SUMMARY OF WARRANT

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Allenstown in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in the Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Fire Station in said Allenstown on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money, as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To hear and act upon the report of the Town Budget Committee.
- 4. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to give a one per cent (1%) discount on all 1954 taxes paid within thirty (30) days after the tax rate is approved.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of Chapter 171-A of the Revised Laws relative to playing games of Beano in this town.
- 8. (By Petition) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars to grade and oil Al's Avenue from the home of Alfred Coulombe

to the home of Maurice Martel, said avenue having been accepted by the Town in 1952.

- 9. (By Petition) To see if the Town will vote to extend the Town sewer from Turnpike Street to the residence of Julian Lavallee on River Road, a distance of approximately Three Hundred (300) feet, and to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Hundred (\$300.00) Dollars for that purpose.
- 10. (By Petition) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars to gravel Willow Street.
- 11. (By Petition) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars to oil Willow Street.
- 12. (By Petition) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Nine Thousand Two Hundred (\$9,200.00) Dollars for the purchase of a new fire truck equipped with pump and 1,000 gallon tank.
- 13. (By Petition) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars for repairs to the baseball field.
- 14. (By Petition) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to install and maintain a street light at the corner of River Road and Bear Brook Road at Allenstown Depot.
- 15. (By Petition) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Six Hundred (\$600.00) Dollars to install One Hundred Fifty (150) feet of sewer pipe along Al's Avenue in addition to the sewer pipe already existing thereon and extending same so as the new houses at the present time under construction can be connected to said sewer.
- 16. (By Budget Committee) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Hundred (\$300.00) Dollars to reimburse Boisvert and Tousignant for the installation of an emergency sewer to the river.

- 17 (By Budget Committee) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars to reimburse The Parish of St. Jean the Baptiste for installation of the sewer used by the new gym starting from Main Street and extending to Ferry Street.
- 18. To hear the reports of auditors, agents and committees or officers heretofore chosen, and to pass any vote relating thereto.
- 19. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The polls will be open until six o'clock in the afternoon.

Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of the annual audit and examination of the accounts of the Town of Allenstown for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1953, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the audit and examination were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector. Town Clerk and Trustees of Trust Funds.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Comparative Balance Sheets — Dec. 31, 1952-Dec .31, 1953: (Exhibit A)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1952 and December 31, 1953, are presentd in Exhibit A. As indicated therein the Net Debt increased by \$4,116.24 during 1953. Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit B)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit B, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein.

As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit D), a net revenue surplus of \$3,000.34, less a net overdraft of appropriations of \$2,676.86, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$323.48.

Summary of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit E)

A summary of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1953, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit E. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1953, is indicated in Exhibit F.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoice and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records.

GENERAL COMMENTS

Uncollected Taxes - Prior Years:

As indicated by Exhibit H, there were uncollected taxes on the tax warrants of 1950 and prior years as follows:

It is noted that during 1953, collections amounting to only \$6.60 were made on these warrants. (1950 Poll Taxes and Interest - \$4.40; 1949 Poll Taxes and Interest - \$2.20). It is therefore recommended that the uncollected tax lists on account of the tax levies of 1946 to 1950, inclusive, be carefully gone over by the Selectmen and Tax Collector and abatements made by the Selectmen of those taxes which appear to be uncollectible. Conclusion:

The provisions of Section 31, Chapter 211, of the laws of 1939, require that this report or a summary of its essential features shall be published in the next annual town report.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Town of Allenstown for their assistance during the course of the audit.

PEOPLE PLAY A VITAL PART IN OUR FOREST FIRE PROBLEMS

A review of the 1953 fire season proves the vital part people play in the never ending battle to prevent forest fires.

In this fire district there were 133 fires in 26 of the district's 30 towns; 409 acres were burned over and it cost \$949.97 to extinquish them. This figure was reduced somewhat through payment of fire costs by persons responsible for illegal fires, fires which escaped from control and fires caused by their carelessness. Costs were abnormally high this year due to protracted periods of dry weather which increased the difficulty of extinguishing fires.

