TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Langdon in the County of Sullivan in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Langdon on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

ARTICLE I. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

ART. II. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.

ART. III. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for the support of Highways and Bridges, and make appropriation for same.

ART. IV. To see what amount of discount, if any, the Town will allow on taxes paid on or before a specified date.

ART. V. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for fire protection and make appropriation for same.

ART VI. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of the Municipal Budget Act.

ART VII. To see if the Town will accept state aid for construction of the Class II road known as Drewsville Road, and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$322.50; or will accept state aid for construction of Class V roads and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$322.50.

ART. VIII. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for Town Road Maintenance, and make appropriation for same.

ART. IX. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any Real Estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's Deeds.

ART. X. To see if the Town will vote to buy snow fence, and make appropriation for same.

ART. XI. To see what sum of money the Town will raise, if any, for the improvement of the cemeteries, and make appropriation for same.

ART. XII. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

ART. XIII. To transact any other business proper to be brought before this meeting.

ART. XIV. To allow Accounts.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Langdon School Board:—

I herewith submit my fifth annual report as your superintendent of schools.

Despite the poor physical conditions of the school building the educational progress of your pupils is good. The factors that help or hurt a school are many, but undoubtedly one that has helped is the stability established by holding good teachers over a number of years. The books used in your schools are in good condition and of the same editions as used in many of more progressive school systems in the country. Parents' attitude has a great influence on the work of a school. It is easier to criticize than it is to do good work. It is also hard to raise taxes in these times. I am sure, however, that most parents are glad to support the school officials and teachers in trying to give the Langdon boys and girls the best schools that the district can afford.

At times pupils have to be corrected and even punished for misdemeanors. In connection with this we should recognize several truths. We spend large sums of money to educate our children and protect their health in our schools, but more valuable than either of these is the development of good character. Our children must have clean and honest minds. It is true that there are plenty of examples where children, who in the silly stages of life showed traits that worried parents and friends, grew up to make some of our ablest citizens, but it is the duty of school officials, teachers and parents to prevent any individual from doing that which may bring a detriment to the mind of a child.

Miss Lora Horton, who has taught in Langdon five years, has the four lower grades and Miss Minnie Bonnette, who has taught in the district four years, has the four upper grades.

An excellent work that has been done through the labor of many of Langdon citizens and the interest of your nurse, Mrs. Z. L. Hasham, is the dental clinic. You were able to have Dr. Crandall of Claremont, who did excellent work and made the prices to the district low. I hope that some way may be found to continue this work as needed.

I wish to thank the school officials, teachers and citizens for their help and kindness.
