. These alarms were answered and the fires brought under control as promptly as possible. Five of these still alarms were emergency calls and over the year six tanks of oxygen were used in giving aid with the resuscitator. The value of the new resuscitator has been proven.

The new equipment purchased this year consists of six hundred feet of two and one half inch hose, fifty feet of booster hose, a deluge gun and two aluminum ladders. Three hundred and fifty feet of hose was lost in the forest fire this spring which was an unexpected expense. The insurance reimbursed the fire department for part of this, \$350.00, which was turned over to the Selectmen. Total cost of this equipment was over \$1500.00.

The cost of keeping the trucks in shape this year cost quite a little as the two old trucks needed many repairs. These trucks are old trucks and undoubtedly would not pass an underwriters test. We should think seriously about replacing them as soon as possible both for safety sake and the rising cost of everything. The longer we delay the more the cost.

At the present time all the Fire Department Equipment is in as good a condition as it is possible to have it. And I feel it is a credit to the town.

FOREST WARDEN REPORT

In the past year your local forest fire organization did a very fine job of pre-suppression and suppression of forest fires. Our early spring was very dry and with extra high winds and all our fires were during that period. We find that the general public is still very careless with matches and cigarettes.

In the "Keep America Green" program there is a story of two bad boys who cause most of our forest fires. The first one we call, "I don't care", he is the person that builds fires anywhere, never gets a permit to burn brush or has a safe place for his home incinerator. He is also very careless with matches and cigarettes. The other one is called, "I don't know any better", and the best way to describe him is a plain dunce. It is only with your help that these two bad actors are controlled. Their carelessness can be the cause of our pretty and valuable woodland to be destroyed by fire. Even your own home can be burned by them.

It is up to you and you alone to report these two characters to your local forest fire warden whenever you see them operating. To have our woodlands green and our mountain streams clear, your cooperation is needed by:

1. Seeing that your incinerator is tight and is sitting on clean ground.
2. Always clean a space about any open fire to prevent it from spreading.
3. Never burn in dry windy weather.
4. In all cases a written permit is required from your local town fire warden.
5. Be sure that your matches, cigarettes and pipe ashes are out before discarding.

It is with your cooperation that this shameful waste of timber and money can be stopped.

REPORT OF THE PLAYGROUND DIRECTOR

I hereby submit my report of the summer playground project for the year 1951.

This year the program was moved to the high school grounds, the previous site to the year 1950. The program extended from June 25 to August 17, a period of eight weeks.

A total of 188 children were registered, 80 in the 4 to 9 age group, and 61 girls and 47 boys in the 10 to 16 age group.

From 9:30 to 12:00 the older boys met at the high school. Because of the varied ages and the increase of boys from 9 to 11, two age groups were formed, the 9 to 11 and 12 to 16. This provided for equal standards in competition. A varied program was carried out in each group and proved successful.

Under the direction of Miss Dorothy Tacy the 4 to 9 age group met at the Community House from 9:30 to 12:00 in the morning. This was a mixed group. In the afternoon from 1:30 to 4:00 the older girls, age 10 to 16, met with Miss Tacy at the high school.

The younger group of children participated in a program of organized games and free play. The playground equipment was available to them with the addition of a large sand box. Toys and books were also provided. Their program was concluded with a picnic at the Musterfield Park.

On Tuesday and Thursday afternoons the older girls had swimming parties on the Tacy beach at Forest Lake. Monday and Wednesday afternoons programs of various athletic events were carried out. A handicraft program was introduced and accepted with much interest. Many articles were produced and exhibited at the end of the year.

This year's annual playground queen, elected at the end of the summer program, was Miss Donna Jean McNamara.

A list of the equipment available for the children to be used in various events may be found in the inventory list following the report.

The older boys trip to Boston was cancelled this year because of a conflict with our traveling time and the home games of both the Braves and the Red Sox. However, the girls did make a trip to the Benson Animal Farm. At the close of the playground program an all day mixed outing was held at the Tacy camp.

I wish to express my appreciation to Miss Tacy for having done a wonderful job this summer. This was the last year she will be with the playground. Her excellent leadership will be missed. To the Townspeople we express our thanks for their interest and cooperation in making this summer program another success.

New automatic controls mentioned in last year's report were installed in October of this year. These controls are of the float control type and afford a much more positive control of our water supply. With these controls it is now possible to keep our reservoir full to within one foot of capacity whereas previously we were at times down four to five feet below capacity.

The Fiddle Hill extension as voted last year will be completed as soon as weather conditions permit. The delay was due to our not being able to obtain pipe until such a late date that it was not possible to start construction in 1951.

It will be noted that our average daily consumption has increased during the year and it has been necessary to take steps to increase our pumping capacity. We have contracted for the installation of a 120 G.P.M. pump which we expect will be installed in the early part of 1952. With our present pump and the new pump we will have a capacity of 370 gallons per minute.

While our financial report shows a substantial balance it must be taken into consideration that commitments have been made, including the above mentioned pump, which will take approximately \$3,000.00 of this balance. Consideration must also be given to the fact that we have been fortunate in not having any major repairs. The Commissioners are of the opinion that we should maintain a substantial balance to take care of any major repairs which could well run into considerable expense.

As required, water samples are submitted monthly for analysis by the State Department of Health and reports continue to show the water to be of exceptional quality.

To the inhabitants of the School District in the town of Winchester qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the eleventh day of March 1952, at two o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the ensuing year.
2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
5. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
6. To choose Agents, Auditors, Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
7. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

8. To see if the district will authorize the school board to transfer the balance in the Center School Painting appropriation in the amount of three hundred thirty dollars and twenty-six cents (\$330.26) to the General Fund of the school district.

