

WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Rollinsford in the County of Strafford, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- ART. 1 To bring in your ballots for Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, One Selectman and Overseer of the Poor for a term of three years, One Road Agent, Chief of the Fire Department and Delegate to State Constitutional Convention.
- ART. 2. To choose all other necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- ART. 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for the same.
- ART. 4. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount of 2% on all taxes of the 1948 levy, except poll taxes, paid on or before September 1st. next.
- ART. 5. To see if the voters of the Town of Rollinsford will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of the collection of taxes.

- ART. 6. To see if the Town will vote to accept the Sewer serving the Northerly end of Locust Street and Mechanic Street and raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the construction of two (2) manholes for servicing the sewer.
- ART. 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to gravel and tar the Clement road from Broadway Extension to the Town Line.
- ART. 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,500.00 to purchase a truck and "V" Plow for the use of the Highway Department.
- ART. 9. To transact any other business that may legally come before said Meeting.

Appropriations will begin at eleven (11) o'clock sharp.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

TO THE SCHOOL BOARD AND CITIZENS OF ROLLINSFORD:

I am pleased to present my first annual report as superintendent of your schools. The report deals with the following subjects: (1) Enrollment, (2) Teachers, (3) Books, other teaching aids and Testing, (4) Physical facilities, (5) Health, Music and Art.

ENROLLMENT:

School opened on September 3, 1947 with a total of 137 pupils distributed throughout the five classrooms as follows:

There are 68 high school pupils living in Rollinsford and attending high school; 49 of these attend Dover High School (tuition \$138.39) and 19 attend Berwick Academy in South Berwick, Me. (tuition \$125). Statistics for the 1946-1947 school year show an average membership for that year at the Rollinsford Grade School of 132.8. School was in session 344 half days with a 92.08 per cent attendance for the year.

TEACHERS:

The only teacher who was new to his position when school opened in September was Principal James McKeon of Somersworth. Mr. McKeon was selected to replace Mr. Robert Bragg who left Rollinsford at the end of the last school year to accept a similar position at Meredith, N. H. Mr. McKeon received his undergraduate training at Keene Teachers' College and his Master's Degree in Education from Boston University in August, 1947 after a full year of study at that institution. Before entering the service in 1942, he had taught in the elementary schools of Epping and Belmont, N. H.

To replace Miss Alberta Nelson whose resignation was accepted as of October 14, 1947 so that she might get married and live in Massachusetts, the School Board elected Mrs. Ida B. Merrill of Dover and who had had several years of teaching experience in the Dover schools.

Mrs. Phyllis Boak of Milton, N. H. who began teaching Music at Rollinsford in April, 1947 has continued as Music Supervisor for the present year. More about music in the school will follow later in this report.

In October, 1947, the teaching of Art was introduced into the school for the first time by Mrs. Regene Matthews of Exeter. Mrs. Matthews spent one day each week at the school from October 1, to the Christmas vacation. Her services were not continued after Christmas because no provision had been made for Art in the budget.

All teachers work untiringly for the benefit of the children.

It is heartening to note that 100% of the teachers in Rollinsford have joined the New Hampshire State Teachers' Association and National Educational Association. Membership in these professional organizations not only indicates excellent professional attitude on the part of the teachers but provides them with professional literature which should be read by all teachers. Contrary to some beliefs, these organizations work for the ultimate good of the children rather than for the personal value that might be derived for the individual teachers.

BOOKS, OTHER TEACHING AIDS AND TESTING:

New textbooks have been added as needed; practically a whole new series of music texts were provided during the past summer and several other sets of texts have been replenished during the current year. Textbooks in Rollinsford are generally in very good condition and are up-todate. The 16 mm. Sound Moving Picture projector which was purchased during the past year has proven to be very valuable for instructional and entertainment purposes. The use of such audio-visual equipment is much in keeping with modern practices in education.

Standardized mental ability and achievement tests have been or are to be given to each pupil above grade 3. The use of such testing materials provides means whereby teachers can better determine as to whether or not a pupil is working to the extent of his ability. It also provides for a comparison of the achievements of individuals or groups in our school with those in similar grades in other places.

