

## TOWN WARRANT

The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Danbury in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Danbury on Tuesday, the 8th day of March, next at one of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

Business meeting on all other articles to begin at 7:30 P. M.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of Highways.

4. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for maintenance and repair of Bridges.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$911.35 T.R.A. money and receive the State's contribution of \$6075.68.

6. To see if the Town will raise the sum of \$250.00 for the George Gamble Library.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$600.00 to meet the necessary expenditures of the Danbury Volunteer Fire Department.

8. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for the care of Cemeteries.

9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

10. To see if the Town will raise the required sum of \$100.00 and appropriate same for Forest Fire Division.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise the required sum of \$45.60 for the Control of White Pine Blister Rust.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding \$60.00 for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural resources of the Town with other towns in the Dartmouth\_Lake Sunapee Region Association.

13. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 to publicize and promote the natural resources of the Town with other towns in the Newfound Region Chamber of Commerce.

14. To see if the Town will raise the sum of \$25.00 for Old Home Day.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$50.00 for Civil Defense.

16. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,070.00 principal and interest due on long term note.

17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell real estate taken by the Town for non-payment of taxes or by Tax Collector's deed.

18. To see if the Town will vote to transfer the unexpended balance of the 1965 Forest Fire Appropriation to a Capital Reserve Fund to be used for the purchase of Forest Fire Equipment. Amount \$57.78).

19. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow a sum not to exceed \$7,500.00 to be used for the the purchase of a truck with dump body and snow plow. The entire sum to be paid in three equal payments, plus interest, on April 1, 1967, April 1, 1968 and April 1, 1969. Funds for this purpose to be raised and appropriated each year at Town Meeting.

20. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to investigate the requirements pertaining to establishing a Planning Board.

21. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

## SELECTMEN'S REPORT

1965:

During the past year we had several problems arise that brought about increased expenditures that were not anticipated at last town meeting.

The first and most important was brought about by an act of the Legislature which changed the percentage of Danbury's share of the Cooperative School Budget from 9.69% to 11.57%. This change, together with the increase in the school budget, raised our school tax from \$2.26 per \$100 to \$2.40 per \$100.

We were able to keep our tax rate the same as 1964 only because of the increase in total valuation of the town brought about by new construction.

The overdraft in the town budget by the fire dept. was caused by the unfortunate destruction of the Cora Sargent house last summer. We would like to commend the fire dept. for their work at this fire and for their fast action in summoning help from neighboring towns. This fire could have destroyed a large portion of the center of the town had they not brought it under control before it spread to the adjacent buildings.

The highway dept. is still a major problem. The cost of labor and materials has been steadily increasing during the past ten years, but we have not been keeping up with the added expenses. We have over 50 miles of roads to maintain, a great portion of which are still gravel. Most of these gravel roads have been neglected in the past due to lack of funds to properly maintain them.

There was a time when many of these roads could be closed during the winter and spring until they dried out, but now we have people living on these back roads

and we have to maintain them all year. This problem will exist until all roads are brought up to proper grade by filling and draining.

Highway maintenance can no longer be a part-time job if we are to keep up with the demands caused by the heavy travel on our roads all year.

Last year we appropriated \$7,000 for highway maintenance. Actual expenditures were \$9,016.76.

The funds we had reserved from 1964 were expended to seal some of the paved roads in an effort to save what we have before they break up due to cracks in the pavement.

While the paved roads do not require the constant maintenance that the gravel roads need, they do have to be sealed every five or six years and the edges cut back to keep the water from getting under the pavement.

Our TRA Funds and the balance of our Class V maintenance funds were used to complete last year's projects by sealing the newly paved roads and continuing the project started at Waukeena Lake many years ago. We now have a paved road from the lake to High Street. Unfortunately, we ran short of money before completing this project and had to borrow \$1,567.75 from next year's funds. If this job wasn't completed it would have meant extra expense to bring equipment back into this area in the coming year to complete a little over one tenth of a mile of road.

