#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Rumney in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Rumney on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next, at two o'clock in the afternoon, at which time the polls shall be opened and shall close not earlier than nine o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following articles: all articles not on the ballot will be acted upon at seven-thirty in the evening.

1. To choose all necessary Town officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sum of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and to make appropriations of the same.

3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of its high-ways and bridges.

4. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Library.

5. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Fire Department.

6. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of the Cemeteries.

7. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of the Common and the daily raising and lowering of the flag.

8. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the street lights.

9. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the LaMott-Kenneson Post No. 76 American Legion for Memorial Day and other patriotic purposes.

10. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of the Town Dump.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$336.65 to secure from the State \$2,244.32 to be expended for Town Aid.

12. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay the Lakes Region Association for the purpose of Publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the town in cooperating with other towns in the Lakes Region.

13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate towards the operation of the Sceva Speare Memorial Hospital in Plymouth, N. H.

14. To see if the Town will authorize the expenditure of the Fire equipment Capital Reserve Fund to purchase a truck to replace the 1934 Ford truck and raise and appropriate or borrow a sum sufficient to pay the balance.

15. To see if the town will raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$745.00—to purchase a new snow-plow for the GMC truck.

16. To see if the town will vote to accept a deed from Trojano Lewis, Thom, Trotter and all other owners of a certain right-of-way as shown on a plan entitled Trojano's Stinson Shores owned by Harold D. Trojano and Marjorie W. Trojano, and designated thereon as Shore Drive, so-called, in said Town of Rumney, more particularly bounded and described as follows:

A certain tract or parcel of land situate in the Town of Rumney, Grafton County, State of New Hampshire, beginning at the Westerly limit of the Doe Town Road, so-called, at a point which marks the

Northeasterly corner of lot No. 22 as shown on said Plan and turning and running S 76°23' W a distance of One Hundred Thirty-Eight and Ninety-Nine Hundredths (138.99') Feet to a point: thence turning and running S 47°18' W a distance of One Hundred Ninety-Seven and Thirty-Three Hundreths (197.33') Feet to a point thence turning and running S 38° 35'W a distance of Forty-Four and Twenty-Two Hundreths (44.22') Feet to a point thence turning and running S 16° 43' 18" W a distance of Two Hundred Twentysix and Sixteen Hundredths (226.16') Feet to a point: thence turning and running S 18° 56' E a disand tance of One Hundred Fifty-Eight Sixty-four Hundreths (158.64') Feet to a point: thence turning and running S 29° 36' E a distance of One Hundred Forty-Nine and Nineteen Hundreths (149.19') Feet to a point: thence turning and running S 44° 26' E a distance of One Hundred Forty-Five (145') Feet to a point: thence turning and running S 36° 42' E a distance of One Hundred Seventy-Four and Sixteen Hundredths (174.16') Feet to a point; thence turning and running S 11° 29' E a distance of Four Hundred Eighteen and Forty-Nine Hundreths (418.49') Feet to a point at property now or formerly of one Fletcher.

Meaning and intending hereby to describe the Southerly and Easterly bound of a right-of-way as shown on said Plan, designated as Shore Drive, socalled, being Fifty Feet (50') in width; thence along property now or formerly of Fletcher in a general Southwesterly direction to the Southeast corner of Lot. No. 11, as shown on said Plan; thence in a general Northwesterly and Northeasterly direction parallel to the afore-mentioned Easterly limit of said right-ofway and Fifty Feet (50'), more or less, therefrom, to the point of beginning.

17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer, lease, rent, sell or otherwise dispose of any real estate or mineral rights acquired by the Town at any of its tax collector's sales.

18. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

# REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES OF TRUST FUNDS OF THE TOWN OF RUMNEY, N. H.

#### December 31, 1964

During the calendar year of 1964 six new Trust Funds were established and additions were made to four existing funds, so that we are now administering 155 funds.

As we reported last year the larger part of our funds are invested in Mutual Funds approved by the State Banking Commission and the balance in several banks in the state. All of our income is added and then divided proportionately to each fund its proper share, and in this way each gets the benefit of any increase in the rate that we obtain by reason of our mutual investment. For several years we have allocated a moderate amount to each fund allowing our capital to build up, so that this year we are able to make a ten percent dividend to each fund. Besides cash payments this year we are entitled to a stock dividend of 24 additional shares. A glance at the following report will show that all funds are growing and are in good shape. #### **REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN**

