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

TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Epping, in the County of Rockingham, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Epping on Tuesday, the eight day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for roads and bridges.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money as per contract with the Portsmouth Power Co.
- 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Public Library.
- 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to defray Decoration Day expenses.
- 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for winding the town clock.
- 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Class V Highways \$567.28 on condition that the State contribute \$2269.13.
- 9. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Fire Department.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400 for control of blister rust, on condition that the State contribute \$600.
 - 11. To see if the town will vote to discontinue a

certain section of highway no longer necessary for public travel by reason of relocation.

- 12. To see if the town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$1500 for the year 1938, on condition that the State contribute \$4500, for the continuation of the improvement of road leading off the north Epping road to Hedding Camp Ground and the Newfields town line in the town of Epping.
- 13. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3540 on condition that the State contribute \$7,080.33 to build so-called Tilton Bridge.
- 15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 for the construction of a sewer on the Acre, so-called.
- 16. To see what action, if any, the town will take in regards to the use of the Town Hall for the use of basketball games.
- 17. To see if the Town will appropriate the sum of \$5000, to pay an endebtedness to the Exeter Banking Co., said amount to be raised by the sale of the Town's Notes or Bonds, to be issued in accordance with the Municipal Bond Statute of the State of New Hampshire.

REPORT OF HEALTH OFFICER

I herewith submit my report as Health Officer for the year ending January 31st, 1938.

The following contagious diseases were reported to me; Four measles, four scarlet fever and two syphilis.

At the last session of the legislature three important bills were passed, Barbering Practice, Hairdressing and Beauty Culture and the Blood Test Marriage Certificate requirement. At the request of the Barbers' Examining and Licensing Board, I inspected the barber shops and explained to them the requirements of the law, and after they had complied with the same I approved their licenses. I collected from the milk dealers at three different times samples and sent same to the State Laboratory of Hygiene for analysis; two samples contained excessive bacteria and one had cap marked in violation of the law. With a state inspector I visited several dealers' barns, and orders and recommendations were given to each dealer.

Several samples of the town water have been sent to the state laboratory for analysis, with the report that it contained excessive iron. On January 24th, 1938, your Health Officer and Selectmen received a communication from the State Department that something must be done to remedy the situation or the State Board of Health would condemn and forbid the use of our water supply.

Your honorable Board of Selectmen and myself went to Concord to meet and talk over the situation with Charles D. Howard, Director of Division of Chemistry and Sanitation, and it was agreed that the town should have a reasonable time to consider the matter and report to said Department on or before July 1, 1938. This is a very important matter and will be explained at the Town Meeting, March 8th, so that all the voters may understand what must be done by the town.

It is the opinion and recommendation of the Health Officer that a clean up week should be observed each year. The rubbish and other garbage around the back of the stores is very untidy and must be abated in the future.

Let us all try to cooperate, clean up, keep cleaned up, beautify your surroundings and encourage others to do the same, with the end in view of better health, peace, happiness and prosperity in our community.