Our bridge projects worked out well and we were able to rebuild Huntoon Bridge with steel decking and replace the small bridge on the road to the Chellis home and the bridge on the Hiller Road with concrete pipe.

1966:

Once again we are asking for \$2,000 to continue our bridge repairs. The Tupper Bridge on Walker Road must be replanked this year. This bridge can be replanked with steel bridge plank for about the same cost as Huntoon Bridge and eliminate the need of future maintenance. We also have several small bridges that can be replaced with concrete pipe.

Our TRA project for this year will be the completion of the project started on Walker Road a few years ago. This road has been improved considerably, but if it isn't paved this year we will have to spend much more money in the future to replace the gravel we have already put on it.

We are asking for an increase of \$2,000 for highway maintenance this year. We believe this is the minimum amount we need to properly maintain our roads.

Our other highway problem involves our town truck. The repair bills on this piece of equipment are getting larger each year. We believe the truck is still of some value to the town, but don't feel it would be profitable to try to run it through another winter.

We don't think this truck is large enough for the heavy work required when plowing and winging back snow. We are proposing on the warrant that the town purchase a new truck. If this article proves favorable, we would appoint a committee to draw specifications for a new truck to be purchased sometime in October, for delivery in November.

The turn-in of our present truck would be such a small sum that we feel it would be better to keep it for a second truck for plowing snow and light work. This

would eliminate the need of hiring extra equipment for plowing snow. With reasonable care and without the burden of plowing the steep hills and winging snow it should last a few more years.

We realize the cost of this truck would be too much of a burden on the tax payers this year, so we have proposed the method of payment outlined in the warrant.

You will also notice an increase in the budget for insurance. This is due to the town paying the insurance on the fire trucks so the fire dept. can use their appropriation to buy much needed fire hose.

The other increase in the budget is for Social Security. This is brought about by the increased percentage of payments as of January first of this year.

The total increase in the estimated town budget this year amounts to \$2,357.51 over last year. The estimated school budget will be an increase of \$5,728.11 over last year.

We would like to call your attention to Article 20 on the warrant. A lot of people have shown interest in the future of our town. The selectmen are already burdened with more duties than they can properly handle so we believe a planning board is necessary to carry out the duties pertaining to future planning for the growth of our town.

If this article is voted upon favorably, we shall investigate the requirements and duties of such a planning board and report to you at next town meeting.

## FIRE COMMISSIONERS' REPORT

The year 1965 has passed by and again the Fire Department is deeply indebted and grateful for the loyal support they have received from the taxpayers and general public.

We regret very much the loss of two sets of buildings in town, the Robie place on North Road and the Sargent place in town now owned by Dalrymple. We fully realize that when a set of buildings is lost that we lose the taxes on said buildings also therefore that tax revenue has to be divided up among all taxpayers in town in order meet the town budget. Both of these fires had a very good start before being discovered therefore our only chance was to try and keep them under control and stop them from spreading to other buildings. At both these fires we had very long stretches of 2½" hose to lay from the fire to the source of water and had it not been for our purchasing 350 ft. of 2½" hose this year we would not have been able to reach the water supply especially at the Dalrymple fire where we stretched up towards the Silver Bridge to the Smith River using 1500 ft. of hose with 2 lengths left over which we let Grafton use so they could get water to the fire.

As you can see by the treasurer's report we spent this past year from our appropriation \$473.00 for 350 ft. of 2½" hose and foam.

Again this year we are asking the taxpayers for \$600.00 to operate the department hoping to be able to use some of this money to purchase additional 2½" hose to build up our supply.

Hoping this will meet with your approval and again we sincerely thank you for your help and cooperation.

