TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hill in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Hill on Tuesday, the 10th day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year

ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make

appropriations of the same.

3. To authorize and empower the board of selectmen to borrow for the Town by the issue of notes a sum not exceeding \$15,000.00 in anticipation of taxes for the year 1953, said notes to be expressly payable from taxes within one year from the date of their issuance; and to authorize the board of selectmen to determine the rate of interest on such notes and to provide for the sale thereof.

4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to purchase for the sum of \$200.00 the gravel bank on the so-called Green lot and to pay for same out

of General Highway funds.

5. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue a part of the cross road leading from Hill Center to Bootjack road; the part to be discontinued to begin at Bootjack road and extend southerly to the driveway leading to property now owned by Alice Chadwick.

6. To see if the Town will vote to allow the collector of taxes additional compensation for his services in collecting the State Head Tax and to fix the amount thereof.

7. To transact any other business that may legally

come before said meeting.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Hill:

I herewith submit my third annual report as your Superintendent of Schools.

In these times of such significant change in political and social thinking you are most fortunate in having your school staffed with teachers who have so much feeling for the welfare of the children and the community. It was indeed a pleasure for me and a tribute to your teachers to have a visiting foreign educator, who supervises teachers in his own native land, sing the praises of the work your staff is doing. It was an additional pleasure for me to be associated with them in this endeavor. It is said that a good teacher makes a good school. You can rest assured that the Jennie D. Blake School is an excellent school.

One of the things which helps your teachers in making your school good is the financial support to supply books, scholars' materials, maps and the like. You have been generous in the past in this support and it is deeply appreciated. Another thing which helps maintain a good school is the fact that you have a school board that is cognizant of and acts to make needed improvements and who are willing to spend their time doing the job for which they have been elected. You are fortunate in having members who possess these traits.

The community as a whole participates in the school program mainly through its financial support. This you have done most willingly. As you look over the school budget you note that your board has done all that they could in holding items to their lowest without harming the program. They have held the elementary cost to the same cost or even less than last year. Slight increases have been made in some items and decreases in others. The principal cause for the

increase has been in the cost of high school education. The tuition charges for the school year 1953-54 have increased at Franklin and at Bristol. The tuition rate in Franklin will be \$260 per pupil while at Bristol it will be approximately \$275. The tuition item alone represents an increase over last year's budget of \$1400 and it is an item over which your Board has no control. As you look at the budget, think in terms of elementary and secondary school costs. If you do this, you will find that the Jennie D. Blake School is not costing the taxpayers of the District an excessive amount. I am sure you will find that your tax dollar is being spent wisely and most efficiently.

During the school year your Board has made two physical improvements at the school which should be called to your attention. The most important item has been the insulating of the attic of the school building. This has been effective in saving of fuel and giving less heat loss thereby making the building much more comfortable than in the past. The other project completed was that of installing storage space in the basement. This enables us to lock supplies, etc., in the spaces and allows more free play area in the basement. Both of these have added much to the improvement of your school plant.

In closing this report I wish to express my appreciation to the teachers, the Board, and the many citizens who have been most helpful in carrying on the educational program for the children of Hill. I hope we will be able to continue for many more years this wonderful cooperation.