#### AND YOUR DISTRICT CHIEF

The 1964 forest fire season surpassed the record year of 1963 in both length and severity. For the second successive year, we experienced a rainfall deficiency of more than ten inches and the compounding of such drought conditions, together with the many days of strong, dry winds, characterized 1964 as one of the most hazardous years in the past half century. Although our fire season was three weeks longer than that of 1963, the number of fires showed only a slight increase and more remarkable was the fact that the area burned dropped from 2280 acres in 1963 to 900 acres in 1964. Early detection and rapid response kept many potential fire disasters from becoming reality. We all owe a debt of gratitude to the men in this community who responded and fought our fires so efficiently. Our state is now 86% wooded and its economy - both industrial and recreational - is greatly dependent on this forest resource. The responsibility for adequate fire protection of this great area -4,350,000 acres, is everyone's responsibility and prevention is one of our most effective tools.

Prevention is good common sense.

- 1. Take your rubbish to the town dump. If you must burn, obtain a permit and watch your fire until it is dead out.
- 2. Instruct your children in fire safety. Keep matches from young children. Explain to them the dangers of lighting matches and making outdoor fires.
- 3. Be sure discarded smoking material and matches are out.

#### EXPLANATION OF SUPERINTENDENT'S SALARY

Section 5, Chapter 243, Laws of 1953, of the State of New Hampshire, requires that the school district annual reports show the total amount paid to the superintendent of schools as per the following quotations: "Reports. Each superintendent of a supervisory union shall annually prepare a report showing the total salary paid to the superintendent, which report shall show in detail the amount derived from the per capita tax and the amount paid directly by each school district in the union."

One-half of the supervisory union expenses is prorated among the several school districts of the union on the basis of adjusted valuation. One-half is prorated on the basis of average daily membership in the school for the previous school year ending June 30th. The Superintendent of Supervisory Union No. 48 during 1963-64 received a salary of \$9,700.00 which was made up as follows: \$4,500.00 paid from the per capita tax and \$5,200.00 prorated among the several school districts. Allowances of \$1,100.00 for travel within the union was also prorated as stated above. The several school districts now number five since, by State Department of Education directive, Woodstock School District is no longer a part of Supervisory Union #48.

The table shows the portion of salary and travel charged to each school district.

## Superintendent of Schools

By further directive of the State Department of Education, the School District of Warren will become a part of Supervisory Union #48 as of July 1, 1965. The administration and faculty have cooperated and worked hard to bring an excellent educational training program to the children of the community.

The Russell School faculty can boast that we have a total of 85 years of teaching experience to bring to the children. All of the teachers have a degree and three teachers are presently studying for a Master's Degree.

The new teachers on our staff this year are: Mrs. Ida Kelly - Grades 4 and 5; John Metters - Science and Mathematics; and Joseph Stearns - English and Social Studies.

To better facilitate an understanding between parent and teacher, two policies have been inaugurated. During the middle of each marking period an academic warning is mailed to the parents if the student is not working up to capacity. Every three weeks a student progress report is sent home if the parent requests such a report.

Grades 6 - 8 now have an activity program. The activities for the first half of the year were Science Club, Hobbycrafts, and Art Activity. Fundamental Skiing, Dramatics Club, Science Club, and Art Activity are the activities for the second half of the year.

Grades 6 - 8 students needing remedial instruction in English and Mathematics are now engaged in onehalf hour remedial instruction each day. Special attention can be given to the slow learner in mastering some of the fundamentals of English and Mathematics.

A savings program has been inaugurated this year through the sale of U. S. Savings stamps.

Much needed audio-visual equipment, such as an overhead projector, microscopes, test tubes, an aquarium etc. have been purchased this year.

I want to take this opportunity to thank the people of the community for their cooperation with our faculty.

#### **REPORT OF SCHOOL NURSE**

#### January 1 - December 31, 1964

During the year the nurse made fifty visits to the school checking classrooms and talking with the teachers. Pupils were inspected for symptons of sickness, pediculosis or skin infections. They were also weighed and measured to record growth and development. Screening tests to check the vision and hearing of each pupil were administered and notices were sent home where follow-up tests seemed to be necessary.

Th State Board of Health nurse was assisted in holding Sabin (oral polio) clinics, T. B. skin tests, and diagnostic chest x-rays.

A pre-school registration and conferences with parents was held in the Spring. During the year the nurse made twenty-two home visits, took sick children to their homes, and gave first aid when necessary as she visited.

Arrangements were made where necessary for children to visit guidance clinics to have complete physicals and vaccinations.

Many telephone calls for advice or assistance were made during the year. An up-to-date health record is being kept on each pupil. Appointments were made at the Warren pediatric clinic for physicals, immunizations and a few Psychological tests also.
