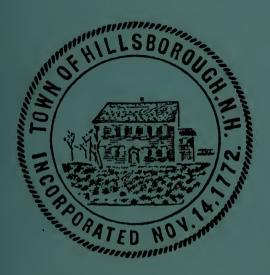

# State of New Hampshire TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hillsborough, County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in Hillsboro-Deering High School Auditorium in said Town on Tuesday, the 10th day of March, next at ten o'clock in the forenoon. Election of officers and balloting on Articles 2 and 3 will take place between ten o'clock in the forenoon and six o'clock in the afternoon. Articles 4 through 21 will be taken up at 8:00 p.m.

Article 1. To choose one Selectman for three years; Town Treasurer, Tax Collector, Highway Agent, Town Clerk for one year; Trustee of the Fuller Public Library for three years; Trustee of the Fuller Public Library for two years; Trustee of the Fuller Public Library for one year; Trustee of Trust Funds for three years; all other necessary Town officers or agents for the ensuing year; and Delegate to the Constitutional Convention.

Article 2. To see if the Town will vote to adopt Chapter 406, of the Session Laws of the State of New Hampshire, 1963, providing for the dissolution of the Hillsborough Bridge Village Fire Precinct and the creation of a Fire Department of the Town of Hillsborough and Water Department of the Town of Hillsborough. And to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 3. To see if the Town will vote to approve the sale of sweepstakes tickets in the Town of Hillsborough.

Article 4. To hear the reports of the town officers to the Auditors, the reports of the Auditors, Agents, Committees or other town officers heretofore chosen or appointed and to pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for Town Officers' salaries, Town Officers' expenses, Town Building, appropriations for Street Lights, and all current expenses of the town. — Sponsored by the Selectmen.

Article 6. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the building and repairing of highways, bridges, culverts and sidewalks. — Sponsored by the Selectmen and Highway Agent.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) to be applied to the Capital Reserve Fund for the future purchase of Highway Equipment. — Sponsored by the Selectmen.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Thousand Eight Hundred Dollars (\$2,800.00) to be applied upon the account of the Hillsboro District Nursing Association. — Sponsored by the District Nursing Association.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to instruct and empower the Selectmen to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary to meet current expenses of the Town and in anticipation of taxes. — Sponsored by the Selectmen.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$750.00) for the purpose of publicizing and improving the natural advantages and resources of the Town, together with the other Towns in the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region Association. — Sponsored by the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Regional Association.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand Eight Hundred Dollars (\$1,800.00) to provide telephone answering service for the Police Department and the District Nurse. — Sponsored by the Chief of Police and the Selectmen.

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum, not to exceed Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000.00) for the printing and publishing of a history of Hillsborough from 1920 to date. — Sponsored by the Selectmen.

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Eight Hundred Dollars (\$800.00) for the support of Band Concerts for the coming season. — Sponsored by the Selectmen.

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to sell and convey by deed, under such conditions and to such persons as the Board may consider proper, the title to real estate taken by the Town in default or redemption from tax sale. — Sponsored by the Selectmen.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appro-

priate the sum of Six Hundred Seventy-Five Dollars (\$675.00) to aid the Concord Hospital at Concord, New Hampshire. — Sponsored by the Concord Hospital.

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for operating a recreation program for children. — Sponsored by the Selectmen and the Park Board.

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) for the reconstruction of Walnut and Prospect Streets. — Sponsored by the Selectmen and the Highway Agent.

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Twenty-five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00) for the purpose of rebuilding the Hallas Bridge on Sleeper Road.

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for the purchase of equipment for the Hillsboro Civil Defense Program. — Sponsored by the Civil Defense Director.

Article 20. To see if the Town will vote to empower the Selectmen to acquire land for the relocation of the Town Dump. — Sponsored by the Planning Board.

Article 21. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

## FOREST FIRE WARDEN'S REPORT

During the past year New Hampshire faced the greatest forest fire threat to its woodlands in more than sixty years. The continued drought brought home to our citizens, as never before, the potential threat of destructive fires to their beautiful and valuable forests, homes and livelihood. In true American tradition of meeting a common threat by volunteer effort, this fire danger was minimized by active prevention, patrol and relinquishing of personal rights for the common good. It was the greatest demonstration of public cooperation ever experienced by those responsible for local and state fire control. The ready forces of volunteer fire services kept the losses low. For their effort and public response the general fire service expresses its heartfelt thanks for a job well done.

Prevention however, is not just an activity for the bad fire years. It must be practiced until it becomes a part of our public conscience — a habit. Just plain carelessness with fire causes too many of our fires.

