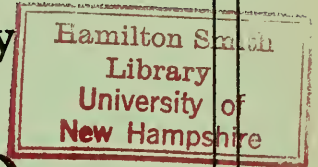

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE
(TOWN WARRANT)

To the inhabitants of the Town of Stoddard in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Stoddard on Tuesday, the tenth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for the same.

3. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Snow Removal for the ensuing year.

4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Highways and Bridges for the ensuing year.

5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the general expense of the Highway Department for the ensuing year.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Hundred dollars (\$200.00) for the control of the white pine blister rust or act anything thereon.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Thirty-Seven dollars and Fifty cents (\$37.50) for advertising, said sum to be expended under the direction of the Selectmen in group advertising with other towns in the Monadnock Region or otherwise, or take any other action relating thereto.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand and Fifty dollars (\$1,050.00) for the purpose of making necessary repairs and improvements to the Town Hall, said sum to be expended under the direction of the Selectmen, or take any other action relating thereto.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Six Hundred dollars (\$600.00) for the purpose of acquiring land and erecting a suitable structure to house the tractor and other town property, said sum to be expended under the direction of the Selectmen, or take any other action relating thereto.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or to set aside the sum of Six Hundred Sixty-Nine dollars (\$669.00) as the Town's share in State Aid construction on the Class II road known as the Forest Road or vote to raise and appropriate or set aside the sum of Two Hundred Sixty dollars and Eighty-One cents (\$260.81) for State Aid construction on Class V roads.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Fifty dollars (\$50.00) for Old Home Day, or take any other action relating thereto.

12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds.

14. To see if the Town will by vote establish a new rate of pay per hour for all unskilled labor.

15. To see if the Town will vote to rescind the vote of the 1912 Town Meeting that the New Cemetery at the Center, the one at South Stoddard and the one at Leminster Corner be taken care of at the expense of the Town, or act anything thereon.

16. To see if the Town will vote to accept the bequest of Serena Upton in the approximate sum of Ninety dollars (\$90.00), as a trust fund, for the care and maintenance of the Elias Whitney lot in the New Cemetery.

17. To see if the Town will vote to accept the bequest of the late Willie E. Shedd in the amount of Three Hundred dollars (\$300.00), as a trust fund, the income to be used annually for the care, maintenance and improvement, of the Cemetery, generally, in which the bodies of the parents of Willie E. Shedd are buried.

18. To see if the Town will vote to accept the bequest of the late Willie E. Shedd in the amount of Two Hundred dollars (\$200.00), as a trust fund, the income to be expended annually in the care, maintenance and improvement of the lot in the Cemetery in which the bodies of the father and mother of Willie E. Shedd are buried.

19. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The superintendent of schools submits the following report for your consideration.

SCHOOL ORGANIZATION

Supt. of Schools: Vincent Gatto, A. B., Bates College, 1914; LL. B., Hamilton College of Law, 1920; Ed. M., Harvard University, 1929.

Teacher: Agnes Dolan, Keene Normal School, 1924.

Below is a list of those children who achieved the distinction of perfect attendance for one or more periods during the school year 1934-1935. An honorable mention is hereby awarded to those pupils and their parents.

Cynthia Holmes, three periods; Edith Holmes, two periods; Leona Holmes, three periods; Shirley Holmes, four periods, (entire year); Edith Lambert, three periods; Raymond Reed, four periods, (entire year); James Robertson, two periods.

GENERAL DISCUSSION

The superintendent has kept in constant touch with your school. He is gratified to see the great pride which the community takes in the school. This is evidenced by the fact that the building is kept in fine repair, that the children have the very best books and scholars' supplies available for their work, and that the parents and other citizens attend and support all school functions. The school board meet frequently in order to tend to the duties of their office, and every detail is very well looked out for.

Late in the fall the superintendent gave achievement and intelligence tests. He is glad to report that your children compare well with the rest of the country in both intelligence and school achievement.

Parents whose children attend rural schools should not be too anxious to have their children skip grades. The ability to do the work of the higher grade is not the only factor to consider. The child who skips a grade misses the work, the information, the social contacts and development afforded by the year spent in the grade. Besides children who skip grades reach high school too immature to receive the full benefit of a high school education. Then too, such children leave school so young that they run the risk of having to remain at home with nothing to do.

The teacher is to be commended for her good teaching and management of her school. It is also worthy of mention that she looks after her pupils' health as evidenced by the carefully prepared lunches which the children enjoy together during the noon hour, when some excellent habits of sociability are developed.

The superintendent would be pleased to accept invitations to speak in the interest of education before any organization in the town of Stoddard. He is also willing to meet parents at school or to call at their homes to confer with them about their children's education. Appointments may be made with him directly or through the teacher.

The superintendent appreciates his opportunity to make a contribution to the educational institutions of Stoddard.
