TOWN WARRANT, 1931

To the Inhabitants of the town of Lincoln, in the County of Grafton, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Lincoln, on Tuesday, the 8th day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
3. How much money will be raised for the public library?
4. How much money will be raised for the police department?
5. How much money will be raised for the public health department?
6. How much money will be raised for the fire department?
7. How much money will be raised for town maintenance?
8. How much money will be raised for miscellaneous expenses?
9. How much money will be raised for State Aid maintenance?
10. How much money will be raised for the public cemetery?

11. How much money will be raised for the support of town poor?

12. Will the town vote to raise the sum of \$1,500.00 and interest to take up water bond due April 1st, 1932?

13. How much money will be raised for maintenance of water department?

14. Will the town vote to raise the sum of \$1,900.00 for street lighting?

15. Will the town vote to adopt Chapter 155 entitled, An Act relating to observance of the Lord's Day, as passed by the last session of the legislature, and approved May 6th, 1931?

16. To transact any business that may legally come before the meeting.