The following practices and suggestions will help:

- 1. Always have a permit for outdoor burning and burn within the terms of the permit and in a safe place. Burn late in the afternoon when the wind is down or on rainy or damp days. Check your fire and if winds develop extinguish it promptly.
- 2. Carry your rubbish to the public dump its safer. A neglected backyard incinerator causes many fires.
- 3. Never discard lighted cigarette or match. Make this a year round habit regardless of the safety of your surroundings.
- 4. Children caused fires are now a major concern. Keep matches away from them and teach them to respect fire and not make it a subject of play.

Lets all join with "Smokey the Bear" and "Keep New Hampshire Green" and growing in 1964.

# PLANNING BOARD REPORT Fiscal Year Ended December 31, 1963

Work of the Planning Board in 1963 concentrated on two major areas - community facilities and land use planning.

In the field of land use planning, the Board met with State personnel regarding the availability of funds from other governmental sources for planning purposes, and the possible scope of a comprehensive planning program. The prerequisite appears to be the determination of what activities and regulations the Town might support for its own benefit, following which a specific planning program could be developed and submitted to the voters for approval and appropriation. The Board feels that the growth potential of the area merits a careful plan to protect property for its most desirable use, and to insure that the expansion of necessary public facilities can be accomplished as efficiently and cheaply as possible. A proposed land use plan is being developed and will be presented for public comment in the near future.

At the request of the Selectmen, the Planning Board has devoted considerable time in the past year to finding a new Town Dump location. The aim is to locate a site which is (1) reasonably accessible and (2) capable of being operated as a sanitary-fill (non-burning) dump. Five sites meeting these criteria were located, but none of the property owners involved were interested in selling land to the Town for this purpose. This is not surprising, but represents a problem the voters must face. Operation of a burning dump in the present location is unsatisfactory in many respects smoke nuisance, fire hazard, and health factors included. At the suggestion of the Planning Board an article authorizing the relocation of the dump is included in the 1964 town meeting warrant. If the Town cannot obtain a suitable site from a willing seller, the exercise of eminent domain must be considered.

In other activities the Planning Board last year worked with school committees on population growth studies, and with the Selectmen on various Town improvement projects.

## **REPORT OF CIVIL DEFENSE DIRECTOR**

Regular meetings of the twelve officers of your Civil Defense organization have been held during the year 1963. The following have been accomplished:

- 1. The local Civil Defense Unit has been approved by the State.
- 2. An Emergency Center has been established in the basement of the telephone company building with files, working space, plans and maps of the town and communications.
- 3. Emergency procedures under various different conditions have been studied.
- 4. A used Auxiliary Generator has been purchased thru State Civil Defense, a building to house it has been constructed at the fire house, and overhaul of the generator to put it in working condition has been done.

Your Civil Defense organization hopes, in the coming year, to:

1. Continue with more study including alerts, contaminated areas, and actual field practice of emergency units, particularly radiological and emergency truck.

2. Purchase radio equipment which will permit closer coordination for radiological units as well as other emergency crews.

3. Purchase, thru Civil Defense, a Races Radio.

Hillsboro is most fortunate in having a well-organized fire department, special police officers, emergency unit, medical unit and manpower unit. Our thanks go out to these units and to the officers who have been faithfully attending the meetings.

## PRECINCT WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Hillsborough Bridge Village Fire Precinct in the Town of Hillsborough, qualified to vote in Precinct affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in the High School Auditorium in said Precinct on Monday the 16th day of March 1964 at seven-thirty o'clock in the afternoon. Election of Officers and balloting on Article 5 will take place between 7:30 P.M. and 9 P.M. Articles 6 through 12 will be taken up at 7:30 P.M.

Article 1. To choose a Moderator for the ensuing year. Article 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.

Article 3. To choose one Water Commissioner to serve five years, one to serve four years, one to serve three years, one to serve two years, one to serve one year, one Fire Commissioner for three years.

Article 4. To choose a Treasurer, Auditors and other necessary officers for the ensuing year.

Article 5. To see if the Precinct will vote to adopt Chapter 406, of the Session Laws of the State of New Hampshire, 1963, providing for the dissolution of the Hillsborough Bridge Village Fire Precinct and the creation of a Fire Department of the Town of Hillsborough and Water Department of the Town of Hillsborough. And to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 6. To hear the reports of the Fire Commissioners, Water Commissioners, Clerk, Treasurer, Auditors and other Officers and Committees heretofore chosen and to pass any other vote relating thereto.

Article 7. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for paying the current expenses of the Precinct, the debt of the Precinct, and any other charges arising within said Precinct.

Article 8. To see if the Precinct will vote to instruct and empower the Fire Commissioners to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary to meet current expenses of the Precinct and in anticipation of taxes.

Article 9. To see if the Precinct will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) for the purchase of Fire Fighting Equipment.

Article 10. To see if the Precinct will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) for the repair and maintenance of the Fire Alarm System.

Article 11. To see if the Precinct will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) to add to the Capital Reserve Fund for the acquisition of Fire Equipment.

Article 12. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.
