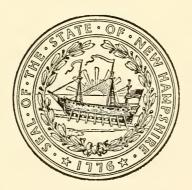

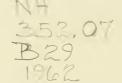

TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Bartlett in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall (Intervale School) in said Bartlett on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the voters will authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow a sum or sums not exceeding in the aggregate \$50,000.00 in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the current municipal year, and to issue in the name of the town and on the credit of same, negotiable notes therefor, said notes to be repaid during the current year from taxes collected within current municipal year.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to distribute the blank inventories at the same time they examine and appraise the property to be taxed.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through Tax Collector's deeds or by any other means.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 as the Town's share toward the operating cost of the Eastern Slope Regional Airport for 1963.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00.00 for the purpose of enlarging and improving the Library area and facilities, agreeable to a petition signed by Eva Grant and others.
- 8. To see if the town will vote to accept the deed submitted from the Bartlett Recreation Development Corporation dated December 3rd, 1962, to the Town of Bartlett certain land at the base of Big Attitash Mountain, leading from Route 302 southerly across the Maine Central Railroad, then easterly paralleling the railroad to Route 302 at Roger's crossing, for public highway purposes.
- $9.\ \,$ To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

LIBRARIAN'S REPORT

In 1962, our library had a book circulation of 5,974, an all-time high for our library. There were 212 new books added to the collection. 832 books were borrowed from the Bookmobile. We have increased the number of hours open during the school year by seven. On Monday we are now open from 7:30 to 8:30 and on Wednesday and Friday from 1:30

to 4:30

This year has been a very active one for the library. The PTA worked with us in preparing book exhibits. We held seven book exhibits and had four film programs. As a result of their cooperation with the library the PTA received a district award from the Sears Roebuck Foundation. The PTA also purchased \$150.00 worth of books for the library. Our library received first prize in a state-wide contest held during National Library Week by the State Library. Our prize was a set of World Book Encyclopedia. Our library was also fortunate to receive \$100.00 state aid grant to purchase children's books. Improving the children's book collection was our special project for the year. Due to increased demands in this field more books were needed. This year our special project will be to improve the adult book collection.

This year our library joined the Ossipee Bookbuying Cooperative. This is a group of libraries that meet to examine newly published books and hear reviews. Then we place our book order for our selections to the State Library. By doing this we are able to purchase books at a 36% discount as compared to our regular discount of 25%. This will enable us to buy more books as well as having the opportunity to see the books

before purchasing them.

Our fund-raising projects were a food sale netting \$50.00 and a Book Fair held in November, netting a profit of approximately \$50.00. Proceeds from the Fair were not compiled in time to include in this year's budget report.

Several 4-H girls have been assisting in the library this year and have

been a great help in getting books ready for circulation.

We have received a collection of approximately 400 books from Leo and Pauline Mallet-Prevost Ornstein. These books are gradually being put into circulation. We also received a gift subscription to the New Hampshire Profile, the Rotarian and the Natural History magazines.

Since 1959, when our library moved to its present location, our book circulation has increased 164%. We have received state aid grants three times to improve our services. However, we are now becoming cramped for space. There is available space directly behind the present library that could be used for expansion. This space is occupied by the present school shop but only one-half of this area is needed by the school to maintain a shop program for the junior high level. This additional space would make it possible to maintain a book collection of 5,000 books, which is the size of collection recommended for a town of 1,000 population; provide space needed to catalog books; cupboard space for cataloging equipment; floor space necessary for two tables, one in the adult section and one in the children's section. Recommendations made by the State Library also include tiling the floor and providing adequate heating. At the present time the temperature ranges from 50 to 60 degrees, hardly a comfortable temperature for anyone to come in and browse around. Estimates received on the recommendations come to \$2,500.00.

Our primary aim as a town library is to serve everyone's needs. By being located in the school, we have the unique opportunity to serve also as a school library. One library serving both needs is certainly a great

saving to our town.

REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN

PREVENTING FOREST FIRES IS OUR RESPONSIBILITY

Costs of suppressing carelessly set outdoor fires in New Hampshire in 1962 cost the persons responsible \$5,545. In the same period, the cost to the cities and towns for control of such fires for which no responsibility could be placed cost another \$24,634. What utter waste of tax money and what shameful and needless loss of timber and esthetic values in the 2200 acres burned. Residences, farms, and other business places were threatened with possible total destruction.