The program of studies in Rollinsford follows that recommended by the State Department of Education for the various subjects and grade levels and the progress of the children is generally very satisfactory. Mr. McKeon has stated that:

"In connection with our regular academic work, a series of programs and events were scheduled for your pleasure, but designed to build character, poise, and confidence in our pupils by giving them experience facing audiences, and other like situations. During National Education Week, November 10-15, a program under the direction of the teachers and assisted by our music supervisor, Mrs. Boak, was presented. Our glee club and harmonica band were entertaining as were the folk dances and songs of the lower grades. At Christmas the seventh and eighth grades presented a one-act play and Christmas songs of all nations. It is hoped that similar programs will appear later in the year."

PHYSICAL FACILITIES:

The major improvements made to the building since the last annual report were the installation of an oil burner in the heating system during the past summer and improvements made in the 5th and 6th grade classroom. During the Christmas vacation, this room was repainted with a black baseboard and two shades of light-green tinge on the walls. New fluorescent lights were ordered to replace the open bulb fixtures that had been used and a 12 ft. length of new type green chalkboard was provided to increase the amount of wall space for blackboard work; the bulletin board space was also increased. In addition to these improvements inside the room, a large closet with glass panel in the door was constructed to enclose the washroom facilities.

Mr. Edward Bureau has been very cooperative and effective in the discharge of his duties as janitor.

HEALTH:

General health examinations have been made by the Community and School nurse, Mrs. Vina Shaw, R. N. A detailed report of her work will follow this report.

The Federally Aided Type A School Lunch Program has been in operation since November, 1947. Mrs. Edward Bureau who had managed the program so effectively became ill and was replaced by Mrs. Florence Perreault in January. We are fortunate to have available such capable women to manage and do the cooking for our School Lunch Program. By having received many donations from local sources and assistance from the Federal Government, it has been possible to serve around 70 pupils each day with at least 2 ounces of a high protein food, $\frac{1}{2}$ pint of milk, vegetable, bread and fruit to make a complete meal. Donations of food this year through the Government Marketing Administration have consisted of 2 bushels of sweet potatoes, 500 lbs. white potatoes, 5 cases tomato juice, 4 cases dried milk and 12 cases of orange juice. Shipments of dried eggs and dried fruit are expected.

Playground and basketball activities provide opportunity for wholesome exercise and games. The following quotation is taken from Mr. McKeon's report.

"Our athletic program under the direction and supervision of the Principal, has been stepped up to meet the advancing curricula of the elementary school. Regular gym periods are observed in school and regular games in football, basketball, and baseball are scheduled. Our football team played a total of three games, winning one, tying one and losing one. At the present time the basketball team is in full swing and in the spring a baseball team will get underway."

MUSIC

Mrs. Boak has listed as Aims of her musical endeavors in the public school the following:

- 1 Voice culture.
- 2. Interpretation, taught by imitation and suggestion.
- 3. Music reading taught by a pedagogical arrangement of the pinciples of time and tune.
- 4. Music appreciation through listening.
- 5. Moving to music through rhythmic games and dances and through folk dances.
- 6. Instrumental participation.

Extra activities which have been and are carried on at Rollinsford during the past year are:

Glee Club, harmonica band, square dancing, National Education Week Program, and Glee Club participation in the 1947 Graduation Program.

In conclusion, I wish to thank the members of the School Board, the teachers, and all others connected with the work of the school, for their wholehearted co-operation in realizing our mutual objectives.

REPORT OF TEACHER OF ART

As art today is an important part of every person's design for living every effort has been made to awaken the child's sense of observation so that he will possess a seeing eye and understanding mind. In so far as possible the art lessons have been correlated with the school program. They have covered lessons in design, cold harmony, proportional anatomy, lettering and picture composition and were planned to stimulate in the child the experience of creating and to help improve the manner in which he expresses himself as well as to make him acquainted with the fine examples of the arts of the present and the past. The use of patterns, tracing and copying have been discouraged because they are detrimental to creative artistic growth.

All the students have made excellent progress in the illustrations of stories and of their daily activities each child expressing himself on large sheets of paper. Many excellent Christmas card and place mat designs were produced prior to Christmas especially those made by the upper grades. Large murals were planned as group projects by the 7th and 8th grades and by the 4th grade (Miss Ordway's students). In addition the 7th and 8th grade students had lessons in lettering and poster layout culminating in some excellent posters for "Parents' Night" and some very good portfolios.

There are several children of outstanding ability in the school. The interest is keen in all grades in any phase of the subject and is coupled with an amazing capacity to work and to absorb information.

I would like to thank the teachers for their cooperation and kindness. I have enjoyed working with them and the children of Rollinsford.
