TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Stratford qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in the village of North Stratford on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March, 1935 at 10.00 o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To elect a Clerk for the ensuing year.

2. To elect a Treasurer for the ensuing year.

3. To elect two Auditors for the ensuing year.

4. To elect one Selectman to serve for three years and all other necessary town officers.

5. To see if the Town will vote to continue the services of a Public Health Nurse and to raise money for the same.

6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for highways and bridges, town maintenance and state aid highway construction.

7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Town Libraries, Cemeteries, Town Expenses, Memorial Day, Sewers, Street Lighting, Retirement of Water Bonds and Hydrant Service, and any other money for town purposes.

8. To see if the town will vote to install a steam heating plant in the Town Hall and raise money for the same.

9. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds.

10. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to pledge the credit of the town to raise funds in anticipation of taxes when it is found necessary for the payment of obligations. 11. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Officers and Committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote relative thereto.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Members of the Stratford School Board:

I hereby present my first annual report of your schools. I came here as a substitute March 5, 1934 for the late Eugene Foster, the regular superintendent, who passed away August 6, 1934. On September first, I became the regular superintendent.

At the close of the year ending June 30, 1934, there were quite a few changes in the teaching staff. The present teaching staff is as follows: Headmaster, Donald R. Harriman, who has had considerable experience as a high school teacher; sub-master, Eugene Smith, a man with teaching experience; Christine Freese, a University of New Hampshire graduate, who is the language teacher; Marion Stevens. teacher of commerce, who has been here several years; Mildred M. Cochrane, a graduate of the University of New Hampshire, teacher of Domestic Arts; Mary K. Booth, grades VII and VIII; Emeline V. Heath, a teacher of considerable experience. grades V and VI; Grace S. Martin, grades III and IV, where she has been for some time; Eleanor Walbridge, grade II; Florence B. Daley, the same room as last year-the beginners; Helen M. Couture, a Keene three-year graduate, in the Hollow Grammar;

Clarice Keenan, in the Hollow Primary, the same as last year; and Lena J. Rich, at East Stratford.

Domestic Arts has been extended into the high school and the work has been approved under the George-Ellezy Act. That means we get quite a little Federal Aid for this department. I would suggest that a further extension of the work be considered for another year and application made for more Federal assistance in this department. This year we expect to get 3-7 of the teacher's salary or about \$428.50 from the Federal government as we have gualified and made application for the Federal Aid. The department has been inspected by their agent. Another year, we should be able to get as much as 6-7 of the teacher's salary. We can get this if we go after it, as we now have the equipment, but it will take more of the teacher's time for supervision of projects and conferences with the different groups. This means that another teacher would be needed but the cost would be but a little more than we are now paying because the government would meet the larger part of the salary.

The lighting system in the D. A. room has been changed so that it is efficient. The partition from the corner of the room has been removed and the shower taken to the town hall. The janitor's supplies have been moved to another place. This space has been fixed for a screened dining room with a linoleum for the floor as a part of the D. A. equipment. Dishes of various kinds have been purchased for the use of this department. The changes were made to comply with the State requirements. The changes make the work much more effective and the Federal aid will probably cover all of the cost. The D. A. department is looking after the preparation of and serving the noon lunches. Very little change has been made in the departments of English, History, Commerce and Language. Special effort has been made by Headmaster Harriman and Sub-master Smith to build up the department of Mathematics. As a result, we have a very successful class in advance mathematics.

The school has joined the debating league sponsored by Bates College and we feel that much benefit will be derived therefrom. Miss Freese is coaching the debating teams.

Athletics have been revived with much interest. The Town Hall has been changed to give the teams a better chance in which to practice and play their home games. Showers have been installed in the Town Hall for the benefit of the players. The girls and boys have played some very good games.

Quite a few reference books have been purchased for the social sciences. More are needed but will be secured, a few at a time. Some more reference material will be needed from time to time.

Some very good pieces of work have been made in the Manual Arts department. The boys, under the direction of the instructor, Eugene Smith, have done considerable repairing about the building.

Things, as a whole, are going along very smoothly and some good work is being accomplished.

The instrumental music, that is sponsored by the School Board, is under the efficient management of G. E. Wentworth of Lancaster. The enrollment for the course is now about sixty. This number will, in all probability, remain about the same for the balance of the year.

The music in the grades is being carried on by the grade teachers in a very satisfactory manner. This is accomplished by exchange of classes during the music periods. The school building at North Stratford was painted and varnished inside. A few more seats were purchased to meet our needs in the high school.

I am not touching upon the finances as the school board has covered those in their report and recommendations.

I wish to thank the School Board for their hearty cooperation and support, the teachers, and pupils for their efforts to put things over when we have tried to solve problems that have confronted us. These have made my work in the schools very pleasant.