Most of us who live in New Hampshire and the thousands of vacationists that visit us every year love the State for the variegated woodlands that encircle our clean lakes and clothe the hills and mountains. Most of us appreciate these values, but still there were enough careless people among us to cause over 880 grass and woodland fires to start in 1965. True this was a much dryer than normal year but this should have meant the use of extra care. Fortunately the fire fighting forces have held the line against such careless acts. It is up to each one of us to be ever mindful that a spark or flame is a potential fire.

### *We Must All Be Careful:*

1. To teach our children the danger in lighting matches.
2. To never discard lighted smoking material from a car or while walking through fields or woods.
3. To safely dispose of rubbish or brush;
  - a. Always obtain a permit to burn from the warden.
  - b. Start fires late in the day after 5:00 p.m.
  - c. If burning a field or brush have equipment and adequate help on hand. The heat from your fire creates its own draft to spread fire.

Our carelessness with fire is costing our State and Towns thousands of wasted dollars in suppression and hundreds of acres of destroyed woodlands. Yours never to enjoy.

## RAGGED MOUNTAIN SKI NEWS

The results of last summer's trail work pleased our skiers this winter season. The 80 acres of cleared trails and open slopes were widened, graded, smoothed, seeded and mulched. Rocks were handpicked by the thousands and the bulldozer moved boulders, stumps, brush and earth. This busy summer crew cut a new trail, widened others, laid a network of underground drains and dug and relocated waterbars all over the mountain. All of this preparation was to enable us to ski on very little snow, Consequently the skiing has been GREAT this winter season with the exception of the two periods of winter thaw the weatherman threw at us.

During this ski season we have created much interest in our new Chalet Village located adjacent to the ski slopes. Two chalets have already been built and several others will be started this spring. These attractive wooded sites, located so that you can ski to your own dooryard, are available from the Ragged Mt. Corporation. Plans for summer recreation as well are in the near future.

**Junior Ski Program:** The newly organized Ragged Mountain Ski Club, Inc., in cooperation with the Danbury P.T.A., and the Ragged Mt. Ski area management began a junior program for elementary school students from Grades 3 through 6 this winter. The program started January 17 and will continue for 10 weeks. The children are let out of schoolrooms at 1:30 p.m., on Mondays and bussed to the ski area for ski lessons between 2 and 4 p.m. These lessons are provided free to the Danbury children by a group of volunteer ski instructors. The children are granted free use of the ski lifts by Earle Chandler, Manager of Ragged Mountain Corporation during their lessons as well as at school

vacation and weekends. Of the 41 students in Grades 3 through 6, 29 signed up for ski lessons. Many parents purchased ski equipment for their children. The Ragged Mt. Ski Club donated 8 sets of brand new skis and poles and other numerous donations from merchants and townspeople made it possible to outfit every child who lacked boots, skis or poles. This equipment is loaned free to the children for the ski season and will be returned to the ski club for repair maintenance and re-assignment next year to any child without equipment.

It is the intention of the Ragged Mt. Ski Club that any child who wishes to learn to ski and who has parental permission can do so. No charges are made, the program is free to the children. The P.T.A. takes care of the transportation of both the children and the skis and Florence Haynes and Carol Purdy act as supervisors for the children at the Base Lodge each Monday afternoon. The program is proving highly successful. The progress of the children has been remarkable. Clayton Nowell of Wilmot is Director of the program.

Instructors are: Bebe Wood, Bristol; Alice Chandler, Wilmot Flat; Pat Moran, Maisie Russell, Nancy Dittmann, Joan Baker, Betsy Dole, Ann Knott, all of Danbury. Hans Jaeger, Director of Ragged Mt. Ski School, acts as advisor to the volunteer instructors and holds periodic clinics on ski teaching technique. An important part of the Junior program is a 10 minute indoor lecture preceding each lesson on skis. These talks introduce the children to various components of skis and skiing equipment, safety on skis, care of equipment and good manners for every skier.

Ragged Mountain Corporation is grateful to the road crew for their prompt and efficient service in keeping the access road to the ski area in good shape.