9. To see if the district will raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) for the purpose of constructing two additional classrooms at Thayer High School and in order to provide such funds to authorize the school board to issue and sell notes or bonds in the name of and on the credit of the district under and in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 5 of the Laws of 1951 and the Municipal Bond Statute and any amendments relating thereto; and to delegate to the school board authority to fix the time and place of payment of the principal and interest of said notes and bonds, the interest thereon, and the principal amount of each note or bond, and to sell the notes or bonds, and to take such other action with respect thereto as may be necessary or advisable.

10. If the preceding article is adopted, to see if the district will raise and appropriate the sum of five thousand six hundred dollars (\$5,600) for the purpose of paying the principal and interest due during the school year 1952-1953 on the loan for the high school addition or take any action thereon.

11. To see if the school district will vote to direct the school board to institute classes in (1) safe driving, (2) public speaking, and (3) swimming; and to raise and appropriate two thousand dollars (\$2,000) for said purposes.

Changes in the teaching staff for 1951-52 were as follows: Miss Shirley Adams resigned at the end of the last school year and was replaced by Miss Audrey Tucker who prepared for the work in Home Economics at Keene Teacher College. Mr. Kenneth Arminio, Latin and French, accepted a position in Connecticut at the end of the year. Mr. Nicola Carello, a graduate of Boston University took over the language work. Because of two very large classes which had to be divided Mrs. Marion Page of Keene was hired as a part time teacher.

Lack of room at the high school is presenting an ever more difficult problem. This year the music classes are held in the science laboratory. Classes have been held in the lunch room and in the main corridor. Wood Working and Domestic Art classes are twice as large as the rooms and equipment are supposed to accommodate. All indications point to a continued increase in enrollment for the next several years.

Considerable new equipment has been added to the Home Economics department. Home visits are being made to all those enrolled. The commercial classes are doing an increasing amount of work for various organization in town in typing and duplicating letters, forms and programs.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Winchester:

I have the honor to submit my fifth annual report.

Teachers: There have been two changes in the personnel of the elementary schools and two in that of the high school. Miss Mary F. White, a graduate of Keene Teachers College, was elected to fill the vacancy created by the resignation of Mrs. Eileen Duchesneau who accepted a position in the Cutler School in West Swanzey. Mrs. Theresa Taylor, a graduate of Keene Teachers College, was elected to take the place of Mrs. Anne V. Luoma who also resigned to accept a position at the Cutler School.

At Thayer High School, Mr. Kenneth Arminio left us to take a position in Woodbury, Connecticut. He was succeeded by Mr. Nicola Carello who was educated in his native Italy and who also holds a master's degree from Boston University. Mr. Carello teaches Latin and French. Miss Audrey Tucker, a graduate of Keene Teachers College, was elected to the Home Economics position replacing Miss Shirley Adams who resigned to be married.

After the opening of school, it was found that due to the large enrollment in the Freshman class it was necessary to have two sections of some of the courses. In order to take care of these additional classes, Mrs. Marion Page was engaged to teach during the morning at the high school. Mrs. Page has done work at the University of New Hampshire and at Keene Teachers College.

Buildings and Grounds: The exterior of the Center School was painted during the summer vacation. In addition, all windows were made to fit more snugly, all cracked and broken panes of glass were replaced, the cupola was made weather-tight, rotted boards were replaced and the metal roof on the ell was repaired. The building received two coats of white paint with green trim, the metal roof was painted to preserve it and the foundation was sprayed with a cement paint. The result is a decided improvement in the appearance of the building. What is more important, however, is that the building is now protected from the elements by a tough film of paint.

Mr. William Hyde, janitor at the Center School, completely repainted the fourth grade room on the second floor. The room was done in contrasting shades of green. All rooms on the second floor have now

been redecorated. Next summer should see a beginning on the first floor.

At Thayer High School, a major job of repointing the chimneys was performed. Hooks were also installed on the roof to prevent the snow from sliding down over the outside entrances. Mr. Clifford Monroe, janitor at the high school, reconditioned several rooms during the summer vacation. Mr. Monroe has also done considerable work in the Home Economics room. He has rebuilt two tables, covering them with masonite, and moved the cabinets to make room for a new placement of the refrigerator.

A new gas stove was purchased for the Home Economics Department. Acting on the recommendations of Miss Verna Payson, State Supervisor of Home Economics, the Winchester School Board also purchased two folding masonite tables and twenty-five folding chairs for the department. The Home Economics room has been improved greatly over the past few years and now compares most favorably with any in a school the size of Thayer.

It is impossible to predict accurately just what the enrollments will be during the next five years. Families move in and out of town and the figures will change from year to year. However, by projecting the numbers of pre-school children now shown on the census cards on the grade table printed above, at least an indication of future enrollments may be secured.

It is dangerous to use the figures in the above tables as factual. They assume that the pupils will all be promoted from year to year and that all will remain in school from grade 1 through grade 12. They assume also that all the pupils will continue to live in Winchester, none will drop out of school and no newcomers will be added.

However, recognizing their shortcomings, the figures do present an interesting picture. They indicate that the enrollment at the Center School will level off at between 230 and 240 for the next five years. Indications are that the enrollment at Ashuelot School will decline somewhat over the next five years. The situation at Thayer High School, however, is entirely different. Here there will be a steady increase in enrollment until 1957-1958 when the figure of 307 is over one hundred greater than last September's enrollment of 201.

The citizens of Winchester must become keenly aware of the problems we must face at Thayer High School. It is not simply a question of additional teachers but one of more space. Serious thought must be given to providing for an increased enrollment those facilities to which Thayer students have become accustomed.

In conclusion, I wish to express my appreciation to the teachers, pupils and parents, to the School Board and to the patrons of our schools for their cooperation.
