Warrant for Town Meeting

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Grafton in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Grafton on Tuesday, the 12th day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Polls to close at four o'clock in the afternoon.

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see what system the Town will adopt of electing one or more road agents. The system adopted to remain in force until changed by a vote of the town, said change to take effect at the town meeting following the vote.

4. To hear the report of the Budget Committee and act thereon.

5. To see if the Town will allow a discount of 3% upon all property taxes paid on or before June 1, 1946, or 2% on all property taxes paid on or before July 1, 1946, and of 1% on all property taxes paid on or before August 1, 1946.

6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to make short term loans in anticipation of taxes.

7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of maintaining Highways and Bridges, including the amount of one fourth of one per cent.

8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote

to raise and appropriate for the purpose of cutting bushes and railing embankments.

9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by Tax Collector's deed.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$40.05 for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural resources and advantages of the town, together with other towns in the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region.

11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to continue street lighting.

12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for tractor repairs.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,176.00 and thereby receive State Aid in the sum of \$26,000.00—said money to be expended on the Fourth New Hampshire Turnpike.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the care of the Commons of Grafton and Grafton Center.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to be added to the Capital Reserve Fund already established for the financing of all or part of the cost of the construction of a building for the storage of town equipment.

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$400.00 for control of White Pine Blister rust in cooperation with the Forestry and Recreation Department.

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 to purchase and erect a soldiers' honor roll.

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the development of the new cemetery.

19. To see if the Town will vote to accept a Trust

Fund of \$100.00 from Bertha M. Barney, the income thereof to be used for the perpetual care of the George M. Flanders' lot in Grafton Center Cemetery. The fund to be known as the George M. Flanders Trust Fund.

20. To see if the Town will vote to accept a perpetual Trust Fund of \$2,000.00 from Fred and Bertha M. Barney, the annual income to be used for the purchase of books for Grafton Town Library, amount of income to be approximately divided between volumes of Fiction and Education. Fund to be known as the Barney-Flanders Trust Fund.

21. To see if the Town will vote to accept a Trust Fund of one hundred dollars from Mina Bullock Stevens, the income thereof to be used for the perpetual care of the John Bullock Cemetery lot at Razor Hill and the J. Lincoln Bullock lot at Grafton Center Cemetery. The Fund to be known as the Mina Bullock Stevens Trust Fund.

22. To see if the Town will vote to accept a Trust Fund of \$100.00 from Alvin C. Dean, the income thereof to be used for perpetual care of the Charles Dean and Heath lot in Grafton Center Cemetery. Said Trust Fund to be known as the Dean Trust Fund.

23. To take any vote or transact any further business that may legally come before said meeting.

Prevent Forest Fires—It Pays.

An average of 7,300 acres of woodland are burned over by forest fires in New Hampshire each year destroying many thousand dollars worth of property of all description. It costs more additional thousands of dollars and requires valuable man hours, taken from other essential work, to extinguish them. These losses affect the personal fortunes of the owners, and town and state economies. Everyone loses because of them.

Analysis of fire cause reveals the fact that more than 98 percent of all forest fires are, consistently, the result of human carelessness and are preventable!

We have been extremely fortunate during the past few years. Favorable fire weather and war time restrictions on travel which kept people off the highways and out of the woods have aided materially in reducing fire risks, keeping fires fewer and fire losses low.

We now face changed conditions. People can travel freely. Their love for travel and the freedom of the woods will bring them out in ever increasing numbers. This will step up the fire risks materially. The accelerated cutting of the war years has resulted in additional thousands of slash acres. These factors, combined with a possible dry season and human carelessness could

easily produce a catastrophe. Everyone must, consequently, be on his guard. He should

1. Be careful with fire or when smoking in or near woodlands.
2. Cooperate with the local forest fire warden and his deputies by
 - a. Abiding cheerfully with whatever restrictions it may be necessary to impose. They are intended only to be helpful.
 - b. Securing permits to burn debris when the ground is not covered with snow.
 - c. Seeing that others comply with the requirements.
 - d. Promptly coming to the warden's assistance when needed.

If these few fundamental practices are followed it will be possible to PREVENT a large proportion of FOREST FIRES from starting. That PAYS!