Carelessly set man-caused fires can be prevented if every citizen remembers his responsibility in regard to any sources of fires in the open. We can help to keep our fire loss low by remembering these simple rules.

- 1. Dispose of burnable waste at the town dump.
- If waste or brush is to be burned on the premises, obtain a permit from the forest fire warden. Seasonal permits may be issued for approved incinerators and sites.
- 3. Burn safely by picking a clean site, avoiding dry windy weather and preferably burning late in the day.
- 4. Have something to keep the fire under control pails of water, garden hose, sprinkling can, broom for grass fires or shovel will help.
- 5. Be sure your fire is dead out before you leave it.
- 6. If the fire gets out of control or if you see a fire out of control, report promptly to your warden or fire department. Continue to fight it until help arrives.

There is potential danger when matches fall into the hands of children. It is never too early for parents to instill in the child's mind a respect for fire.

Keep our town safe from fire.

In 1962 we had three fires. We burned one acre. Permits issued, 78.

REPORT OF SCHOOL SUPERINTENDENT

To the School Board and Citizens of Bartlett:

One of the highlights of the past year was the exceptionally fine program presented by the school children honoring Mrs. Lucille Garland on her retirement from our school system. This program was sponsored by our teachers and the Bartlett P.T.A. It assumed the proportions of a total community project to indicate to Mrs. Garland the community's deepest appreciation for the many wonderful years of devoted service to our schools.

Of the six teachers making up our teaching staff, three were new this year. Mr. R. Cliff Wing was graduated from Keene Teachers College and received his MEd degree in Educational Administration from Boston University. He has had prior teaching experience in Conway, Elliott, Maine, and Sudbury, Mass. Mr. Wing is our new principal and teacher of mathematics and science in grades seven and eight.

Miss Eleanor Lord, our new first grade teacher, was graduated from Gorham State Teachers College. She has had three years of teaching experience in Sanford, Maine.

Miss Dorette Buller is teaching grade two. She was graduated from Blackburn College in Carlinville, Illinois, and this is her first teaching assignment.

Two of our teachers, Mr. Wing and Miss Buller, completed a course in Modern Mathematics entitled "Foundations of the Number System." This will prove most helpful, since courses in Modern Mathematics will be introduced in grades one and two next year.

Bartlett is to be congratulated for its special effort to have a good elementary school. Of all the districts in our school union, Bartlett has the least wealth, but this has not been a deterrent factor in your great effort to provide the best possible education for your boys and girls. This year's budget shows an increase of approximately \$12,000 over last year. Of this increase about \$10,000 is for high school tuition resulting from an increase in the rate of tuition from \$495.00 to \$560.00 per pupil as well as an increase in the total number of students that will be enrolled at Kennett High School. Approximately \$2,000 has been added to teacher salaries, but the other items of the budget are about the same as last year.

For the first time in many years, Bartlett received a small amount of money in State Foundation Aid. The \$4,125.70 was helpful, but realistically this is a meager contribution by the State. In Bartlett the school tax is now about 75% of the total property tax and this figure is likely to increase. Our State ranks fiftieth in its support of education. If, as it is written in our constitution, education is a state function; then should not New Hampshire assume its rightful position as a full and responsible partner in the education of the children and youth of our state?

I want to express my appreciation to the Bartlett School Board for the many enjoyable hours we have spent together in the interest of education, and for their guidance in the administration of school affairs; to the teachers for their continued endeavor to improve the instructional program; to the Bartlett P.T.A. for its efforts to help the school in many ways; and to the Selectmen for developing and expanding the play area in the back of the school.

Report of School Nurse

1961 - 1962

The annual health service offered the children of the Bartlett school consists of vision and hearing testing, physical and dental examinations for grades 1, 4 and 7 at the Memorial Hospital. Children participating in the sports program are examined at the school. School physical inspections include teeth, height, weight, posture, nutrition, health habits, hair, skin, and First Aid.

Our school program is greatly assisted by the State Department of Health Clinics. The Orthopedic Clinic is held twice a year at the Memorial Hospital. Eyes corrected for those who need help. Salk vaccine by State nurses: and Patch testing for Tuberculosis, followed by chest x-ray where needed. The State Dental Program at the Incoming First Grade Clinic.