Eighty-eight percent of the 113 fires were man-caused and could have been prevented. They telle a story which needs to be carefully studied. Some people were careless in disposing of smoking material and camp fires; others burned without the required warden permit - disregarding weather, forest conditions and the normal safeguards recognized and considered by the warden in issuing permits. Other fires resulted from children playing with matches, carelessly handled fireworks, faulty railroad and truck equipment, etc.

These fires cost a lot to extinguish, most of which could have been avoided — this affects taxes; local business was interrupted by men leaving their jobs to extinguish the fires; trees that might otherwise have built houses, repaired bridges and supplied raw materials for local industries were destroyed; seedling growth — the future timber crop was wiped out.

This picture can, however, be reversed if people who offend could be impressed with the importance of observing the simple but essential common sense safeguards that will prevent forest fires. They are:

- Care in disposing of lighted cigars, cigarettes and matches in and near woodlands.
- 2. Care in selecting camp fire sites and completely extinguishing them.

3. Consultation with the local forest fire warden before burning to secure the required permit.

People play a vital part in our forest fire problem.

It is EVERYONE'S job to HELP PREVENT FOREST FIRES.

ANNUAL REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

February 1, 1954

To the School Board of Allenstown:

May I present my seventh anual report of the public schools of Allenstown and the opportunity of thanking you for your help in conducting, administering, and solving the problems of the school district.

As you know, Mr. Everett C. Fitzgerald. Jr. and Miss Bernadette D. Benard left the system to accept more lucrative positions. They were replaced by Mr. Martin A. Vesenka as principal and teacher in Grades 6-7-8 and Miss Anne I. Kenney in Grades 1-2. We have been fortunate in having Miss Margaret M. O'Malley continue with us in Grades 3-4-5 for another year.

The enrollment has increased slightly and indications point unerringly to the fact that this enrollment will continue to increase, at least in the next five years. We have the largest enrollment since I have been in the district and the school census indicates continued growth.

Increased enrollments mean increased costs not only in the current expenses of the district, but also to keep the building and furniture in good repair. As you know, this was evidenced by the installation of a new pipe line for water last year, and the absolute need for the installation of a new heater to replace the 40-year old furnace which stopped functioning early in the fall. No one can foretell the next major repair job and that is one of the reasons why a close check has been made on the budget.

And that naturally leads us to the discussion of the budget for 1954-55. If you will study closely this important phase of school development and compare totals with the budget of a year ago, you will note that the increase come in Teachers' Salaries and Tuition. The greatest increase, of course, is in tuition because there will be about 40 students attending Pembroke Academy while the tuition rate has increased from \$250.00 to \$270.00 — \$20.00 more per pupil.

The Board is to be commended in attempting to keep the budget as low as possible in the face of increasing costs in tuition and salaries. This fact is shown very clearly by comparing per pupil costs with the average or state costs. The following chart attempts to show in a brief way this data.

Please note that per pupil costs have been steadily decreasing in the district as compared to the State average. This has been possible because the budget has remained fairly constant while state cost averages per pupil have increased. Probably this will continue as long as three teachers are adequate to handle the enrollment. When the number of pupils reach the point where another teacher is needed, then the per pupil cost will again be on the increase. However, unless there is a radical change in the next 2 to 5 years, the present staff should prove sufficient because three teachers should be capable of handling between 90 and 100 children and our total enrollment this year shows close to 70 pupils.

In further studying the proposed budget for 1954-55 you will note that there are five or six items which have been reduced and where there has been an increase the Board has tried to hold them to the minimum.

An example of this increase could be shown in transportation. Before the transportation contract was received and when the budget had to be in the hands of the printer, the contract price was \$100 more than was estimated and therefore this item in the 1954-55 budget had to be increased from \$1,500.00 to \$1,600.00. Also, your Board, for this year, has eliminated any amount for New Equipment because it felt that the new boiler was the more important.

The budget for 1953-54 - this year - called for \$24,968.00. The proposed budget for 1954-55 calls for \$26,056.00. The difference is \$1,088 and \$1,000 of this amount is for tuition. The other amount, \$88.00, is distributed through the entire budget.

Again may I this year commend your building custodian as well as the members of the entire Board for their pride and interest in keeping the building and grounds in such excellent condition. The addition and completion of the fence on the northeast side of the playgrounds has proved an important safety measure. My thanks to the children, teachers, and citizens of the town who have endeavored to make this school year pleasant and very much worth while.
