

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Colebrook, in the County of Coos, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs:—

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town of Colebrook on Tuesday, the 11th day of March, next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To bring in your ballots for the election of Town Officers to be elected by ballot for the Town of Colebrook for the ensuing year.
- 2. To act upon all other following articles contained in this Warrant.
- 3. To see if the Town will instruct its Selectmen to appoint all other Town Officers as required by law.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to approve Town Charges as shown by the Budget and raise money for the payment of same.
- 5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Police for the ensuing year.
- 6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to appropriate for care or removal of trees affected

by Dutch Elm Disease.

- 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Civilian Defense for the ensuing year.
- 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for sewer maintenance for the ensuing year.

- 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for maintenance of the Town Dump for the ensuing year.
- 10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the maintenance of Summer and Winter Roads, for the ensuing year.
- 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Street Lighting for the ensuing year.
- 12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the General Expenses of the Highway Department for the ensuing year.
- 13. To see if the Town will raise the sum of \$899.16 for maintenance, construction or reconstruction of Class V highways, in which event the State will contribute \$5,994.37.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to remove the snow from the business area of the village, defining the area to be cleared, and to raise money for the same.
- 15. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for plowing and sanding sidewalks, for the ensuing year.
- 16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for support of the Town Library for the ensuing year.
- 17. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the Town Poor for the ensuing year.
- 18. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for Old Age Assistance for the ensuing year.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$300. for the observance of Memorial Day and care of the Monument Lot.

- 20. To see if the Town will vote to maintain a free skating rink for the ensuing year, and to raise the money necessary for same.
- 21. To see if the Town will vote to purchase and maintain the property in front of Beaver Brook Falls, to be used as a Public Park, and to be known as the "Leavitt Gould Memorial Park", and to appropriate the money for same; maintenance of the park to be in accordance with the wishes of Fay Keazer; namely, that it not be used for commercial purposes, but only as a public park and that a large field stone or boulder be set, bearing a placque stating that the property has been purchased from the Keazer family, and will be maintained in memory of Leavitt Gould.
- 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1500. for Hydrant Rental for the ensuing year.
- 23. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for care of cemeteries for the ensuing year.
- 24. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to the Colebrook and North Country Chamber of Commerce, for the purpose of publicizing and promoting, by advertising folders and otherwise, the Town and the North Country Region.
- 25. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$274.48 to the White Mts. Region Association, being 10 cents per \$,1000. of assessed valuation, for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter and advertising and otherwise publicizing the advantages of the Town, in cooperation with the other 45 towns in the region.
- 26. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$325. for payment of rent of the Parking Lot and Driveway for the year ensuing.

- 27. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for replacing the sidewalk on the north side of Parsons Street, from the Main Street corner to the Ellen Stickney property, and for maintenance of existing sidewalks.
- 28. To see if the Town will vote to purchase a payloader, complete with plowing equipment, said to replace the present payloader and one snow plow, and appropriate money for the same.
- 29. In the event Article 28 is not voted, to see if the Town will vote to purchase a truck and snow plow, and appropriate money for same.
- 30. To see what sum of money the Town will appropriate for tarring streets and for cleaning the street in the busines area this summer.
- 31. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to use as much as may be required of the proceeds received from parking meters, to pay such appropriation as may be voted under Article 30.
- 32. To see if the provision of Chapter 171-A of the Revised Laws relative to playing Beano, shall be adopted in Colebrook.
- 33. To see if the Town will vote to give free use of the Town Hall to public schools in said Town for school purposes, including heat, light and janitor services, whenever same does not conflict with the best interests of the Town, for the year ensuing.
- 34. To see if the Town will vote to amend Section 8 of Article 4 of the Zoning Ordinance adopted March 12, 1956, by deleting the second paragraph of said section and inserting in lieu thereof the following.

"Property owners with business, professional or service enterprises shall be allowed two ad-

vertising signs not to total over thirty six square feet in area for each sign; also, two signs pertaining to the lease, sale, or use of a lot or building on which placed, not to exceed a total area of five square feet. This provision shall not apply to signs placed flush with the front of and against the actual business building."

- 35. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money to defray the expenses of the Town in anticipation of taxes for the year ensuing.
- 36. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell at public auction any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collectors' deeds, and until the sale is made, to administer such property in the best interests of the Town.
- 37. To see if the Town will vote to accept, ratify and confirm the reports of Agents, Selectmen, Auditors and all other Town Officers as contained in the Annual Report of said Town for the year ending December 31, 1957.
- 38. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

To the Citizens of Colebrook:

During the year 1957, 4 Salk Vaccine Clinics were held in Colebrook at the Town Hall, sponsored by the N. H. State Department of Health, in cooperation with the local School Nurse, the Supt. of Schools, and the P. T. A. 1386 children attended these clinics, 245 received first injections, 444 received second injections, and 697 received third injections. We will hold the last clinic in June 1958, for those needing to complete their third injections.

We are indeed grateful to the Town for the use of the Town Hall, to all the physicians in Colebrook for giving of their time, and especially to P. T. A., and all the volunteers without whom these clinics would

not have been a success.

In the Spring of 1957, Triple Toxoid Clinics for the Immunization of Whooping Cough, Diptheria and Tetanus, were held, and the following number of children completed their series of 3 injections:

Infant 45, Preschool, 89, School 89, and 32 child-

ren received Boosters.

It has been a pleasure to work with the Citizens of Colebrook, and at this time I would like to thank them for their cooperation, and at any time I hope they will feel free to call on me if I can be of any service to them.
