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## TOWN WARRANT

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### State of New Hampshire

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To the inhabitants of the Town of Orford in the County of Grafton in said State qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Orford on Tuesday, the 13th day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon to act on the following subjects:

First to adjourn for two hours to act on the school District Meeting.

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year. Also to choose one Selectman, one Trustee of Trust Funds and Library Trustee.

2. To hear the Budget of the Town and raise and appropriate any money recommended therein or to pass any vote relative thereto.

3. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year.

4. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of Town highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

5. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the removal of snow and care of Town winter roads for the ensuing year.

6. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to insure Town property.

7. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the use of Electric Lights.

8. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the use of Orford Free Library and for Orford Social Library.

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9. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of Taxes.

10. To see if the Town will vote to dispense with the distribution of inventory blanks until the Selectmen appraise the property.

11. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to sell and convey any property acquired by tax deed.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceeding one one-hundredth of 1% (1/100 of 1%) of the assessed valuation based on assessment of 1949 for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town, together with other towns in the Dartmouth Lake Sunapee Region.

13. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid for Construction of Class V roads and raise and appropriate the sum of        for that purpose.

14. To see what action the Town will take about a Town dump, and how much money the Town will raise and appropriate for that purpose.

15. To see how much the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the use of the Fire Department.

16. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the highway, subject to gates and bars, from the foot of Blackbury Hill so-called to the highway leading from the Miller Bridge to Archer Town and known as the Samuel Cutting road.

17. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to build a new bridge across the Archer Town brook on the Samuel Cutting road.

18. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the highway subject to gates and bars from Mrs. Phoebe L. Bakers upper driveway to the end of the highway and known as the David C. Marsh road.

19. To see if the provisions of Chapter 171-A of the Revised Laws relating to playing games of beano shall be adopted in this Town.

20. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to clean out the brook in Quint Town.

21. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for an Honor Roll for World War II Veterans, the location to be decided by the people.

22. To here the report of Agents, Auditors and Committees heretofore chosen and to pass any vote relating thereto, and to transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

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## ANNUAL REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

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To the School Board and Citizens of Orford:

I hereby submit my third annual report as your Superintendent of Schools

As events slowly move us toward the apparent possibility of world-wide conflict, we are attempting to provide the children with a calm and peaceful environment and, at the same time, prepare them for total mobilization. These appear to be divergent aims but we are accomplishing them with a reasonable degree of success. The regular programs of the pupils proceed with very little change and no undue emphasis is placed upon the war news. At the same time, we are instituting a war saving stamp program similar to the one in existence during World War II. There is an increased emphasis upon health and general physical well being. At the request of the State Board of Education and Civilian Defense, all teachers are being trained in First Aid. Later, all pupils will be given First Aid Training commensurate with their ability to understand it. Next fall we will probably produce some curriculum changes at the high school so that the pupils will be better prepared to enter the Armed Services. It is my own personal opinion that, under existing circumstances, our children should be provided with a school environment which is happy and enjoyable so that they can lead a reasonably normal existence for the few remaining years that it will be possible for them to do so. Yet, at the same time, we cannot entirely ignore the consideration of facts dealing with what is actually going on in the world today.

### Teachers and Teaching

The shift over from the operation of Orford High School by Plymouth Teachers College to the Orford School Board was accomplished with almost no difficulty. All the books and materials previously supplied by the College were left in the building. Fortunately, the principal and one teacher remained with us to provide the necessary continuity of administration. Three



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capable, well trained teachers were engaged to replace the training teachers formerly supplied by Plymouth Teachers College. Of course, the whole operation of the Orford High School was new to us and it may well be true that we made some mistakes. However, we should be able to iron these all out after we have had a year or two actual experience to go by.

There are often very few recompensations for being a school teacher. When they do come along, they stand out as real bright spots. One of the finest of these was a letter sent to the Chairman of the Orford School Board by the Secretary of the Orford P. T. A. which reads as follows —

“At the recent Parent-Teacher Association meeting it was voted that the secretary write a note of thanks and appreciation to the School Board, Mr. Mason, and Mr. Fulton for the remarkable handling of the difficult problem of opening the High School for the first time under their own management.

We are grateful for Mr. Mason’s keen interest and supervision, for the finding of such suitable teachers, for the finding of such excellent quarters for them to live in, for all the extra work Mr. Fulton and Mr. Guptil have taken on so graciously, and for the attitude with which all of the teachers have handled their extra heavy schedules.

May I add my thanks as one minor parent who fully expected to spend the winter making excuses for the High School to a critical sixteen year old. To my amazement and great relief, I have heard nothing but praise.”

All of our reliable and experienced teachers in the elementary grades returned to us again this year so that we have had the continued smooth operation of grades 1-8 which we have been fortunate to experience for the past several years. All the junior high school teachers in the Supervisory Union are working on a revised program for seventh and eighth grades. The introduction of shop work and home arts to the pupils of Orford this year has already led to an improved program for our boys and girls. The elementary teachers in grades 1-6 have been doing some special

work in the field of a new type arithmetic program.

Because of the excellent work being done by the teachers in Orford, the school board voted some improvements in their working arrangements as follows. (1) five days sick leave per year (2) This sick leave is accumulative over a period of years up to 15 days (3) 1 visiting day per year (4) substitute pay is to be \$7.00 per day.

### Financial

The permissive legal limit for high school tuition as established by the State Board of Education is \$252.04. With this in mind and because of our own rising costs, the Orford School Board established the tuition rate for 1951-52 as \$250.00. This is the rate being charged by many nearby New Hampshire communities.

Many New Hampshire towns are now operating on a salary schedule which shows both the teachers and the public exactly what a teacher is entitled to. Up until the present, it has been assumed that Orford could not afford to do this. However, if the shortage of teachers continues, we may find that it is advisable to give this problem further consideration.

It may appear rather strange to many people that Orford will receive less money under the new program of State Aid than it did under the old program. This is due primarily to the fact that the Orford equalized valuation (as established by the State Tax Commission) is high in relation to the relatively small number of pupils that we have. The method of computation is as follows:

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It should be pointed out that at the time this is being written the New Hampshire legislature has not accepted this formula; it is based upon \$1,400,000.00 of State Aid which may not be forthcoming; and the figures for equalization will be changed before a final formula is approved. Thus, it is very unlikely that the figure shown in the above computation will be the final actual one. It is simply the best that can be produced now.

### **Repairs**

Many people have remarked upon the great improvement which has been made in the floors at the Orford Street School by the special cleaning and application of seal and wax. Mr. Huntington and his staff deserve commendation for the diligent manner in which they pursued this somewhat laborious task. It not only has improved the general appearance of the building, but it is much easier to keep it clean. Several of the rooms and the cafeteria were repainted at the Orford Street School. The Orfordville School, which was repainted only a short while ago, was given a very thorough cleaning. A new set of desks and chairs was purchased for the high school and the Orfordville School. Several other minor repair jobs were done or are in the process of being done.

### **General**

I am tremendously pleased with the way in which the Orford schools have been operating this year. This could not happen unless everyone worked together and this is just what has happened. I want to express my sincere gratitude to the townspeople, parents, P. T. A., School Board, teachers, janitors, bus drivers and others for the splendid cooperation they have displayed in producing good schools for Orford.
