TOWN WARRANT FOR 1965

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Seabrook, in the County of Rockingham, State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in the Lower Hall of the Seabrook Firemen's Association Building, Route 86, on Tuesday, March 8, 1966, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon and to cast ballots from that hour until at least 6 o'clock in the evening of the same day and to act on the following Articles:

Article 1. To elect by Non-Partisan Ballot: a Town Clerk; one Selectman, Assessor, and Trustee of the Trust Funds for a term of three (3) years; a Town Treasurer; a Collector of Taxes; a Chief of Police; a Chief of the Fire Department; three (3) Constables; one member of the Budget Committee for a term of three (3) years; one (1) member of the Park Commission for a term of three (3) years; a Road Agent; and any other officers for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To see if the Town will vote to amend the Zoning Ordinance - Section 1 - as follows:

1. Amend Section 1; District 4; Seabrook Westerly Rural Area; par. 1, BOUNDARIES: by deleting the entire paragraph and substituting therefor the following new paragraph:

1. Boundaries: Beginning at the westerly side of the New Hampshire Turnpike and the Hampton Falls town line and proceeding westerly along said boundary line to the intersection of the boundary line between Hampton Falls, Seabrook and Kensington, thence southerly along the boundary lines of Kensington and South Hampton to the New Hampshire State line; thence easterly along said State line for a distance of five thousand (5000) feet; thence northerly a distance of four thousand six hundred and twenty-five (4625) feet along the boundary line of District 5 to N.H. Route 107; thence easterly to the New Hampshire Turnpike and thence northerly along said Turnpike to the point of beginning.

Further Amend Section 1 by adding the following new district:

District 5. Specialized Economic Development District.

1. Boundaries: Beginning at the intersection of the New Hampshire Turnpike and New Hampshire Route No. 107 and proceeding westerly a distance of approximately four thousand (4000) feet to the easterly boundary line of District 4, thence southerly along the boundary line a distance of four thousand six hundred and twenty-five (4625) feet to the New Hampshire State Line, thence easterly along said State line a distance of approximately four thousand five hundred (4500) feet to the New Hampshire Turnpike thence northerly along said Turnpike to the point of beginning.

2. Uses:

a. Research and development laboratories and facilities, office buildings, light manufacturing and assembly plants, and industrial plants to the exclusion of enterprises which are liable to become obnoxious to the community, and only following approval by the Planning Board of a site development plan in accordance with R.S.A. 36-19a and the Subdivision Ordinance of the Town of Seabrook.

b. Single and two family dwellings and their accessory buildings along the New Zealand Road boundary of the District extending to a maximum depth of 150 feet and a minimum width of 150 feet. Dwellings or accessory buildings may be used for customary home industries. Any other residential uses shall be permitted in the District only where plans of a proposed subdivision shall have been filed with the Planning Board of the Town of Seabrook prior to January 1, 1966. Such uses shall conform to the regulations contained in Section II, III, IV, and V of District 4.

3. Minimum lot dimensions: frontage - 300 feet, minimum lot size five (5) acres provided, however, that a lot with less frontage or area which is recorded as such and subject to tax as a lot of record at the time of the adoption of this section shall be classified as conforming to the provisions of this ordinance.

4. Set Back requirements: The proposed use shall be set back from all lot lines a minimum of 100 feet; and this yard space shall be provided with landscaping, shrubs and trees. Such yard space may also be used for parking, loading and outside activities up to 25 feet from any lot line if such remaining yard is provided with dense year around planting (except at vehicle exits and entrances) averaging 8 feet in height and capable of obscuring the parking, loading or activity area.

5. Height Limitations: No building or structure except chimneys or other similar elements shall exceed two stories or thirty-six feet in height except where the Planning Board may grant special permission to exceed the height limitation in connection with the site plan review procedure.

6. Sewerage and Industrial Waste Disposal and Drainage Systems:

The application for site plan review for the proposed use shall contain complete specifications and plans for the sewerage and industrial waste disposal facilities and the storm water drainage system in order to provide for a comprehensive review and report thereon by the Planning Board, the N.H. Water Pollution Commission and such other agencies as may be requested for a report on the proposed systems by the Planning Board. Reasonable costs incurred by the Planning Board in connection with these investigations and preparation of reports shall be paid by the applicant.

(Recommended by the Planning Board. To be voted upon by separate ballot.)

Article 3. To see if the Town will vote to amend Section V (Definitions) of the Zoning Ordinance by adding the following: HOUSE, TWO FAMILY. However, such structure shall contain no more than two kitchen facilities.

(Recommended by the Planning Board. To be acted upon by separate ballot.)

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to amend Section 1, Zone A, Paragraph 3 of the Zoning Ordinance by adding the following to the third paragraph:  
No structure shall be created on less than a two-to-one basis of ratio of land area to total floor area of the building.

(Recommended by the Planning Board. To be voted upon by separate ballot.)

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to revise the salaries and wages of the Town Officials and Employees.

