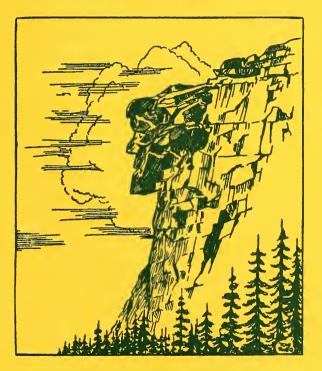

TOWN MEETING WARRANT

(As known February 11, 1960)

Time of meeting: 7:00 P. M. March 8, 1960

- Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- Article 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- Article 3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for Pine Blister Rust.
- Article 4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 to be used for Rag Weed Control.
- Article 5. To see what action the town will take to provide for the disposal of rubbish and garbage and raise and appropriate money for the same.
- Article 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$875.00 for Vital Statistics, the Littleton Hospital and expenses of the Health Department.
- Article 7. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance of highways and bridges, snow removal, oiling of its roads, and for Town Road Aid.
- Article 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 for the lighting of streets for the ensuing year.
- Article 9. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the general expenses of the highway department.
- Article 10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300 for sidewalk upkeep and repair.
- Artilce 11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Abbie Greenleaf Library the

sum of \$700.00 for the librarian's salary and \$250.00 for the purchase of new books.

Article 12. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Age Assistance.

Article 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 to care for town poor.

Article 14. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of its cemeteries.

Article 15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.16 to the White Mountains Region Association, being 10c per \$1,000.00 of the assessed valuation (1/100 of 1%) for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter and advertising and otherwise publicizing the advantages of the town in cooperation with the other 45 towns of the region.

Article 16. To see if the town will vote to allow the removal of the information booth to a more central location, at the discretion of the Board of Directors of Franconia Chamber of Commerce.

Article 17. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$600.00 for maintenance of the information booth at its present location, or at another more central location within the town.

Article 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 for legal expenses.

Article 19. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 to defray the town's share of employees' Social Security.

Article 20. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the following sums: \$1,200 to pay the amount maturing on outstanding Mittersill Road Construction notes; \$1,000.00 on outstanding McGowan Reservoir Construction notes; also the sum of \$1,150.50 to pay the interest on said indebtedness and on temporary loans.

Article 21. To see if the town will vote to raise

and appropriate the sum of \$3,900.00 for payment of the Grafton County Tax.

Article 22. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to defray expenses of the Planning Board Committee.

Article 23. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,523.70 for the Capital Reserve Fund.

Article 24.To see what action the town will take in regards to further study of town history and raise the necessary funds.

Article 25. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$650.00 to cover rent and upkeep of their municipal airport.

Article 26. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for Civil Defense.

Article 27. To see what action the town will take in regards to care and maintenance of the skating rink and raise the necessary funds for same.

Article 28. To see if the town will vote to discontinue a section of road leading from Route 116 to the junction of Ridge Road and Bickford Road.

Article 29. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to dispose of land on Route 116 commonly known as the old dump lot.

Article 30. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to appoint a committee of three to act for the town in matters pertaining to the establishment, construction and regulation of signs within the boundaries of the town.

Article 31. To see if the town will vote to authorize a penalty of twenty cents on each poll tax unpaid on December 1st of each year, said penalty being authorized under the following statute: C 66 S44 PL.

Article 32. To see if the town will vote to use the McGowan pit as a suitable location for housing highway department equipment and to raise and appropriate the necessary funds to grade site in preparation for building.

Article 33. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to deed back to the Trustees of Dow Academy the land that was sold to the town by said Trustees.

Article 34. To see if the town will vote to authorize its Fire Department to respond to fires outside its municipal limits and further authorize said Department to become associated with the Twin State Firemen's Association, a corporation duly organized under the laws of the State of N. H. and further accept and agree to abide by the by-laws and regulations of said corporation.

Article 35. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$40,000.00 for new fire equipment.

Article 36. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 to increase the yearly salary of each of the following town officers: Town Clerk, Tax Collector and the Treasurer, the increase of each to be \$100.00.

Article 37. To see what action the town wishes to take in regard to changing the drain in the Town Building parking lot, and raise the necessary funds for same.

Article 38. To see what action the town will take regarding taking over as a Town Road the road leading from Route 18 to a point on the Margaret Phillips property in keeping with a petition to do so.

Article 39. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to allow a discount for early payment of taxes.

Article 40. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Article 41. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

To the Inhabitants of the School District in the Town of Franconia qualified to vote in District affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said District on the fourteenth day of March, 1960, at 5 o'clock in the afternoon (Polls to be open from 5:00 P. M. to 10:00 P. M. Business meeting for consideration of the articles of the warrant will be called to order at 8:00 P. M.) to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary officers for the School District for the ensuing year.
- 2. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agents of the District.
- 3. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or officers heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 4. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 5. To see if the District will enter into an eight year contract relative to sending pupils of Grades 7 through 12 on a tuition basis to the Union School District of Littleton, under the terms of the statutes in such case made and provided, and to authorize the Franconia School Board to negotiate such contract.
- 6. To see if the District will raise the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) to be used, if necessary, by the School Board to continue the study of new school facilities undertaken in view of the possibilities that the Trustees of Dow Academy may wish to reoccupy the present school building at some future date.
- 7. To see what sum of money the District will

raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the District, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the State Foundation Aid fund together with other income; the School Board to certify to the Selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the Town.

- 8. To see if the District will authorize the School Board to make application for, and to receive, in the name of the District, such advances, grants-in-aid, or other funds for educational purposes as may now or hereafter be forth-coming from the United States Government and/or State Agencies.

