STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitanat of Dalton, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Dalton on Tuesday, the 10th day of March next at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects. The polls will be open at 12 o'clock.

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

2. To choose a Delegate to the Constitutional Convention.

3. To vote on the question "Shall sweepstake tickets be sold in this town?"

4. To see if the Town will vote to give the Selectmen the right to issue temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.

5. To see if the Town will accept the Budget for 1964 prepared by the Selectmen and appropriate the amounts therein or to make any changes.

6. To see if the Town will vote to elect or authorize the Selectmen to appoint a committee to investigate building codes, housing codes, zoning ordinances, etc.

7. To see if the town will vote an ordinance regulating operation and maintenance of junk yards.

8. To see if the Town will vote to give the Tax Collector the right to accept payments on account of the annual property tax in multiples of not less than \$10.00.

9. To see if the Town will vote to establish an Aeronautical Fund, in accordance with the Revised Statutes Annotated, Chapt. 423:6.

10. (If the vote on No. 9 is in the affirmative). To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Thousand Four Hundred Twenty-five Dollars (\$2,425.00) and pay such sum into the Aeronautical Fund.

11. (If the vote on No. 10 is in the negative). To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Thousand Four Hundred Twenty-five Dollars (\$2,425.00) and pay such sum into the Aeronautical Fund and for this purpose to authorize the Selectmen to borrow upon the note of the Town a sum not in excess of Two Thousand Four Hundred Twenty-five Dollars (\$2,425.00) at such rate of interest and payable at such time and place, in accordance with Revised Statutes Annotated, Chapter 33, and amendments thereto, entitled "Municipal Finance Act," as the Selectmen shall decide.

12. (If the vote on No. 9 and No. 10 or No. 11 is in the affirmative) To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen, in accordance with the Revised Statutes Annotated, Chapter 423:8, to transfer the sum of Two Thousand Four Hundred Twenty-five Dollars (\$2,425.00) from the Aeronautical Fund to the New Hampshire Aeronautics Commission said sum to be expended by said New Hampshire Aeronautics Commission on the Whitefield Regional Airport, so-called, in connection with the expansion of said airport facilities.

13. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

Health Report

To the Citizens of the Town of Dalton:

During the year 1963, 101 visits were made in the town. These visits were as follows:

Administration & Promotion 11 Antepartum 2 Communicable Disease 2 Crippled Children's Services 6 Health Supervision 56 School 17 Sight Conservation 7

In February, Child Conferences for preschool children were initiated on a monthly basis. Forty four children received physical examinations. The following defects were encountered: 2 cases of strabismus, one of which is under treatment and will have further evaluation. Flat feet, responding to exercises, pronation of right foot, this case referred to the Crippled Children's Services, 3 cases of malnutrition, each of which is under medical treatment, extremely poor dentition in 2 children, both of whom are now receiving treatment. Twenty one children were vaccinated, eight children received Triple Toxoid Boosters, four children started the Triple Toxoid Series, and two finished the series. These conferences were a good health education tool for the parents and the children, and deviations from the normal have been treated or referred sooner than they otherwise would have been without conference. Dr. Elwin Falkenham was the attending physician, and we are most grateful to him for his assistance in the program. It is expected now, that we will resume these conferences again in February 1964, and we hope parents will again avail themselves of this service.

The Heaf testing program for tuberculosis was carried out in the school in April, and 36 children were tested. Forty three people from Dalton attended the Chest Diagnostic Clinic in Whitefield in April.

One child attended the Orthopedic Clinic in Berlin during the year.

It is hoped that possibly a Preschool Dental Program can be started this summer, as we feel the need for this program is quite evident.

It is always a pleasure to work with the Citizens of Dalton and I wish to extend my appreciation to them for their cooperation during the past year.

To the School Board and Citizens of Dalton:

It is with mixed emotions that I submit to you my annual report relative to your school. It has been my pleasure to have served you as superintendent in Dalton for the past seventeen years.

I am pleased that the citizens of Dalton voted to become a part of the White Mountains Cooperative District. I feel that this is a step in the right direction and will assure your children the same opportunities for an education as are provided children from the larger school districts.

School opened in September with a total enrollment of 62 pupils as compared with 75 pupils one year ago.

There have been no changes in the teaching staff since my last report. Mr. Perley Wells was appointed custodian in the fall to replace Mr. Willard Streeter who resigned. Mrs. Vera Bacon continues to do an excellent job in the school lunch program. Mrs. Blakslee continues on a part-time basis for special reading. The results of her work are evident in the improvement made by a number of pupils.

During this past summer the entire area in the rear of the building was graded and covered with loam and seeded. This project will improve that particular area greatly. Mr. W. Scott Aldrich assumed supervision of the entire project and shou'd be commended for a job well done.

A school district meeting will be called to take care of certain legal matters pertaining to the change over from a local school district to a member of a cooperative district. All costs for the operation of your school will henceforth be a part of the cooperative district budget.

Included in this report will be the report of the school nurse who continues to serve the health of your children in a very efficient manner. You will also find the statistical report, financial report, teacher list and tuition list for the present year.

In closing, I wish to express my sincere appreciation to the citizens of Dalton, the members of the school boards with whom I have enjoyed working during the past seventeen years, and all other school district personnel for their cooperation.
