# TOWN WARRANT

### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Chatham in the County of Carroll in said State, gualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in the Town House in said Chatham on Tuesday, the twelth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see if the Town will vote to allow a two percent (2%) discount on all property taxes to be paid inside of thirty days from receipt of tax bills.

4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to donate \$200 of the Fire Department appropriation to Saco Valley Fireman's Association.

5. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate \$25 for Civil Defense.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$100 for a donation asked for by the Eastern Slope Airport Authority, Inc.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$1306 for high school transportation asked for in a petition signed by Herbert N. Perry and others.

8. To see what action the Town will take on constructing and maintaining a town dump. The cost being about \$800 as shown in the budget. 9. To see what action the Town will take upon the Budget submitted by the Budget Committee.

10. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

## **Report of Forest Fire Wardens**

Preventing Forest Fires is Our Responsibility

Costs of suppressing carelessly set outdoor fires in New Hampshire in 1962 cost the persons responsible \$5,545. In The same period, the cost to the cities and towns for control of such fires for which no responsibility could be placed cost another \$24,634. What utter waste of tax money and what shameful and needless loss of timber and esthetic values in the 2200 acres burned. Residences, farms, and other business places were threatened with possible total destruction.

Carelessly set man caused fires can be prevented if every citizen remembers his responsibility in regard to any source of fires in the open. We can help to keep our fire loss low by remembering these simple rules.

1. Dispose of burnable waste at the town dump.

2. If waste or brush is to be burned on the premises, obtain a permit from the forest fire warden. Seasonal permits may be issued for approved incinerators and sites.

3. Burn safely by picking a clean site, avoiding dry, windy weather and preferrably burning late in the day.

4. Have something to keep the fire under control - pails of water, garden hose, sprinkling can, broom for grass fires or shovel will help.

5. Be sure your fire is dead out before you leave it.

6. If the fire gets out of control or if you see a fire out of control, report promptly to your warden or fire department. Continue to fight it until help arrives.

There is potential danger when matches fall into the hands of children. It is never too early for parents to install in the child's mind a respect for fire.

### REPORT OF SCHOOL NURSE 1961-1962

The annual health service offered the children of the Chatham School consists of vision and hearing testing, physical examinations and inspections.

Monthly visits were made to the school and at this time, the teacher was given an opportunity to talk with me concerning the health of the pupils.

In the fall, 9 pupils received physical and dental examinations at the Memorial Hospital. Twenty-eight vision tests were done, three defects were discovered and corrected. Thirteen hearing tests were done. One pupil had wax removed from ear. Eight teeth defects were discovered and nine pupils had defects corrected. One pupil went to the New Hampshire State Child Guidance Clinic.

During the school year I made eleven classroom inspections, two 1st Aid Treatments and twenty-seven home visits. A sample of water from the school was sent to Concord for testing. I attended a Health Workshop in Concord and another at Plymouth Teachers College.

Once again I wish to thank the parents who have been so cooperative in the corrections of defects found through screening and examinations.

My thanks also to the members of the School Board, the Superintendent, and Teachers for their help.

We must continue in our efforts to promote optimum health in the bodies and minds of our children that they may gain full benefit from the educational facilities provided for them.

#### REPORT OF EASTERN SLOPE AIRPORT AUTHORITY

The year 1962 has seen further progress at Eastern Slope Regional Airport, but only through the generous donations of time and effort of interested persons, institutions and municipalities. Only the eight towns of Bartlett, Bridgton, Brownfield, Fryeburg, Jackson, Lovell, Stow and Sweden contributed to operation expense, and without private donations the condition of the Authority would have been very poor.

An administration building has been erected at an expense exceeding \$7, 500.00, half of which was paid by the State and the other half of which was obtained by donations and borrowing.

A modern gasoline installation has been made with both 80 and 100 octane gas.

A start has been made on industrial promotion, in cooperation with the Fryeburg Chamber of Commerce. Although details may not yet be made public, the Maine Department of Economic Development is even now working on a prospective industry for location at or near the airport.

It has for some months been evident to yourdirectors that no operator could be obtained for the airport unless hangar and workshop facilities were erected. A grant in December 1962 from the County of Oxford will make this possible by the summer of 1963.

Traffic has increased at the airport markedly as word gets about that it is lighted and plowed year 'round. Over 600 aircraft landed at the airport in 1962. The directors icel that the airport is on the verge of proving itself a success for the area, if support will be continued for a few more years.