SUPERVISORY UNION NO. 34 REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT'S SALARY

Section 5, Chapter 243, Laws of 1953 of the State of New Hampshire, requires that school district annual reports show the total amount paid to the superintendent.

One-half of the supervisory union expenses is prorated among the several school districts of the union on the basis of adjusted valuation. One-half is prorated on the basis of average daily membership in the schools for the previous school year ending June 30th. The Superintendent of Supervisory Union No. 34 during 1958-59 received a salary of \$7,600.00 which was made up as follows: \$4,250.00 paid by the State Department of Education from the per capita tax and \$3,350.00 prorated among the several school districts. Allowance of \$1,100.00 for travel within the Union was also prorated as stated above.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

To the School Board and Citizens of the Franconia School District:

I herewith submit my seventeenth annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

The total enrollment of your school last year was 68, the average membership was 64.0 and the percent of attendance was 94.8. There were 23 tuition pupils enrolled, 7 from Easton and 16 from Lisbon Town No. 3 School Districts.

Thirty-two pupils attended Littleton High school last year. The District paid tuition for these pupils, also for three pupils who attended schools in other towns, one at Bethlehem High, one at Gould Academy and one at Newport Center, Vermont. One elementary pupil attended Lisbon Public School for which the parent paid the tuition.

At the present time there are 51 pupils attending public schools outside the District, 15 at Littleton Junior High, 33 at Littleton High, one at Bethlehem High, one at Gould Academy and one at Newport Center, Vermont.

The total enrollment this year at Dow Academy is 57 pupils. Five tuition pupils from Easton and fourteen tuition pupils from Lisbon Town are included. Mrs. Leavitt has given a complete and interesting report of the school and its activities and I will confine my report to other matters.

I do wish to say, however, that school is progressing very well. The staff works industriously. Mrs. Alice Leavitt, Principal, is to be commended on the fine spirit of cooperation by staff and community.

Your school warrant includes an article proposing a long term tuition agreement with the Littleton School District. Some information regarding this step has been printed in the Littleton Courier. More details will be given you at the district meeting.

There will be some increase in tuition rates at Littleton next year. The high school rate advances to \$380, the 7th and 8th Grade rate advances to \$299.

Franconia expects to maintain its tuition rate at \$250.00 which is approximately the State average elementary cost of instruction.

Tuition rates go up and down with changing school costs. Rates for next year are governed by the State average cost of instruction for 1959-1960. The New Hampshire State average costs for 1958-1959 are \$388 in the high school and \$240 in the elementary school. The 1959-1960 costs will be determined after the close of the present fiscal year, June 30, 1960.

I wish to take this opportunity to thank all who have shown an interest in school activities during the year, a special word of praise for your School Board so generous of time and effort for the educational interests of your children.

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL

I herewith submit my first annual report as Principal of the Franconia Elementary School at Dow Academy.

The current school year is one of a transitional nature but the present elementary school, consisting of six grades, seems to be adapting itself very well to the new set-up. This is due, in large, to the cooperation and effort expended by all those involved.

ADMINISTRATION:

The present school year began on Wednesday, September 9, 1959, with a total registration of 55 pupils. Since then, the number has increased. As of this writing, there are 57 pupils enrolled in the six grades.

The teaching staff remains the same, with Mrs. Leone Philbrook of Sugar Hill teaching Grades 3 and 4, and Mrs. Natalie Wheeler of Franconia teaching Grades 5 and 6. Both are experienced and very capable teachers.

In addition to my duties as Principal, I am continuing to teach Grades 1 and 2.

Mrs. Marion Callender's services as music teacher are excellent and much enjoyed by the children.

Robert McLachlin continues to do a fine job as school custodian.

CURRICULUM:

Language, visual and auditory readiness for reading is stressed throughout the grades with teaching methods adapted to fit the needs of the individual child.

Language readiness gives training in the ability to understand the written and spoken word. The child learns to anticipate story endings and to get words and word meanings through context.

Visual training teaches him to look for likenesses and difference in pictures, words and letters.

With auditory training he learns first to hear differences in sounds and then to associate the sound with the correct letters or groups of letters.

SCHOOL LUNCH:

The school lunch program under the capable management of Mrs. Laura McLachlin, has been in effect since school began in September. Approximately 46 pupils participate daily in this program.

This year a new method of payment was inaugurated with monthly statements being sent the parents. This has worked out very well, thanks to the cooperation of the parents.

The school's new lunchroom, opened in January, is proving very satisfactory. Its location in the school building has certainly increased the efficiency and improved the attractiveness of the lunch program.

SCHOOL HEALTH:

Dr. Ralph Parker and Nurse Gloria Washburn have given complete physicals to the students whose parents so desired. Miss Washburn has conducted eye and ear examinations.

SCHOOL ACTIVITIES:

The former main room is being used for an allpurpose room. It is used for music, for recordings on the tape-recorder, and for the showing of films and filmstrips. In addition, school assemblies are also held there.

Special holidays are observed by school assemblies. A series of parties were planned and are being carried out.

This plan included a costumed Halloween party that provided a very happy time for all the children. Again, the parents were most cooperative.

At Christmas, room festivities were conducted. The annual Christmas program, with every child in the school participating, was presented in the school hall.

The Ski Program, sponsored by the Franconia School District, is proving highly successful.

CONCLUSION:

I wish to express my thanks to the people of Franconia, the School Board, Superintendent of Schools Ronald Perham, the faculty and pupils for their cooperation and assistance. It is indeed a privilege to work with such a fine group of people.
