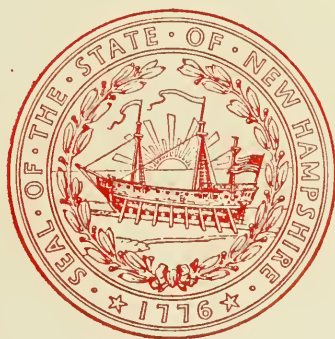


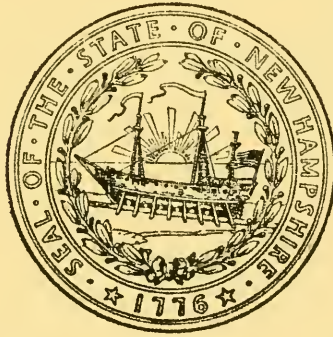

Six P. M. Business meeting will open at 7:30 P. M.)

2. To raise and appropriate such sums as may be
necessary to defray the following Town Charges for the
ensuing year.

3. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$666.08 for T. R. A. (The state to furnish the sum of \$4,440.52).

4. To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for the maintainance of Highways and Bridges except snow work.

5. To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for the Plowing and Sanding of Roads and Plowing Driveways in winter.

6. To see if the Town will vote to transfer the sum of \$1,000.00 from the Surplus in the General Fund to the Capitol Reserve Fund for the future purchase of Road Machinery.

7. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to be added to the Capitol Reserve Fund for the future Purchase of Road Equipment.

8. To see if the Town will Authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of Taxes.

9. To see if the Town will vote to buy a new Town Truck and to raise and appropriate money for same.

10. To see if the Town will vote to buy a Four Wheel Drive Truck and to raise and appropriate money for same.

11. To see if the Town will vote to have the State Tax Commission Revalue the Town and to raise and appropriate \$2,000.00 for same.

12. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for Pine Blister Rust Control.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$79.10 which is 1/100 of 1% of the assessed valuation of the Town, to the Lakes Region Association for the purpose of publicizing promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise the Road Agent and workers hourly rate of pay, and how much.

15. To see if the Town will vote to close subject to gates and bars the road from the Merrill farm to the Arbolton farm where it is already closed.

16. To see if the Town will vote to close subject to gates and bars the Ned Matthews Road to the Burns Cemetery Corner.

17. To see if the Town will vote to close subject to gates and bars the Church Hill Road at Four Corners.

18. To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate to Run Town Lines.

19. To see if the Town will vote to have the minutes of each Town Meeting recorded in the Town Report for easy reference to all. The preparation of same will be the duty of the Town Clerk and the Moderator.

20. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

Half days: April 12, Good Friday; last day of school.

This schedule provides for 186 days but school will close at the end of 180 days. Days lost due to storms or emergencies must be made up. Total number of days required by State Law is 180 with pupils in attendance.

Pupils must enter the first grade if six by Sept. 30 and may enter is six by Jan. 1.

Vaccination is required by State Law unless child has written excuse from doctor.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Again this year there is a substantial increase in the size of the budget. Two factors are responsible for this direct increase, namely another increase in the number of students attending high school, and teachers' salaries. The Bristol tuition rates are below the state average, even though both rates include the allowable 2% rental charge, but as the number of children entering high school increases, the total budget will increase. It now appears that this will continue for three more years. The shortage of qualified elementary teachers and the opportunities for teaching in single grade situations are increasing the difficulty of obtaining teachers in our multi-grade schools. This will inevitably result in either the merging of small districts into larger ones or a marked increase in salary offerings to make these positions more attractive to prospective teachers. The state average elementary teacher's salary for 1960-61 was \$4,415 and the yearly increase of this figure is more than \$200.

The increase of necessary expenditures in the above mentioned items is largely responsible for the size of the deficiency appropriation which is being requested for the current year.

An increasing portion of school costs is being put upon your property tax payers this year by a reduction in the amount of foundation aid from the State. There are two reasons for this, an increase in Alexandria's equalized assessed valuation, and a larger number of pupils in the State among whom the money available must be apportioned. A larger appropriation of State funds for aid to schools would certainly seem to be a worthwhile goal for future work.

With more pupils attending Bristol High School each year, and the resulting squeeze on its facilities, more space in that building will soon be required. Since the last session of the State Legislature enacted laws which seem to make the

apportionment of the costs of cooperative schools more equitable, this might be a good time to enter into a study of such a system. Such a study would not cost anything, and might lead to the formation of a high school in the operation of which folks in the surrounding Districts could participate.