Article 6. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the expense of the General Government, for the Protection of Persons and Property, for Health and Sanitation, for Highways and Bridges, for Support of the Town Poor and all other necessary expenditures for the ensuing year.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to allow the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes and to renew and refund Town notes.

Article 8. To see what action the Town will take regarding the balances of the following Special Appropriations: Cross Beach Road Layout - \$4,285.; New Lands - \$3,000.; Street Survey - \$565.; Tax Map - \$973.44; River Street Pier - \$68.93; Cemetery Road - \$737.46; Closed Circuit Fire Alarm - \$543.32; Telemetering System - \$2,444.43; River Street Land Acquisition - \$1,000.; Mosquito Control - \$2,000.; Painting Water Tank - \$352.20 and Water Main Extension (Article 11, 1962) - \$138.41

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$12,200. (Twelve Thousand, Two Hundred Dollars) for the purpose of paying the balance due on the 1965 Test Well Investigation and for the purpose of continuing the Test Well Investigation and further improvement of the Town Water System as recommended by Whitman & Howard, Inc., Engineers and the State of New Hampshire Department of Public Health & Welfare.

(Approved by the Budget Committee)

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$941.80 (Nine Hundred, Forty-one Dollars & Eighty Cents) for the purpose of paying to Roger A. Payeur the balance due on the contract for painting the water tower.

(Approved by the Budget Committee)

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000. (Five Thousand Dollars) for the purpose of continuing the Tax Mapping Program and Master Plan of the Town of Seabrook.

(Approved by the Budget Committee)



Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to accept bids for the purchase of a new combination Cruiser-ambulance for use by the Police Department and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,200. (Twelve Hundred Dollars) for the purchase of same.

(Approved by the Budget Committee)

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to purchase a truck and load packer to be used for refuse and garbage removal at a cost not to exceed \$14,500. (Fourteen Thousand, Five Hundred Dollars) and to authorize the Board of Selectmen to accept bids for purchase of same.

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to purchase a Dump Truck at a cost not to exceed \$7,000. (Seven Thousand Dollars) and to authorize the Board of Selectmen to accept bids for purchase of same.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to purchase a new Chassis to replace the Chassis on F.D. Combination 2, to purchase and install a new Front End Pump on the new Chassis and to transfer the present body from Combination 2 to the new Chassis at a cost not to exceed \$7,000. (Seven Thousand Dollars) and to authorize the Board of Selectmen to accept bids for purchase of same.

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,500. (Eighty-five Hundred Dollars) to be applied toward the purchase price of the vehicles and equipment specified in the foregoing Articles 13, 14 and 15.

(Approved by the Budget Committee)

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate a sum not exceeding \$20,000. (Twenty-thousand Dollars) representing the balance of the purchase price of the vehicles and equipment specified in the foregoing Articles 13, 14 and 15, said sum of \$20,000. (Twenty Thousand Dollars) to be borrowed by the issue and sale of bonds or notes of the Town; that there be, and hereby is, authorized, under and pursuant to the Municipal Finance Act

and any other enabling authority, the issuance and sale of serial bonds or notes of the Town, said issue to be in the principal amount of \$20,000. (Twenty Thousand Dollars), said bonds or notes to mature over a period not to exceed two years and to bear interest payable semi-annually, and that, except as otherwise provided herein, decision is hereby delegated to the Selectmen to fix the date, maturities, denomination, interest rate, place of payment, form and other details of the bonds or notes and to provide for the sale thereof.

(Approved by the Budget Committee)

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000. (Five Thousand Dollars) for the purchase of wire, material and labor to extend the Closed Circuit Fire Alarm System.

(Approved by the Budget Committee)

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,500. (Thirty-five Hundred Dollars) for the purchase of material and labor to repair the Town-owned caterpillar-dozer.

(Approved by the Budget Committee)

Article 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000. (One Thousand Dollars) for the purpose of painting the Float, Ramp and Decking of the River Street Pier.

(Approved by the Budget Committee)

Article 21. To see if the Town will vote, subject to the approval of the Legislature and ratification by the Town at a later date, in favor of changing the Town Line between Seabrook and Hampton, without monetary consideration, to the center of Hampton River.

Article 22. To see if the Town will vote to accept as public streets those parts of heretofore privately owned and improved streets known as (1) Lake Shore Drive which extends as far as Evergreen Drive and provides street frontage for Lots No. 40, 41, 42, 43, 34, 33 and 32 and also (2) Evergreen Drive to, and including, the intersection at Forest Court and provides street frontage for Lots No. 32, 31, 44 and 45 and also (3) Forest Court which begins at Evergreen Drive and extends to Forest Drive and provides frontage for Lots No. 31, 30, 29, 28, 24, 25, 27 and 5 as shown on Seabrook Development, Inc. Registered Plan No. 1454 as approved for development on March 1, 1962; said acceptance being subject to the Town of Seabrook receiving satisfactory deeds of conveyance from the present owners of the aforesaid streets, and also subject to the approval of the Board of Selectmen.

Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to empower the Planning Board to review site plans for the development of tracts for non-residential uses as provided in R.S.A. Chapter 36-19a.

Article 24. To see if the Town will vote to allow the Board of Selectmen to appoint a committee to be composed of not less than Fifteen (15) persons for the purpose of initiating the program to commemorate the Bicentennial Anniversary of the 1768 Incorporation of the Town of Seabrook and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000. (One Thousand Dollars) for the purpose of defraying cost of same.

(Approved by the Budget Committee)

Article 25. Upon petition by James C. Falconer and twelve others: To see if the Town will establish a Town Conservation Commission as set forth in the Revised Statutes Annotated Chapter 36-A.

Article 26. Upon petition by Robert L. Jones and ten others: To see if the Town of Seabrook of Rockingham County, New Hampshire will accept and enforce all laws and proposals made by the State of New Hampshire and by the United States Government in regards to junk cars and used car lots.

Article 27. To hear the report of the Wage and Department Study Committee and to act thereon.

Article 28. To hear the report of the Planning Board and to act thereon.

Article 29. To transact all other business that legally may come before said meeting.

## ADJOURNED TOWN MEETING, MARCH 11, 1965

Seabrook, New Hampshire

Adjourned Town Meeting called to order by Moderator Richard L. Holloway at 7:30 P.M. in Passaconaway Hall, Seabrook Firemen's Association Building, Route 86.

Visitors relegated to one section of the hall.

Salute to the Flag led by the Moderator.

Invocation by Richard Diehl, Pastor, Rand Memorial Church.

Clyde O. Brown stated that motion had been made on Tuesday, last, that the meeting reconvene in the Polling Place - Lower Hall, Firemen's Association Building.

Moderator called for vote to remain in this hall and reconvening here to make it legal. CARRIED.

Moderator ruled that meeting is legally convened in Passaconaway Hall.

Moderator asked if Meeting wished to limit debate on the question. Since there was no dissenting voice, the Moderator ruled unlimited time for debate providing it is confined to the question on the floor. Moderator instructed body on method of addressing chair for recognition and permission to speak on question.

Moderator ruled no voice vote. All votes will be by either hand or ballot.

Moderator ruled that reconsideration of any question will be taken immediately following a question and not at any other time.

ARTICLE 5 read by the Moderator - Budget

Motion by Robie M. Beckman, second by Clarence R. Blanchard, Jr., that Article 5 be acted upon item by item. Yes - 75 No - 0  
Motion carried.

CLERK - \$2,970.

Motion by Robie Beckman, second by Joseph Noble, Jr., that \$2,970. be raised and appropriated for the Clerk.

Motion by Clyde O. Brown, second by James S. Eaton, that motion be amended to read \$3,240.

Motion to amend carried. Yes - 44 No - 0

Motion as amended carried.

TOWN OFFICERS SALARIES - \$8,200.

Motion by Geo. A. Weare, Jr., second by Clyde O. Brown, that \$8,200. be raised and appropriated for Town Officers Salaries.

Motion carried.

TOWN OFFICERS EXPENSES - \$4,500.

REPORT OF THE WATER DEPARTMENT  
For the Year 1965

During the year 114,037,320 gallons of water were pumped. This shows an increase of 8,455,958 gallons more than in 1964. Of the total amount pumped 16,576,125 gallons were used for industrial and commercial.

3,268 feet of service pipe were used for the installation of 51 new services. About 500 feet of ten inch water main have been installed on the Cemetery Road off New Zealand Road. The stand-pipe on New Zealand Hill was cleaned and painted.

The Telemetering System voted last year is still in the process of being installed. Some work has been done on it, but due to the lack of materials it may not be complete for some time.

Work on the test well investigation shows about fifty test pipes driven in the West end of town. Only three are capable of producing any amounts of quality water, and are still subject to approval by the State Dept. of Public Health before they may be developed.

Submitted herewith is the report of the annual examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Seabrook for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1965, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Municipal Court and Trustees of Trust Funds.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Comparative Balance Sheets: December 31, 1964 -- December 31, 1965: (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1964 and December 31, 1965, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein the Net Debt decreased by \$11,862.35 in 1965.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit A-2)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. These were as follows:

Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures - Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits A-3 & A-4)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1965, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit A-4), a revenue surplus of \$8,967.89, plus a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$966.07, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$9,933.96.

Summary Statement of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit B-1)

A summary statement of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1965, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1965, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

Statement of Long Term Indebtedness: (Exhibit G)

A statement of outstanding long term indebtedness as of December 31, 1965, showing annual debt service requirements, is contained in Exhibit G.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and pay-rolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made up from statements obtained from depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records. The amounts of uncollected and unredeemed taxes as indicated in this report are therefore subject to any changes which may be necessitated by the return of verification notices.

GENERAL COMMENTS

Current Surplus:

The current surplus (excess of total assets over current liabilities) decreased by \$21,637.65, from \$63,514.13 to \$41,876.48 in 1965, as shown herewith:






